Whitecourt RCMP Human Death - Update

The Office of the Medical Examiner has completed the autopsy in this investigation. The results have indicated that the death is non-criminal in nature.

There will be no further information released on this investigation.

Whitecourt RCMP Attend Scene of Human Death – Original Release - December 13, 2015

Early this morning, Whitecourt RCMP responded to the report of a deceased male in a wooded area on the outskirts of Whitecourt. The RCMP have secured the site and are in the initial stages of investigation into this death. At this time, the RCMP cannot indicate if this is a criminal or non-criminal death and there is currently no indication of any specific risk to the general public. A further media release will be issued as additional information becomes available. It is not anticipated there will be further details released until Monday, December 14th.

What do we as a people who are unarmed do when it takes 30 odd minutes for the authorities to arrive? Do we let them go? Let them steal from us?


Rob us of our privacy? Of our sleep?

but now is almost 50 singers - soprano, alto, tenor and bass. The choir performs a wide variety of works from the choral tradition - everything from madrigals to gospel, pop, and ethnic music - and have a lot of fun doing it! There are no auditions, and you do NOT have to be able

to read music.

Each member is provided with a CD of his or her own part to reinforce the weekly rehearsals. The CDs allow members who miss rehearsals for vacations, illness, work, etc., to practice on their own schedules. That means they keep up with the rest of the choir, so can fit right in when they return.

The new season starts Wednesday, January 6. Registration begins at 6:15 p.m., where you'll receive a CD of your musical part along with the music for the term.

Rehearsal begins at 7 p.m., with regular rehearsals from 7 to 9 p.m. every Wednesday until performances begin in May. New members are welcome anytime in January, and if you aren't sure it's a fit for you, try the choir for two consecutive weeks with no obligation.

Artistic Director Debbie Rosen chooses music to fit choir capabilities, but she also includes a few that challenge the singers. "I love how the choir has grown in just five years, and by asking singers to stretch themselves, our audiences benefit from better, and more professional, performances."

Debbie Rosen has an extensive musical background, and community choirs aren't new for her.

She is past-director of Canmore's Valley Winds Choir and Band. She was also Music Director for Canmore's Cornerstone Theatre, and on-stage pianist for the world-acclaimed dinner show "Oh Canada, Eh!?". 



They started off at their residential home making cake pops and it got so big, so fast that the husbands refused to let the ladies to take over their garages!

An opportunity came up to move to the location they are presently at .The ladies scrimped and saved with no loans acquired and they finally accomplished opening the doors in June 2013. Michelle Kolodychuk is unfortunately not with the company anymore. With all the hard work put into getting the business up and going it would have never happened without Michelle and Tracy working hard together. They relied on each other for support and the helping hands of one another to get the business up and going.

The warm inviting business started off as a sweet house bakery, with Baked Goods, Soups, Sandwiches, fresh Buns and made to order Cakes. This seemed to hit a home run with the community in many different directions. Now they have everything from; Smash Cakes, Fresh Squares, Cookies, Cinnamon Buns in Caramel Sauce, Regular Sandwiches,

Stuffed buns in 22 different flavors which are full of cheese and meat. Some of the standard flavors are Pizza, Cheese Burger, Donair, Chipotle Ham, Hawaiian, Red Pepper Jelly, Beef and Feta, Bacon Ranch, little Italy, and Tequila Beef. ### WHITECOURT'S 2016 INTERIM BUDGET

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the 2016 Interim Operating and Capital Budget. The interim budget includes over \$54.67 million of capital and operating expenditures and requires a 0% overall tax change.

"This interim budget will ensure that we continue to meet growing community needs in a conservative and fiscally responsible way," said Whitecourt Mayor Maryann Chichak. "We are striving towards a 0% tax increase. I hope that when the final budget is passed we can meet this target; but it is important to note that the Province's budget has the potential to substantially impact our budget depending on grant allocations."

Capital Budget Highlights:

- Street improvements program valued at approximately \$1.3 million that includes: an overlay program; west Whitecourt drainage improvements; street, stairs, lighting, and sidewalk repairs;
- Continue to partner with the Province, Woodlands County and industry for the design and construction of bank erosion protection along the Athabasca River:
- Continuation of Whitecourt Transit with capital funding improvements funded in part by the GreenTRIP Provincial Grant Program;
- Purchase of a Fire Heavy Rescue Truck in partnership with Woodlands County;
- Detailed engineering of the Athabasca Flats East area will continue with the construction of associated road infrastructure;
- Engineering for the Water System Upgrade Project, which includes a second utility river crossing to west Whitecourt, a dedicated supply main and pump upgrades, pressure reducing station and other system upgrades;
- Purchase of 182 acres of land for urban and recreational development;
- Recreation will continue with ongoing maintenance for all public facilities, and capital investments including: energy enhancement projects at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre and Scott Safety Centre; tiling in the McLeod Rink showers and chiller repairs at the Scott Safety Centre; and playground enhancements and replacement of the Wagoner neighbourhood playground;

- Rotary Park enhancements include: construction of washroom/change room building, additional parking lot landscaping, and installation of a small sun shelter at the Off Leash Dog Park;
- Implementation of a trail sign project which will include design and installation of new signs for trails and staging areas throughout our local trail system.

Operating Budget Highlights:

• Continued implementation of odour mitigation measures at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, with a full evaluation of projects to be presented in early 2016 to assess the impact of the control efforts

to date and make recommendations for future upgrades;

- Continuation of economic development initiatives that focus on business attraction; continued involvement in the Business Support Network; and promotion of Whitecourt through trade fairs, special promotion, and conferences;
- Continued participation in evaluating the feasibility of an arts & culture centre with community partners;
- Recreational enhancements: additional track circuit equipment and weight/cardio equipment at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre; continuation of spe-

cial events with the addition of a Children's Festival.

New this year, Council will be hosting public open houses on the budget. Details will be announced in early 2016.

"Engagement and transparency are a priority for Council, and I'm eager to hear feedback from the community," noted Mayor Chichak. "I encourage all ratepayers to attend the open houses and help shape the final 2016 budget."

The budget will be finalized in the spring of 2016 once the Provincial budget is adopted, and final assessment figures are established.

#### NORTH WEST FIRE RESCUE – ONOWAY LTD

It is with great pride and excitement that I announce North West Fire Rescue - Onoway Ltd (Operating as Onoway Regional Fire Services) has commenced front-line 911 fire and rescue response services as of January 1st 2016. Onoway Regional Fire Services is the first of its kind in Alberta and perhaps the entire country - a Hybrid private fire company providing municipal fire and rescue services.

Onoway Regional Fire Services have assumed operation of

two fire stations, one in the Town of Onoway and the other within the Village of Alberta Beach. Onoway Regional Fire provides Structural and Wildland fire response, medical first response, initial hazmat response, and motor vehicle collision rescue / extrication on behalf of the communities of: Alberta Beach, Castle Island, Nakamun Park, Onoway, Silver Sands, South View, Sunset Point, Val Quentin, & Yellowstone. Through this creative merging of public and private interests, Onoway Regional is poised to provide an elevated level of service by way of adding fulltime fire officers, firefighters, and medics as well as part-time career rescuers along with the more traditional paidon-the-call cadre of firefighters. The desired result: more members, better training, and faster responses.

Although Onoway Regional Fire Services is still very much in the growth stage, they already boast: 5 Career Fire Service Officers, 2 fulltime Firefighters, 22 Part-Time Firefighters / Medics, 8 Paid-On Call Firefighters, and another half- dozen new recruits. For front-line response Onoway Regional Fire utilizes one municipal fire engine, one water tender, one very unique rapid-response unit, and the areas first quint (ladder truck). In addition, Onoway Regional Fire has access to North West Fire Rescue & Training Ltd's three industrial fire engines, 3 mobile treatment centers, 2 supplied air trailers, and 1 bush unit - based within the area.

Onoway Regional Fire Services has mutual aid understandings with Sturgeon County Protective Services, Parkland County Fire Services, and Alexander First Nations. This type of cooperation is meant to keep everyone safe and forms an important part of the larger fire services community. Unfortunately in spite of the strength of the Onoway Regional Fire delivery model as well as the fact that Onoway Regional's stations are as close or closer to at least two-dozen county communities, Lac Ste. Anne County has refused mutual aid offerings from Onoway Regional and has also denied any assistance to Onoway Regional Fire Services and the communities it serves. Onoway Regional Fire Services continues to encourage mutual respect, teamwork, and mutual aid throughout the area and hopes the county's position on this matter becomes more mea-

Onoway Regional Fire Services is on track to double its complement of paid-on-call firefighters by summer and thanks to the unprecedented support of the Village of Alberta Beach; Onoway Regional Fire Services will soon have living quarters within the Alberta Beach station - further reducing emergency response times.
