### FEBRUARY 16, 2016 – WEEK IN PARLIAMENT UPDATE

This week's debate in Parliament largely centered on the Liberal Government's decision to recall our CF-18 fighter jets and refocus Canada's role in the fight against ISIS, as well as revisited the Bills on transparency of labour unions.

On Tuesday, Bill C-4 was de-

bated at second reading. This Government Bill will repeal Bill C-377 and Bill C-525, which requires labour organizations to file a public information return with the Canada Revenue Agency on an annual basis. Should Bill C-4 pass, organizations such as labour unions will no longer be required to disclose their financial information to the public.

In the House on Wednesday



and Friday, debate concentrated on Canada's contribution to the effort to combat ISIL. This week, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau officially grounded our CF-18 fighter jets, and decided to expand the 'advise and assist mission' of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) in Iraq and increase humanitarian aid in the region. This change of commitment was made before Parliament was able to vote on the matter.

Meetings for the Environment and Sustainable Development Committee, of which I am Vice-Chair, are held twice a week. During our meetings, we have discussed our respective interests ranging from clean water, climate change, biodiversity, pollution, and environment assessment/enforcement.

There are a number of issues that are facing our country today and I will continue to work hard to make sure that the government of Canada focuses on issues that

### SPRUCE GROVE GUN CLUB DENIED **RIGHT TO APPEAL**

The Alberta Court of Appeals has denied the Spruce Grove Gun Club the right to appeal the Parkland County Subdivision Development Appeal Board's decision to rescind approval of the Club's Development Permit to operate its outdoor shooting range.

"We're disappointed but we always knew it's difficult to appeal decisions made at the County level," said Club President Rob Hall. "the rules make it hard to overturn these types of decisions."

The Spruce Grove Gun Club (SGGC) began operating in its current location in Parkland County in 1972. In recent years, the County approved continuing operation through the approval of a Development Permit. In 2015, 13 neighbours to the Club, who had moved into the neighbourhood recently, appealed approval of the Development Permit to the County's Subdivision Development Appeal Board

(SDAB). The SDAB found the range was in full compliance with all safety (federal) and noise (municipal) regulations and bylaws but still chose to deny renewal of the Development Permit effectively leading to the shutdown of the shooting range in November of 2015.

"The issue is really about fairness," said Hall. "The County decided it was okay to develop residential homes within hearing proximity of the shooting range and our neighbours bought their homes knowing the range was

there. There are no noise or safety issues with the range the County has acknowledged that. But the range is still shut down. That's not fair and the Club will now be considering all of its legal options to either get the range re-opened or have the County pay for a new range."

Meantime the SGGC is very interested in continuing to work with the County to find a mutually agreeable way to re-open the range. "We've always tried to be good neighbours, even when we had no neighbours."

## ST. ALBERT RCMP INVESTIGATE POTENTIAL THREAT TO SCHOOL UPDATE #1

St. Albert, Alta. - St. Albert RCMP continue to investigate an obscure threat referencing the date of Feb. 22, 2016, and directed at a staff member of the Paul Kane High School in the City of St. Albert. The RCMP were advised on Feb. 19, 2016 of the school having become aware of graffiti being found in the school on Feb.17, 2016. This graffiti appeared threatening toward a school staff member. Investigation began immediately to determine the exact nature of the threat, who may have been responsible for the graffiti, and if there may be any substance to the threat.

This investigation continues and while the RCMP have not been able to substantiate the threat, reasonable and collaborative precautions are being taken according to established protocols by the RCMP and the school and the St. Albert Public School District to ensure the safety of all who attend or work at the school. Until proven otherwise, it is in the interests of public safety to take all such potential threats as a serious matter. Police precautions and investigational steps will not publicized in order not to undermine their effectiveness.

A spokesperson for the St. Albert RCMP will be available on Feb. 22, at 8:30 a.m. at the St. Albert RCMP Detachment to provide an in-person update on this matter. The address of the detachment is 96 Bellerose Drive, St. Albert, AB, T8N 7A4.



You do not have to reveal your identity to Crime Stoppers, and if you provide information to Crime Stoppers that leads to an arrest(s), the recovery of stolen property, and/or a seizure of illicit drugs, you may be eligible for a cash reward.

BACKGROUND:

St. Albert, AB - St. Albert RCMP are investigating a threat that was targeted towards a Paul Kane staff person. It appears that the threat was received on Wednesday, February 17, 2016 and it mentioned Monday, February 22, 2016. As the police investigation is ongoing, the level of threat is not known, but safety precautions are being taken. The RCMP are responding

to the threat according to Safe Schools protocols as the safety of students and staff are of the utmost importance. The protocol steps will not be released to the public.

Threats to schools are not a common event in St. Albert, but each and every case will be treated seriously and investigated vigorously.

### **DEPRESSION NOW EQUAL TO HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE AS A TOP REASON CANADIANS SEE PHYSICIANS**

TORONTO, Jan. 26, 2016 / CNW/ - New research announced today by Morneau Shepell found that depression is now equal to high blood pressure as a top reason Canadians see physicians. Depression was the top-ranked condition

24 per cent of physician respondents, equal to high blood pressure, which was the top-ranked condition by a different 24 per cent of physician respondents. The results of the national survey, which polled physicians, employees and employers across Canada, will be presented January 27 at the Company's 5th annual Employers Connect event.

Comparatively, musculoskeletal disorders were the top-ranked condition by 11 per cent of physician respondents. Furthermore, 63 per cent of physicians reported that depression, anxiety disorders or stress-related issues had the fastest increase in cases they had seen over the last two to three years.

The national survey, also found that a large majority (82 per cent) of employees who reported struggling with mental health issues and two thirds (67 per cent) of employees who reported struggling with stress symptoms said it impacts their work. Comparatively, only half (53 per cent) of employees who reported struggling with physical health issues said it impacts their work.

"Each year, we see an increase in employees seeking support for stress and anxiety - conditions that are attributable to everything from the uncertainty of an unstable economy to difficulties in a personal relationship," said Alan Torrie, President and CEO, Morneau Shepell. "These concerns often have a negative effect on workplace productivity. On the other hand, employers who offer mental wellness support often see a strong relationship between mental health and engagement at work."

Workplace engagement levels are strongly correlated with mental health issues

The survey found that more than two thirds (67 per cent) of highly engaged employees reported excellent or very good mental health, compared to less than half (35 per cent) who are not engaged. Additionally, workplace stress has been found to have a higher impact on engagement than personal stress.

Nearly half (47 per cent) of employees who are not engaged reported extreme workplace stress but less than one in five (18 per cent) of employees who are not engaged reported extreme personal stress.

Upon looking further into the reasons for stress at work, employees reported that the sources of workplace stress are due primarily to emotional or interpersonal issues (e.g., office culture, communication, conflict), as indicated by 60 per cent of employees. Comparatively, nearly half (43 per cent) of employees reported that

job-related issues (e.g., deadlines) are the source of workplace stress and only 14 per cent of employees reported that physical work-related (e.g., lifting heavy objects) issues are the source of workplace

Half (51 per cent) of managers surveyed believe they have employees with mental health issues

### Depression Now Equal To High Blood Pressure As A Top Reason Canadians See Physicians

The survey also found that among managers, 37 per cent believe they have employees with significant stress symptoms, and 27 per cent of employees indicated that they have significant stress issues. Meanwhile, nearly one in four (22 per cent) of managers surveyed believe at least one of their employees has a substance abuse issue. Less than one in 10 (7 per cent) of employees reported substance abuse issues.

"It's clear that a large number of managers are seeing behaviours such as lowered productivity, increased absences, anxious behaviour or a disheveled appearance that would lead them to this belief," said Paula Allen, Vice President, Research and Integrative Solutions. "This shows how important it is for managers to know how to respond appropriately."

The stigma around mental health issues remains apparent in the workplace

Though conversations around mental health are continuing to evolve and become more commonplace, employees are not completely comfortable acknowledging the problems at work. Two thirds (66 per cent) of employees who took time off work for a mental health issue did not report it and, as such, the days were not recorded as an of-



ficial absence. "Unrecorded absences affect employee morale, workplace productivity and the company's bottom line," said Adam Kelly, Vice President, Absence Management Solutions.

Almost one third (31 per cent) of employers said support for mental wellness in their organization has improved over the last two to three years, compared to 62 per cent who said it stayed the same.

"It is encouraging to see that

Canadian employers are reducing stigma and increasing their focus on mental health issues," said President and CEO, Alan Torrie. "Support for workplace mental health is improving but there is still more to be done."

About the Survey

The purpose of the survey by Morneau Shepell, conducted in October 2015, was to provide insights into workplace mental health from the perspectives of employees, employers and phy-

sicians, with 1,223 respondents in total. The margins of error for the survey are +/- 3.1 per cent for employees, +/- 9.8 per cent for employers and +/- 9.8 per cent for physicians; valid 19 times out of 20.

The Company is presenting the initial survey findings at Employers Connect, its 5th annual summit on workplace mental health being held in five cities across Canada on Wednesday, January 27, 2016.

### FIRST NATIONS STUDENTS TO BENEFIT FROM NEW EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP

Students from five First Nations in northern Alberta will benefit from an agreement between the Government of Alberta and the Kee Tas Kee Now Tribal Council.

This agreement is the first of its kind in Alberta.

The Kee Tas Kee Now agreement outlines the framework for establishing a First Nations education authority. It enhances supports and strengthens the capacity to provide education to these students in order to increase attendance and high school completion. Students will continue to receive education in a culturally-relevant environment in their community, while benefitting from improved educational supports similar to those of other students in Alberta such

as curriculum development and technology.

This expands current programs that incorporate traditional skills such as hunting and fishing, by enhancing elements of literacy and numeracy, science and how to be stewards of the environment. The agreement was developed with input from Alberta Education, Indigenous Relations and Kee Tas Kee Now education partners.

"Our government is committed to working collaboratively with our First Nations, Métis and Inuit education partners and with the federal government to strengthen First Nations education in Alberta. We want to ensure First Nations students have the instructional supports they need, while receiving an education that reflects their rich culture and perspectives."

This agreement provides a framework for how other school authorities can work together to develop strategies to improve the educational outcomes of First Nations students in their respective jurisdictions. ### CHANGING YOUR LAST NAME

While many brides opt to take their husbands' surnames upon tying the knot, over the years the popularity of such a decision has ebbed and flowed. Recent years have suggested the practice is once again gaining steam.

A 2011 study published in Names: A Journal of Onomastics indicates that younger brides are more likely to embrace the tradition of taking their husbands' names in marriage. According to the study, women who married between the ages of 35 and 39 were 6.4 times more likely to keep their maiden names than those who married between the ages of 20 and 24.

Many brides view taking their spouse's name as the natural transition from being a singleton to being a married woman. Other brides prefer they share the same last name as their future children, making the choice to take their husband's name a logical decision. Some brides feel having the same last name as their husbands helps them feel more like a family.

Changing one's name also may make it easier to deal with various issues. Finances, travel and even parenting concerns may be easier when women take their husbands' last names than when they don't.

But some brides still prefer to keep their maiden names or hyphenate those names with their husbands' surnames. Some may view changing their names as sacrificing their personal iden-


tities, while others may want to hold on to a family name they are proud of. Interesting names also can be hard to give up. Brides who find taking their husband's name would be a tongue-twister may prefer to forego this tradition.




