This dedication to his community is known to have started in the early fifties, when he acted as a race marshal at the Victoria Day picnic footraces.

Esten's contribution to Magnolia is truly marvelous. He has played guitar for dances and early jamborees, and has served on the community club board for decades. He was involved in the decision to replace the Magnolia hall, some 40 years ago, and helped design, fund, build and upgrade the now existing hall. At community functions, he has manned

the door, prepared vegetables, peeled potatoes and served as barbeque chef.

The Magnolia Cemetery would not be as well-kept and maintained if Esten had not been involved. He has contributed in every area, most recently organizing the re-fencing of the site.

He has also served three terms as the division 6 councilor for Parkland County.

Esten's passions have been baseball, softball, and slow-pitch, and this is the primary reason we have a ball club and the ball diamond at the Magnolia hall site. Esten was involved with the design


of the grounds, organized the installation of the outfield fence as well as the construction of the bullpens, along with managing the donation to cover the cost of those bullpens, and successfully approached at least one outside organization for sports donations. He also built a drag to help keep the infield in shape. He has also been heavily involved with the Slow Pitch supper, obtaining the steaks, and providing help for the rest of the supper for many years.

Also, for years, Esten has cut, bale and remove the hay on the camping area for the visitors to the annual ball tournament.

Esten has also been on the board of the Magnolia Community Club and the Magnolia Cemetery for numerous years and has been an inspiration for volunteering and commitment in general to all of us in the Magnolia community. His many contributions will be remembered in Magnolia and the surrounding areas.

The community has honoured Esten by presenting him with a memento, and by dedicating the ball diamond in his name. The sign presented to him in the picture will be installed near the entrance to the ball diamond area at the Magnolia hall in the spring of 2016.





RIDING UPDATE - WEEK OF FEB 29, 2016

Parliament was down the week of February 29th. During my stay in the riding, I spent a considerable amount of time meeting with constituents in my Edson office on issues varying from the Energy East Pipeline, to coal issues, trade issues, as well as a future plan to design and construct a new hostel facility in Jasper National Park. I also participated in a conference call with the Environment and Sustainable Development Sub-committee to discuss future committee business.

While in the riding, I attended a Town Council meeting in Thorsby, a meeting with community business leaders in Drayton Valley, and our local Yellowhead EDA, AGM.

The week ended promoting the upcoming Farm Safety Week (March 13-19). This year, it will emphasize protecting our children from the dangers associated with growing up on a farm. Tune into your local radio station to hear more.

On March 6th I will be headed back to Ottawa where I will meet with various organizations, as well as attend committees and events. This will be a very busy week and I look forward to reporting back to you. If anyone is in Ottawa, please do not hesitate to contact my Hill office and I will be more than pleased to meet with you, organize a tour of Parliament and/or obtain passes for those wishing to attend Question Period.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MARCH 7

This week in Parliament, we covered topics from income tax, to citizenship and immigration.

- The Liberal Government's Motion on Canada's contribution to the effort to combat ISIL was passed in Parliament. This officially confirmed the recall of our fighter jets.
- Bill C-2, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act, was debated this week. This bill will adjust tax rates and reduce the annual contribution limit for tax-free savings accounts from \$10,000 to only \$5,500.
 - · As well, Bill C-6, An Act to

amend the Citizenship Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act, was debated. This bill will make several changes, including removing the grounds for the revocation of Canadian citizenship that relate to national security.

• A new Government bill was introduced -- Bill C-7, An Act to amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board Act and other Acts and to provide for certain other measures. Under this bill, more than 17,000 Mounties will be permitted to form a national union but will not have the right to strike.

• Conservative MP Arnold Viersen tabled his Motion (M-47) regarding online violent and degrading sexually explicit material.

- The Government tabled their 2016 Immigration Levels Plan which includes massive cuts to immigration streams vital to our economic growth. For more information, please see: http://news.gc.ca/web/article-en.do?nid=1038699
- This week, the Environment and Sustainable Development Committee (ENVI) began a review of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999. We heard from senior officials from Health Canada, Environment Canada, Ecojustice Cana-

da, Environmental Defence Canada, and the Chemistry Industry Association of Canada. You can follow the committee at: http://www.parl.gc.ca/Committees/en/ENVI

THE BUZZ ON BEEKEEPING – INTERMEDIATE COURSE

Yellowhead County Agricultural Services is now offering an intermediate beekeeping course to compliment the Beekeeping Basics courses that were held in 2015. The Buzz on Beekeeping will go over the several main facets of beekeeping. "Patty Milligan who taught the Beekeeping Basics Courses will be joining us again, this time to dive deeper into the aspects of what it really takes to be a beekeeper," explains Yellowhead County's agricultural services coordinator Melissa Marquis. "This class is meant for those who attended one of our beginner courses in 2015, or for those who have already tried their hand at beekeeping and need some more information."

The Buzz on Beekeeping will go over: spring and fall management; dealing with swarms; splitting hives; problems with queens; detailed steps for registering your bees; diseases; details about the harvest; and the time frame. This class is only recommended for those who have previously taken a beginners course; have tried beekeeping in the past; or for those who are currently beekeeping. Attendants with 1 - 3 years of beekeeping experience will benefit the most from this intermediate course.

PROVINCE SEEKS PUBLIC INPUT ON PHYSICIAN-ASSISTED DEATH POLICIES

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The Government of Alberta is seeking the input of Albertans to help develop policies to protect the interests of patients, health-care workers and vulnerable individuals in response to the Supreme Court of Canada ruling that physician-assisted death will be a legal right in some cases as of June 6, 2016.

"As the government determines what changes are needed to align with the Supreme Court decision, we want to consult with Albertans. I am very pleased that Associate Minister of Health Brandy Payne, along with Dr. David Swann and Dr. Bob Turner, have agreed to hear from Albertans on this sensitive and deeply personal issue."

Sarah Hoffman, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health

The Advisory Committee on Physician-Assisted Death is tasked with seeking input from Albertans on topics such as age eligibility, location and type of services, advanced directives, reflection period, and whether publicly-funded institutions may opt out. The Committee will engage with stakeholder groups, health-care providers and advocates, and members of the public.

All Albertans are encouraged to share their views via an online survey by March 31, 2016.

"This consultation will consider important and sensitive issues around how we can provide access to physician-assisted death, while protecting vulnerable Albertans and respecting the rights of physicians and other health professionals. We need input not just from legal and medical experts, but also from patients, families and caregivers."

Alberta Health continues to work with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta and Alberta Health Services. The federal government is responsible for making any changes to the Criminal Code needed in response to the Court's decision. Each province and territory is responsible for deciding how, when and where physician-assisted death will be provided within this context.

TRANSIT WILL BE A REALITY IN ACHESON ON APRIL 25

Parkland County is excited to announce the introduction of transit service to the Acheson Industrial Area beginning on Monday, April 25, 2016. This service has taken months of work, as well as the establishment of partnerships with the Cities of Edmonton and Spruce Grove.

Transit service to the Acheson Industrial Area was originally requested by the Acheson Business Association (ABA) to better serve those who work in the area as well as to increase the attractiveness of the area to future employees and businesses. After many studies, reviews, and considerations, Parkland County Council established the Acheson Industrial Park Transit Implementation Committee, with both the ABA and representatives from three Acheson businesses as active participants.

The committee's recommendation was that Council direct Administration to prepare a detailed transit plan, draft an agreement with the City of Spruce Grove to implement a transit service for the Acheson Industrial Area as presented, and prepare a transportation public utility bylaw to pay for the cost of providing that service. Council concurred with the committee's recommendation and approved a two-year pilot of transit service to Acheson.

Through this process, Parkland County remained committed to community consultation and public participation and is very pleased that the ABA attended several meetings with County staff in advance of a public meeting held on December 12, 2015. While a bylaw of this nature did not require a public meeting, Parkland County Administration felt strongly that a public meeting should be held to provide residents and businesses with the opportunity to share their comments with Council.

The public meeting was advertised in the local newspaper one week in advance. Out of over 300

businesses in the Acheson area, only one submitted a written response against the bylaw.

At that December 2015 meeting, Parkland County Council passed the necessary motions to make transit a reality for the businesses of Acheson Industrial Area.

Utilizing the existing Spruce Grove commuter transit service to Edmonton, Parkland County is able to offer a low cost service for the two year pilot project. Three empty Edmonton Transit buses destined for Spruce Grove on weekday mornings will now connect NAIT and Westmount Transit Centres to Acheson. There will be three return trips in the afternoons available to offer the riders a return trip to Edmonton from Acheson.

The transit fares for the riders are the same as the Spruce Grove commuters:

- \$6.00 cash fare (exact change required)
- \$48.00 for 10 tickets
- \$130.00 monthly pass

The cost of the transit service is paid for through riders' fares and a public transportation utility charge. The utility charge is paid by all industrial lots in the service area.



only to feel his or her vehicle start to sputter. Such sputtering might indicate a car is running low on fuel, or it could be a sign of something more serious that requires motorists to think as quickly and safely as possible.

When car trouble strikes while a vehicle is on the road, the first thing many drivers do is check their fuel gauges. A car that runs out of gas is certainly inconvenient, but if you can pull over to the shoulder or make it to the nearest filling station, then this unfortunate situation can be remedied rather easily. But when a car's tank is full and it is still

showing signs of trouble, drivers must take steps to protect themselves, their passengers and their vehicles. The following are a few simple tips motorists should keep in mind so they can safely handle any car trouble that may arise while they are out on the road.

Keep a blanket in the trunk as well so your passengers can stay warm should you experience car trouble on a cold day or night.
- Make note of your surroundings. Some car troubles can only be fixed by the professionals, so pay careful attention to your surroundings in case an issue arises and forces you



How To Handle Car Trouble While Driving

to pull over and call for help. Always pay attention to mile markers and any landmarks that might help you describe where you are. Car troubles can strike at any time and anywhere, so be sure to pay special attention to your surroundings when driving in unfamiliar areas.

• Pull over. Don't panic if an issue arises suddenly. Remain calm and pull over onto the shoulder. The right shoulder is the area for pulling over on most roads, but you may also use the left shoulder on multilane highways with medians. Try to get as far away from traffic as possible without driving off of level ground, and always use your signals when pulling onto the shoulder. If the vehicle can't make it to the median, put your emergen-

cy flashers on and get out of the car, moving away from both the vehicle and traffic. Immediately call for emergency roadside assistance, alerting the authorities if need be.

Use flares or triangles to alert other drivers. So long as you are not risking your well-being, you can place flares and/or warning triangles behind your vehicle so oncoming traffic knows to drive around it. The popular not-for-profit motor club AAA recommends placing the first flare or triangle 10 feet directly behind the side of the vehicle that is closest to the road. The second should be placed between 30 and 60 feet (increase the distances as the posted speed limit increases) behind the middle of the bumper, while the third

flare or triangle should be placed between 120 and 360 feet behind the vehicle's right side.

• Stay with the vehicle. Once you have called for help and set up flares or triangles, stay with the vehicle, though do so at a safe enough distance so you are not in harm's way.

• Sudden car troubles can be scary, but drivers who approach such issues calmly and quickly can reduce their risk for accident or injury.

(MS) - Many drivers are considerably less comfortable driving at night than during the day. Even though roads tend to be less congested when the sun goes down, reduced visibility at night can compromise the safety of drivers and their passengers.

On Monday, January 25, 2016 the Yellowhead County Recreation Board held their Regular Meeting and administration is happy to announce that the following funding requests were approved by the Board:

Brule Community Society: received \$5,000.00 in Arts & Recreation Initiatives Funding for the phase 1 development of their bike park. Work is slated to begin in the spring of 2016 and will focus on the development of fundamental biking skills through a series of beginner trails.

Brule Community Society: received \$347.61 in Community Hall Capital Assistance Funding to assist with costs related to replacing three toilets within their community hall.

Carrot Creek Community Association: received \$9,468.75 in Community Hall Capital Assistance Funding to help with the purchase and installation of three new furnaces for the community hall as well as the disposal of their existing units.

Drostan Community Association: received \$331.48 in Recreation Program/Event Funding for costs related to the Christmas Party. The event featured a variety of activities including: potluck snacks, cookie decorating, Christmas crafts, horse and sleigh rides as well as an appearance from Santa. Each child in attendance also received a book and a goodie bag.

Lobstick Literacy & Learning Society: received \$2,000.00 in Recreation Program/Event Funding for their "Senior's Chair Exercises Program" being offered in Wildwood. This class is intended for older adults and is focused on improving strength, flexibility, mobility and balance, improve social and emotional wellbeing as well as to help maintain participant cognitive functions through complex exercises.

Pinedale Agricultural Association: received \$2,921.50 in Community Hall Capital Assistance Funding to help purchase new appliances for their hall. New appliances will include a fridge, freezer, stove and hot water tank.

Rosevear Pioneer Community Club: received \$5,411.70 in Community Hall Capital Assistance Funding for the purchase of 120 new chairs for their hall. These new chairs will provide a fresh new look for the hall and will also be safer and more comfortable for users.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Peers Lagoon Upgrades Tender – Council awarded the tender for the Peers Lagoon Upgrades to BTO Contracting in the amount of \$526,996.50. BTO Contracting's submission was the lowest of the accepted bids. The work to be done includes the construction

of a new cell, raising the berm height, and constructing a truck dumping site.

Regional Waste Management Budget – West Yellowhead Regional Waste Management Authority's 2016 Capital & operating Budget were formally adopted by Council. The Regional Authority is comprised of Yellowhead County, Town of Edson, Town of Hinton, and Town of Jasper.

Cessation of Train Whistle Request – Yellowhead County received a letter from a resident requesting the County to contact CN to stop the train whistle from blowing at the Leaman Road railway crossing near Chip Lake. Council will wait until the CN requirements are known before considering the request to stop the train whistle from blowing at this crossing.

Rezoning For Industrial Development – First reading was given to Bylaw 05.16. The bylaw would rezone an area near Evansburg (SW of 19-53-07-W5M) from Rural District to Rural Industrial District. This rezoning allows for the expansion of current industrial developments and aligns with the Evansburg Area Structure Plan. A Public Hearing will be held on April 12, 2016.

Road Closure Allows for Con-

solidation – Council passed Bylaw 26.15, allowing for the closure of 1.643 acres of road plan, perpendicular to Hwy 16 near the Jasper Park gates. The road closure allows for the adjacent landowner to purchase the property and consolidate it with his property. No concerns were brought forward regarding the road closure bylaw at a Public Hearing.


Amendment To Bylaw – Council amended Bylaw 19.15 to allow a recent road closure north of Evansburg to be registered at Alberta Land Titles. The closure allows the unused road to be consolidated with the adjoining property. A Public Hearing was held prior to Council passing the initial bylaw.
