TWO CHARGED WITH ARMED ROBBERY AT GAS STATION

Morinville, AB: On Thursday, January 21, 2016, at approximately 6:00 P.M., Morinville RCMP responded to a report of an armed robbery at the Gas Station in Sandy Beach.

Two male suspects, who covered their faces with bandanas, entered the store and brandished a machete. The suspects then stole 6 bottles of liquor and fled on foot. The employee was in the back area and was unharmed.

The suspects were described as thin, wearing hoodie style sweaters and bandanas over their faces.

Shortly after the complaint was received, police followed

up with tips from the public and located the two suspects at a residence on the Alexander First Nation. Both were arrested and taken into custody.

The investigation continues. Morinville RCMP would like to the thank the public with their assistance in this investigation.

Dear Editor,

Recently our government announced Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan. Based on the advice of the energy industry, scientists and Albertans from every walk of life, the plan will strengthen our economy, protect our health and make Alberta a leader on responsible energy. The plan will move Alberta away from coal emissions and towards cleaner power, reduce pollution by pricing it, limit oil sands emissions, make Alberta a leader in energy efficiency, and cut high-polluting methane emissions.

As the Premier promised, the carbon price will be revenue neutral. Every single dollar collected will be invested right here in Alberta. We will invest to create jobs building new green infrastructure, build renewable energy projects, or to make homes and businesses more energy efficient to help Albertans cut their energy bills. We will also create an adjustment fund that will help families make ends meet, and support small businesses, indigenous communities, and people working in affected communities as we move away from coal.

We recognize families in our community make their living in coal mines or coal-fired electricity plants. We also understand there has been increasing pressure on our livelihoods, as the health effects of coal emissions become more widely known and as coal-fired operations close in Alberta and beyond our borders. The federal government has already set an end date for all coal plants in our province. In fact 12 of the 18 remaining Alberta coal plants are scheduled to close under the federal regulation

prior to the 2030 target in the provincial government's plan. In our community, we have eight plants schedules for closure according to the federal government's rules:

Sundance 1 at the end of 2025; Sundance 2 at the end of 2019; Sundance 3 at the end of 2026; Sundance 4 at the end of 2027; Sundance 5 at the end of 2028 and Sundance 6 at the end of 2029; Keephills 1 and 2 at the end of 2029.

That means Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan will result in four units in our community—Genesee 1,2, and 3, and Keephills 3—having to either find a technological solution in the next 15 years to eliminate their emissions or face closure in 2030. It may be that some of the plan's elements will see some closures in advance of the existing federal end date. However, as your MLA, I know that our provincial government is committed to work with employees, communities and businesses who rely on coal to make the transition work in a way that supports families.

As Premier Notley has said, we will be providing appropriate adjustment programs to help us all move forward as we set on a new path. The Premier has asked me to help her figure out what will work best for our community as we move forward with this transition. I want to hear from you on how to make this work best for your family and community and I look forward to you sharing your ideas with me and our provincial government. I believe all levels of government must be accountable to the people they represent. Respecting taxpayer's money by making basic financial information publicly available should not be a debated issue, it is simply common sense.

When the Liberals campaigned, they promised transparency in government. Then why did the

Liberals decide not to enforce Bills C-27 and C-377?

The First Nations Financial Transparency Bill (C-27) ensured that First Nations Government make their financial information publicly available. This gave community members access to basic financial information such as audited financial statements, and the salaries and expenses of chief and council.

The Union Financial Transpar-

ency Bill (C-377) was intended to provide rank-and-file union members and the general public with unions' financial information. A forum research poll in July 2015 showed that 62% of Canadians supported this bill.

Both these Bills would have ushered a new era of accountability to Indigenous Canadians, union members and the public at large. Instead of repealing these laws through proper Parliamentary channels, as promised, the Liberal Government decided not to enforce them.

Basic financial information for many politicians at different levels of government, including Members of Parliament, is publicly available. I fully support and endorse transparency at all levels, as should the new Liberal government.

YEAR IN REVIEW

New County Administration Building

Lac Ste. Anne County established a five (5) year borrowing for construction of a new administration building located adjacent to Hwy 43 just east of Sangudo. The construction tender was awarded in the fall of 2015 with construction expected to commence early in 2016. It is anticipated the new facility will be ready for occupancy late 2016/early 2017.

New East End Fire Hall

In 2015, the County resolved to amalgamate the District 1 (Onoway) and District 2 (Alberta Beach) fire halls into one district to provide more efficient and valuable service to County residents. This new station has been relocated to just west of the Town of Onoway on Twp Rd 545.

Strategic Plan

Our vision for Lac Ste. Anne County is that we are a prosperous, progressive and collaborative municipality. We strive to build on our strong sense of community and our agricultural roots while providing a diverse range of opportunities for growth. Lac Ste. Anne County acts in the best interests of the County as whole to create a positive environment for economic growth, citizen and community engagement, and the provision of services and sustainable infrastructure.

In order to continue to achieve this, Lac Ste. Anne County implemented a Strategic Plan in 2015. This plan is an organizational management tool that assists in setting priorities, directing resources, strengthening operations, ensuring that management, employees and stakeholders are working toward common goals, focussing goals on intended outcomes/ results, and providing assessment measures that allow the organization to respond to the changing economy and environment.

Lac Ste. Anne County's 50th Anniversary

In 2015, Lac Ste. Anne County celebrated 50 years of incorporation. To commemorate this important milestone, a community celebration was held August 29th, 2015 at the Sangudo Sports Grounds and Riverside Campground in which over 1,000 residents and visitors attended. The celebration included many family activities, a kids carnival, community demonstrations, a farmer's/art market, show and shine, a skydiving performance and County Councillors served up a free BBQ. The event was made possible by many community and staff volunteers and enhanced through corporate sponsorship.

50th Anniversary Pin Design Contest

In conjunction with the County's 50th Anniversary, Council resolved to proceed with a design for a commemorative pin that would be made available throughout 2015. The pin design was put out as a contest for County ratepayers to participate in. After review of the numerable designs submitted, the design selected was created by Ms. Sydney Walker, a County youth who attends Mayerthorpe High School. The commemorative pins were handed out throughout 2015 to residents and visitors.

Space Camp

Lac Ste. Anne County was able to provide an opportunity for two (2) students to attend the Cosmodome Space Camp in Laval, Quebec in 2015. This program allows youth, who reside in the Municipality of Lac Ste. Anne County, the chance to submit an application to be considered to attend a camp where they have the unique opportunity to experience real-life astronaut training to help foster a passion for science and specifically space exploration. This program is made possible through funding from the County and corporate sponsorship. Lac Ste. Anne County is proud to support its youth by providing educational and exciting opportunities that they would otherwise not have.

Land Use Bylaw/Municipal Development Plan

Delegations attending County **Council Meetings**

Lac Ste. Anne County Council welcomes ratepayers to attend County Council meetings. Anyone may attend a Council meeting as a spectator; however should an individual or group wish to make a presentation at the meeting they must follow the following procedures:

Make a written submission to the County Manager or Executive Secretary at least eight (8) working days prior to the meeting.

The written submission will indicate the topic and purpose for requesting to appear before the meeting.

The County Manager, or designate, will review the request to determine if an administrative response can be made to satisfy the request, or subsequently schedule an appointment for the upcoming or a future meeting.

Information presented by the delegation will be restricted to the topic noted in the written submission and any additional written information not submitted prior to the meeting may not be considered by Council.

Delegates consisting of more than one individual will appoint a spokesperson that will be responsible for presenting the points of view or position for the group.

Presentations may be limited to fifteen (15) minutes.

Debate concerning matters raised by a delegation will take place at the discretion of the members.

Delegates requesting • a reappearance on a matter shall only be permitted to do so if the information presented is new or significantly additional to the

material previously presented. Land Use Bylaw & Municipal Development Plan

The Land Use Bylaw and Municipal Development Plan were officially approved December 2nd, 2015

Please note that effective December 2nd, 2015, Lac Ste. Anne County will no longer pre-refer applications to County Ratepayers. In accordance with the Municipal Government Act (MGA), all discretionary permits will be advertised in the local newspaper as well as on the County website. In our case the newspaper that will have advertisements is the Lac Ste. Anne Bulletin.

You will continue to receive notice in the mail once a decision is made only if you are deemed to be directly adjacent. The County defines directly adjacent, in accordance with the MGA, as: land that is contiguous* to the parcel of land that is affected and includes land that would be contiguous if not for a highway, road, river, or stream. *Contiguous means sharing or touching a common boarder.




