SPRUCE GROVE/STONY PLAIN RCMP INVESTIGATE REPORT OF SHOTS FIRED

Spruce Grove, AB - On January 5, 2016 at approximately 2:00 p.m., the Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain RCMP responded to a report of shots having been fired from within a residence on Garneau Gate, Spruce Grove, Alberta. A neighbour had contacted police to advise that a shot appeared to have hit the neighbour's home. As the RCMP arrived, they heard what appeared

to be further shots fired. Police established containment in the immediate area and advised residents in the area to remain in their homes until it was deemed safe.

JUST SAY IT AND WE WON'T **SPRAY IT: NO-SPRAY YEARLY** RENEWAL AND SIGN-UP DEADLINE

The No-Spray program yearly renewal will be here before you know it and Yellowhead County Agriculture Services is asking landowners who do not want herbicides applied adjacent to their property to either sign up with a new agreement or renew their agreement annually prior to April

In the 2014 season Yellowhead County Agriculture Services has identified through an inspection process that some of the agreement holders are not fulfilling their obligations with No Spray Agreements that have been signed. Some areas are being neglected and the weeds and brush continue to spread which in turn increases the eventual costs of control. Neglected No-spray Agreements will no longer be allowed renewal unless adequate

control work has been completed and re-evaluated by Yellowhead County Agriculture Services. We are hoping that this renewal process will motivate agreement holders to commit to their vegetation management.

Renewal of No Spray Agreements will no longer be accepted by phone. A new form will need to be submitted yearly and approved by Yellowhead County Agriculture Services staff. If you have chosen not to renew an agreement for the upcoming year. we ask that you please remove your signs prior to the start of the spray season starting May 1.

Yellowhead County requires each landowner/occupant who has signed the agreement to fulfill their obligations before the July 1 deadline. After the July 1 deadline, Yellowhead County re-assumes responsibility for weed/ brush control on Yellowhead County Roadsides and may apply

herbicide adjacent to non compliant properties if necessary.

Residents who have any concerns or questions with respect to the spraying of roadsides in their area or No Spray Agreements are urged to contact Yellowhead County Agricultural Services at 1-800-814-3935 or (780) 325-3782. Costs for the no-spray signs are two for five dollars.

April 1 - No-Spray program yearly renewal or sign up deadline

May 1 - Property owners who have not signed up for the 2016 No-Spray program are required to remove their No-Spray signage.

July 1 - Landowners/Occupants must fulfill all no-spray weed/brush control obligations prior to this date; failure in compliance will result in applications of herbicides administered by Yellowhead County Agricultural Services.



E-PETITION ON A REFERENDUM ON ELECTORAL REFORM

OTTAWA: I would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year and all the best for 2016. Although the House of Commons only sat for one week at the end of 2015, there were a number of issues that have caused concern from our fiscal situation to significant changes to our electoral system. The new government has stated that this past federal election will be the last conducted under the firstpast-the-post electoral system.

The Liberal Party has committed to unilaterally changing the way Canadians vote without their direct consultation. Not since the 1950s has a Canadian government tried to alter their electoral system without consulting their people in a referendum. The Liberal Government in British Columbia (2005 and 2009), Prince Edward Island (2005), and Ontario (2007), put their proposed reforms to a referendum. Further, in peer countries, New Zealand and the United Kingdom, the people were similarly consulted by way of referenda. Modern democratic

societies overwhelmingly support the use of referenda when changes to an electoral system are proposed.

I believe that no system should be enacted into law unless it has been expressly approved by the voters in a referendum. To that end, a new electronic petition calling for a referendum on electoral reform is now available. The petition e-48 marks one of the first uses of the e-petition system, which was introduced this year. This petition was created by Michael Rybacha, on December 10, 2015, using the new system through

which Canadians can create, sign, and monitor e-petitions on the Parliament of Canada website, at: https://petitions.parl. gc.ca/en/Home/Index

The government is proposing fundamental change to our democratic system and Canadians must be given a direct vote on the final proposal, whatever it turns out to be. I encourage any Canadian who values democracy to sign this petition, or others like it, to ensure your voice is heard by the government.

CHARGES LAID FOLLOWING A STRING OF **BREAK & ENTERS/THEFTS OF VEHICLES**

Stony Plain, Alberta - To date six people have been charged following a string of Break & Enters, and Thefts of Vehicles from the Stony Plain, Spruce Grove, and rural area.

In the month of December Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP saw a dramatic increase in the number of Break & Enters, and Thefts of Vehicles from the Stony Plain, Spruce Grove, and rural area. As a result of a lengthy investigation, police have arrested and charged six people to date in connection to the rash of incidences. Taron RABBIT (29), Kenny RAIN (26), Tyrell HOUSE (19), Nelson SAULTEAUX (32), Ellie Mae HOUSE (29), and Thomas RAIN (19) all of the Paul Band First Nation are facing various charges including (but not limited to) Possession of property obtained by crime, over five thousand, Flight from police, Breaking and Entering and Mischief.

More charges are pending against other suspects, also from the Paul Band First Nation. Several of the vehicles have been recovered. Police are still investigating these matters.

Crime Stoppers does not subscribe to call display and the identity of the caller will remain anonymous.

ALBERTA RCMP TRAFFIC STATISTICS FROM HOLIDAY SEASON

Edmonton, AB - The RCMP are reporting that over the holiday period of December 23, 2015 through January 3, 2016, there was a general reduction in serious traffic related events when compared to the same time period last year. Even though enforcement was equal to last year, the RCMP saw fatalities down to 1 compared to 5 last year. Impaired driving causing bodily harm was down to 1 from 7, and impaired driving charges were down to 112 from 157 last year.

Shortly after the police had secured the area, two uninjured adult females exited the home and were removed from the immediate area by police for their protection. It was determined that an adult male was within the home with at least two firearms. RCMP Police Dog Services and the RCMP's Emergency Response Team were deployed and EMS was staged nearby.

The RCMP immediately commenced negotiations with the adult male inside. At approximately 6:20 p.m., the RCMP was able to enter the home and secure the arrest of the male. The male was suffering from a gunshot wound when located within the home and was transported to hospital by ambulance where he was reported to be in critical condition. The RCMP did not discharge any weapons during this event and no members of the public or police were injured.

The RCMP continues to investigate this matter as a criminal event; however, no charges have been sworn.
