The meeting held at the Anglican Church by the Onoway and District Ministerial and Community members, this past Monday the 22nd, was well attended with 29 people from the community. Paulette Johnson from Catholic Immigration Service gave a very informative presentation and answered a number of questions.

Barry Rose minister of St. Johns Anglican lead with prayer and introduction, followed by Pastor Rick Forster explaining how this all came about with the picture of the little boy on the beach and how interest has grown. Mu Lavin also explained that the impetus was members of her church asking questions. She also

has contacts in Jordan where there is at least one Iraqi family longing to come to Canada.

Kathleen Arnold, Public Health Nurse in Onoway, shared how that photo had touched her family and how they wanted to do something. She did post on the Onowaywall4all and got a number of very positive responses plus a few not so nice ones. She now has about 10 people who have contacted her to help not included in the 29 at the meeting.

These good folk along with support from Rev. Chang Lee, Zion United and the Thrift Shop have got the ball rolling.

They have to raise \$30,000 and that goal was helped by one person at the meeting donating \$1,000 and challenged others to do so. Mu

Lavin reported that another family came forward \$1,000, another with a car, another with a house. One family in Spruce Grove saw the last article in the Community Voice and the fridge, microwave and many other items were picked up on Thursday. Mu Lavin knew people would be generous and she is so grateful to all those who have helped so far.

Kathleen ask everyone present to fill out the volunteer forms which cover every aspect of the help needed from driving our newcomers to appointment, to fundraising, as well as just being a friend when they arrive.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF FEBRUARY 22, 2016

This week in Parliament, we covered topics from ISIS, to employment insurance and labour.

- The Liberal Government's Motion against ISIS was debated for most of this week. My comments in the House regarding this Motion can be found at: http://www.parl.gc.ca/content/hoc/House/421/Debates/022/HAN022-E. PDF
- A Motion introduced by our Conservative Party was voted by a wide margin to condemn the growing international Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) campaign being waged against Israel.
- The report by the Special Joint Committee on Physician-Assisted Dying was released this week and can be found at: http://www.parl.gc.ca/HousePublications/Publication.aspx?Language=e&-Mode=1&Parl=42&Ses=1&Do-cld=8120006 (the dissenting report can

be found on page 51).

- The NDP put forward a Motion on Employment Insurance, calling for the House to recognize mounting job loss and lack of access to E.I. They are also calling on the Government to strengthen the E.I. system and calling for repeals of the reforms the Conservative Government made in 2012-2013.
- Private Members' Bills (PMB) were introduced by my Conservative Colleagues during the week. Four of them deal with the Criminal Code, from protecting preborn children, to clarifying definitions dealing with firearms, and the Life Means Life Act (life sentences). A fifth PMB deals with respecting a national strategy for Alzheimer's disease and other dementias. I look forward to reading these bills.
- At second reading, Bill C-4 an Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act ended the week.

Over the course of the week, I attended 11 meetings and two events. The House will be down the week of February 29, and my next update will be on my travels in the riding before my return to Ottawa on March 7.

CALL PROMPTS HOLD AND SECURE FOR VJM AND SACHS SCHOOLS

St. Albert, Alberta - On Monday, February 8, 2016, at approximately 11:10 a.m., St. Albert RCMP Detachment received a call from the Greater St. Albert Catholic School Division office that they had received a report from a youthful-sounding caller that needed police attention. The caller stated that a man wearing a black trench coat and carrying

a firearm, was walking near St. Albert Catholic High or Vincent J. Maloney schools.

St Albert RCMP Detachment requested that both Vincent J. Maloney Junior High School and St. Albert Catholic High School go into a Hold and Secure procedure. Multiple RCMP cars responded to the location, set up a safety perimeter and investigated the situation.

By 11:25 a.m., the RCMP investigation determined the call

was a prank and both schools were advised to lift the Hold and Secure procedure.

This call caused concern to students, parents and school staff. False reports such as this one, needlessly tie up emergency resources and expose the community to stress and fear for their children's safety. St. Albert RCMP and the Greater St. Albert Catholic School Division are investigating to determine who made this false allegation

so that this behaviour will not be repeated.

I am a double leg amputee and a member of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program.

Thanks to public support of The War Amps Key Tag Service, I have attended regional CHAMP Seminars where Champs and their parents learn about the latest in artificial limbs, teasing and bullying and how to parent an amputee child. I have been a Junior Counsellor at the seminars, acting as a role model and giving advice to the younger Champs. The seminars let child amputees know they aren't alone and that the sky is the limit.

I am also a multisport athlete, and donations to the Key Tag Service have allowed me to be fitted with recreational limbs and devices to participate in sports and stay active. If it wasn't for The War Amps, I would not be able to do any of the things I do.

2016 marks the 70th anniversary of The War Amps Key Tag Service and to date, more than 1.5 million sets of lost keys have been returned to their owners.

Although it is a free service, donations made provide young amputees with financial assistance for artificial limbs and allow us to go to regional seminars

Thank you to everyone who has supported The War Amps Key Tag Service, which has helped Canadian amputees like me for the past 70 years.



This past month, Pink Shirt Day was a big day for our province. 

WAXING 101: WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE WAXING YOUR CAR

Waxing a car is a great way to maintain its exterior. Including waxing as part of your routine vehicle maintenance can protect the car or truck from some natural hazards, including sun damage, pollen and the dirt and grime that can accumulate on a car over time.

Motorists unfamiliar with waxing may be intimidated by the sheer volume of waxes on the shelves at their local automotive supply stores, which will no doubt offer an array of both liquid and paste waxes as well as many spray waxes. When testing waxes in 2013, Consumer Reports found that liquid and paste waxes were relatively equal with regard to their effective-

ness, while spray waxes were very convenient though not very durable.

Waxing a vehicle is no small task, and drivers should learn as much as they can about car wax and the different types of waxes before attempting the job themselves.

The differences between wax-

In their study of liquid, paste and spray waxes, Consumer Reports found that paste waxes were easier to apply than liquid waxes, but that the overall performance of paste waxes fell short of liquid waxes. Liquid waxes were very durable and provided the gloss many motorists look for when waxing their vehicles. But liquid waxes were difficult to apply evenly, something first timers should consider when choosing a wax. Spray waxes were convenient and easy to use, and many can be wiped off without drying.

Waxing 101: What To Know Before Waxing Your Car

But Consumer Reports found spray waxes were not as durable as liquid or paste waxes, so they may need to be applied more frequently.

Because waxing is done to protect a car and improve its appearance, it's important that drivers waxing their vehicles for the first time test the wax on an area of their vehicles that is not easily seen to the naked eye. This affords some room for error as you

learn the waxing ropes while also allowing you to test out different waxes until you find the right fit.

There are some additional tricks drivers can employ when waxing their vehicles that can make the job easier and the wax that much more effective.

- · Wash first, then wax. Make sure you give your car or truck a good wash before you apply any wax. Allow the car to dry completely before applying any wax.
- · Avoid sunlight. Consumer Reports notes that sunlight can soften paint and make it susceptible to scratching, so avoid washing and waxing your car in direct sunlight.
- · Use microfiber towels. Microfiber towels were found to be more effective than cloth rags at removing residue. In addition. cloth rags can trap dirt and scratch finishes, so opt for lamb's wool mitts instead.
- Go from top to bottom. The bottom of a vehicle is more susceptible to grime, so work your way down when waxing so you are not contaminating your towels. A contaminated towel increases the risk of scratching your vehicle's exterior.

When waxing your vehicle, the right wax and technique can make all the difference.



ENERGY EAST DESERVES SUPPORT

On January 28th a motion by our Conservative Caucus was presented in the House of Commons to recognize the importance of the energy sector to the Canadian economy and support its development by supporting the Energy East pipeline. The project is backed by the governments of Alberta, Saskatchewan, Ontario and New Brunswick and would dramatically cut the amount of oil traveling by rail each day and scale back our dependence on foreign oil.

Thousands of Canadians contribute to our economy through the natural resource sector. At a time when our economy is struggling, the Liberal government needs to stand up for these Canadians and take a clear position in favour of Energy East. The oil and gas sector directly and indirectly employs over 360,000 people in Canada, accounting for almost 8% of GDP in 2013, while Energy East alone is expected to generate \$10 billion in taxes for all levels of government. Our country ranks third in the world for proven crude oil

reserves, and 73,000 existing kilometers of pipeline carry over \$100 billion of natural gas, oil and petroleum products safely every year.

From 2008 to 2013 more than 99.99 percent of oil transported by federally regulated pipelines was done so safely, and thanks to the previous Conservative government, companies are liable for up to \$1 billion of costs and damages, irrespective of fault. Pipelines are the most environmentally responsible way to transport our oil, and Energy East will displace the equivalent

of over 1,500 rail cars traveling the same route each day.

Approximately 700,000 barrels of oil are imported every day to refineries in Eastern Canada, coming from countries such as Saudi Arabia, Venezuela and Nigeria. The Energy East project would strengthen Canada's energy security by decreasing our dependence on authoritarian regimes with poor human rights records, rampant corruption and deficient environmental controls. Most of Western Canada's oil production is exported to the United States, and 97% of our

oil exports went there in 2013. Energy East will create access to higher value international markets which will further support the Canadian economy.

In my view, it makes no sense to import foreign oil while Canada is blessed with an abundance of natural resources here at home. Instead of turning his back on the thousands of hardworking Canadians who keep our economy moving, many of whom are now struggling to find work, Prime Minister Trudeau must show leadership and unwavering support for this project.





WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

The winners of the Mayor for the Day initiative shadowed Whitecourt Mayor Maryann Chichak yesterday and experienced a full day of meetings and press interviews. The initiative. spearheaded by the Whitecourt Youth Advisory Committee, was developed to raise awareness of municipal government activities in the youth demographic. Avery Ulliac, a grade 6 student, and Mark Gilmore, a grade 11 student, submitted essays to the program on how they thought Whitecourt could be enhanced. Avery's essay discussed local promotion of geothermal heating, while Mark outlined the benefits of an indoor soccer and multi-use arena. At last night's Council Meeting Avery and Mark had the chance to recap their day, and both noted that if they had the chance they'd apply to the initiative again next year. Thanks Avery and Mark for your enthusiasm and interest!

Tina Prodaniuk, of Eagle Tower Victim Services, presented an overview of operations and goals for 2016. Victim Services has ten new advocates currently being trained to meet regional needs.

Part 1 of the Whitecourt Emergency Services Annual Report was presented to Council which included information on the Whitecourt Fire Department and Municipal Bylaw Enforcement. Highlights of the reports included:

• Whitecourt Fire Department responded to 322 calls.

• Whitecourt Fire Department's prevention/education activities were attended by 6,998 people.

 Whitecourt Municipal Enforcement worked collectively with local RCMP and other agencies through proactive patrols, public education/ relations, preventative patrols, and traffic enforcement.

Town Council awarded the 2016 FireSmart project contract, valued at \$170,200 plus GST, to Wide Open Slashing Ltd. The 2016 project will be completed with funding support from the Forest Resource Improvement Association of Alberta (FRIAA) and will include treatment of 46 hectares of land located south of the Forest Interpretive Centre and Lions Campground. This project follows a

milestone in local efforts with Whitecourt's 2015 receipt of the National FireSmart Community Protection Achievement Award. Over the past six years, the Town has successfully obtained grant support to complete FireSmart activities, and, since 2010, 223 hectares of land have undergone or are in the process of treatment. FireSmart treatments greatly reduce the potential for wildfire and work has helped safeguard our community.

Council has granted use of the Forest Interpretive Centre and Allan & Jean Millar Centre to the Whitecourt Wolverines. The Wolverines requested use of the facilities following a fire that caused significant damage to the Whitecourt Wolverines Centre for Excellence.

Whitecourt's newest road in the Athabasca Flats East area has been named McIlwaine Drive. The road, which runs north/south between Mink Creek Road and the proposed 52 Avenue, will service the new grade 4 to 12 Living Waters school currently under construction. The McIlwaine family settled in Whitecourt in the early 1940s and soon became an integral part of the community. Members of the family served in the armed forces, and were members of various groups and committees, including the Legion, Chamber of Commerce and Masonic Lodge. Their families were raised in the community and the original brothers worked in various industries, including farming, forestry, government and education. Notably, Cecil McIlwaine was the first teacher at Westward School, and Clarence McIlwaine built the first horse-drawn school bus for Whitecourt. It is the McIlwaine family's connection to education and learning that prompted Council to choose their name to mark the location of our community's newest school.

Council has approved an application to open an indoor recreational facility, Anytime Fitness, at 4420 – 52 Avenue in the No Frills building. Anytime Fitness is an international franchise that proposes to operate 24 hours per day.

Town Council provided final approval for the purchase of approximately 182 acres of land. The land, purchased for \$1 million, will provide for future residential and recreational development. 


