Edmonton, AB - The RCMP are reporting that over the holiday period of December 23, 2015 through January 3, 2016, there was a general reduction in serious traffic related events when compared to the same time period last year. Even though enforcement was equal to last year, the RCMP saw fatalities down to 1 compared to 5 last year. Impaired driving causing bodily harm was down to 1 from 7, and impaired driving charges were down to 112 from 157 last year.

(UPDATE #2) Spruce Grove, AB - On January 5, 2016 at approximately 2:00 p.m., the Spruce Grove/Stony Plain RCMP responded to a report of shots having been fired from within a residence on Garneau Gate, Spruce Grove, Alberta. A neighbour had contacted police to advise that a shot appeared to have hit the neighbour's

home. As the RCMP arrived, they heard what appeared to be further Police established shots fired. containment in the immediate area and advised residents in the area to remain in their homes until it was deemed safe.

Shortly after the police had secured the area, two uninjured adult females exited the home and were removed from the immediate area by police for their protection. It was determined that an adult male

was within the home with at least two firearms. RCMP Police Dog Services and the RCMP's Emergency Response Team were deployed and EMS was staged nearby.

The RCMP immediately commenced negotiations with the adult male inside. At approximately 6:20 p.m., the RCMP was able to enter the home and secure the arrest of the male. The male was suffering from a gunshot wound when located within the home and was transported to hospital by ambulance where he was reported to be in critical condition. The RCMP did not discharge any weapons during this event and no members of the public or police were injured.

The RCMP continues to investigate this matter as a criminal event; however, no charges have been sworn.

RCMP ARREST SUSPECTS IN RELATION TO ARMED ROBBERIES

Spruce Grove, AB - On Thursday December 17th members of the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch Serious Crime Unit, in cooperation with members of the Mayerthorpe RCMP, charged two men in relation

to two separate armed robberies, one in Spruce Grove at the Grove Motor Inn, on December 15th and the second at the Wabamun Hotel and Bar, on December 16th.

Ronald PEEBLES (22) and Robert HOVESTAD (27), both of no fixed address, have been charged with several offences including Armed Robbery and Weapons Possession. Both men have been remanded in custody and will appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on December 23rd.

Both men have also been charged with similar offences in Devon and Hinton and will make separate court appearances on those matters at later dates.

"These arrests are the result of

good solid police work and cooperation from our community." says Staff Sargent Steve Bergerman. "Our Serious Crime Unit tirelessly ran down leads and followed up on information to identify, locate and charge these men with these very serious crimes."



Community Voice Page 9 CANADA PENSION PLAN AND OLD AGE SECURITY BENEFIT AMOUNTS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2016

GATINEAU, OC, Dec. 30, 2015 /CNW/ - Employment and Social Development Canada today announced the benefit amounts for the Canada Pension Plan (CPP) and Old Age Security (OAS) effective January 1, 2016.

CPP benefits will increase by 1.2 percent for those already receiving CPP benefits. For 2016, the maximum CPP retirement benefit for new recipients age 65 will be \$1,092.50 per month, an increase of \$330 for the year compared to the 2015 maximum CPP retirement benefit.

The new CPP rates will be in effect until December 31, 2016. CPP benefits are revised once a year, in January, based on changes over the 12-month period (November 2014 to October 2015) in the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which is the cost-of-living measure used by Statistics Canada.

OAS benefits, which consist of the basic OAS pension, the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and the Allowances, will increase by 0.1 percent for the first quarter of 2016 (January to March). As of January 1, 2016, the basic OAS pension will increase from \$569.95 to \$570.52 per month.

OAS benefits are also based on the CPI, but are reviewed quarterly (in January, April, July and October) and revised as required to reflect increases in the cost of living as measured by the CPI. Although OAS and CPP benefits are not indexed at the same time, they are both adjusted with the cost of living over a given year.

Ouick Facts

• The Old Age Security (OAS) program and the Canada Pension Plan (CPP) enhance the quality of life of Canadian seniors by providing a modest base upon which to build additional income for retirement.

· The OAS program is funded through general tax revenues and provides a basic monthly income for Canadian seniors. For 2014-15, \$44.1 billion in OAS benefits were provided to 5.6 million indi-

viduals.

• The CPP (or the Quebec Pension Plan in Quebec) is funded through contributions by Canadian workers, their employers and the self-employed and through investment earnings on the Plan's funds. In addition to retirement benefits, the Plan provides disability, death, survivor and children's benefits.

indexing Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement payments to a new senior's price index, and cancelling the increase in the age of eligibility, from 65 to 67 years, for Old Age Security."

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the 2016 Interim Budget. As part of the budget process, Whitecourt conducted a review of the Whitecourt Transit service, and Council has committed to continuing transit at similar service levels throughout 2016. Also, the Town of Whitecourt was recently awarded \$1.25 million from the Province's GreenTRIP grant program, and the municipality has accepted the grant terms and conditions. Over the next several years, Whitecourt will be utilizing the funds to purchase capital items, including transit buses, a new para-transit bus, bus shelters, benches; and also to construct new storage/bus bays.

Whitecourt Town Council has provided first reading to Borrowing Bylaw 1513 which will allow the municipality to borrow \$1 million, to be repaid over a 10 year period, for the purchase approximately 182 acres of land located W1/2 Section 6 Township 60 Range 11 West of the 5th Meridian. The land is intended for urban development and recreation. The bylaw must be advertised for 2 weeks, and will be presented to Council at a future meeting for third and final reading.

Avery Ulliac and Mark Gilmore have been named winners of the "Mayor for the Day" initiative. The program, which launched this year, was developed to raise awareness by local youth of municipal government activities. Students in grades 6 to

As part of the approved interim budget, select fees will be changing as of January 1, 2016:

• Utilities – Information will be provided to all Town Utility Customers on the adjustments to utility fees.
