EXCESSIVE WINDS DAMAGE ROOF OF NEW LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY BUILDING

Sangudo, Alberta, Saturday, April 9, 2016 - Due to winds in excess of 90 km/hr, part of the roof of the new County Administration Building under construction suffered damage. This event occurred during the late evening hours on Friday, April 8. Shortly thereafter, County Administrators were notified and representatives from Casman Group of Companies, the County's building contractor for the project, were on site to assess the situation. This event did not, and does not; pose any safety risk to County staff, Casman employees or the general public. "We wish to reassure ratepayers that there will be no additional cost to the County resulting from the recent nature-borne damage to the structure," stated Kerry Compagnion, Casman's Project Manager for the new County building. "We recently took the added measure of double-bracing the roof structure in anticipation of strong spring winds. However, no unfinished roof is likely to withstand the extreme wind pressures that were encountered last night."

In addition to assuming all costs involved in clean-up and replacement of the damaged roof, Mr. Compagnion noted that he did not foresee any significant impact to the project's construction schedule. "Casman

will staff up accordingly to mitigate any possible timeline issues related to last night's event," he added

"Despite this minor setback to the project, we are thankful that no one was injured in any way," stated Lac Ste. Anne County Mayor Bill Hegy. "Council remains confident in Casman's steadfast commitment to stringent safety protocols, and is satisfied by Casman's undertaking to indemnify the County against any cost or scheduling impacts that may ensue."

At the time of release, a Casman crew has begun site cleanup. Mr. Compagnion anticipates completion by the end of the day.

STONY PLAIN RCMP INVESTIGATE SERIOUS INJURY MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

Stony Plain, Alberta – On April 9, 2016, at approximately 7:42 p.m., the Stony Plain RCMP and emergency services responded to a serious motor vehicle collision at highway 16 and range road 32. Two vehicles were in-

volved in the collision.

There are 5 individuals being transported to Edmonton area hospitals by both STARS Air Ambulance and ground ambulances. Two individuals have sustained life threatening injuries, while the other three individuals are believed to have received serious but non-life

threatening injuries.

Alcohol is believed to be a factor in the collision.

The east bound lanes of highway 16 are blocked by the collision. The west bound driving lanes of highway 16 are unaffected by the collision. East bound traffic is being detoured around the collision scene, and will continue to be detoured around the collision scene for several hours.

An update will be provided when new information becomes available.







Edmonton Police Service officers arrested two suspects, one adult male and one 16 year old female, who were turned over the St. Albert RCMP for further investigation.

Adams, Adam Matthew - age 28 of Edmonton, Alberta is facing several Criminal Code charges including Robbery and Assault with a Weapon. He has been remanded into custody to appear in St. Albert Provincial Court on April 11, 2016.

The 16 year old female, who cannot be identified as per the Youth Criminal Justice Act, was released to a guardian to appear in

St. Albert Youth Court on May 3, 2016 on several charges including Robbery and Assault with a Weapon

The two female victims sustained minor injuries that did not require hospital treatment. Both have been offered free crisis and emotional support by the St. Albert Victim Services Unit.

SHARE YOUR VIEWS ON THE TRANS-PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP (TPP)

The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) is an important trade deal for Canada's exporters because it will grant them access to 800 million consumers with a combined GDP of \$29 trillion. That's over 14 times the size of Canada's economy! It is a deal that will benefit farmers, business owners and manufacturers alike

and it is at risk of not being ratified by the current Liberal government.

The House of Commons Standing Committee on International Trade is conducting a prestudy of the Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement and has put a call out to Canadians for written submissions and requests to appear before the committee.


In addition to hearings that will take place in Ottawa, and fol-

lowing approval by the House of Commons, the Committee expects to hold hearings across Canada over the coming months. Once cross-country hearings are confirmed, information will be provided about dates and locations.

Canadians who wish to provide a written submission must do so before 23:59 EDT on April 30th, 2016. Written submissions are to be no more than

NATIONAL RAILWAY SAFETY WEEK

Rail Safety Week is April 25-May 1, Here at CN we are especially focused on the message "see tracks, think trains." Every year we see far too many injuries and fatalities as a result of poor decisions. Here are some helpful tips to keep in mind:

Railroad tracks and bridges are private property, and any unauthorized person who is on railway property which is not designated as a crossing, is committing an offence under the law. Too often the penalty paid is death. If caught, you could receive a fine of \$287.00 with mandatory court. Trespassing also includes operating any type of All Terrain Vehicle on or next to the railway tracks.

Walking near the railway tracks with headphones, or any other audio device will interfere with your ability to hear an approaching train. A train travelling 105km/hr will take up to 2km to stop – that's more than 18 football fields!

It plans to improve camping, accommodations, trails and amenities to meet the changing expectations of visitors.

This phone number with detailed information about the location can be used to report suspicious activity, trespass or railway related concerns

ALBERTA TRAFFIC SAFETY FOCUS FOR APRIL IS: SPEED

Submitted by Dale Friedel

Speed Facts

- In 2014, a quarter of fatal collisions involved one or more drivers travelling at a speed too great for the given conditions as reported by enforcement agencies
- Speeding doesn't always kill. Brain injuries are a common injury that results from speed-related collisions
- Speeding can cause long-term consequences that affect both you and your family

- Speeding reduces the effectiveness of seatbelts and other safety devices such as air bags and side impact beams
- Demerits for speeding range from two points (exceeding the posted limit by less than 15 km/h) to six points (exceeding the posted limit by more than 50 km/h)
- Over a five year period, 451 people were killed and 11,753 were injured in collisions involving unsafe speed (2010-2014)

Driving a few km/h over the posted speed limit:

- Decreases your field of vision and your peripheral vision
- Extends the distance required to stop your vehicle
- Increases the chances that you will lose control of your vehicle
- Increases the chance of death or injury if there is a crash

School and playground zones:

• The speed limit in both urban and rural school zones is 30 km/h and is in effect on school days from 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and 3 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. unless other times are

posted by the municipality.

- The speed limit in a playground zone is 30 km/h and is in effect from 8:30 a.m. to one hour after sunset.
- A vehicle is not allowed to pass another vehicle travelling in the same direction in school or playground zones while these zones are in effect.

Emergency vehicles and construction zones:

- Motorists must slow to 60 km/h, or less if the posted speed is lower, when passing emergency vehicles or tow trucks stopped with their lights flashing. Fines for speeding are doubled in these areas.
- Emergency vehicles include fire, police, ambulance, tow trucks, gas disconnection units of a public utility, or designated emergency response units.
- If there are two or more traffic lanes in the same direction as the emergency vehicle or tow truck, you must decrease your speed unless there is one full lane between your vehicle and the stopped emergency vehicle or tow truck that has its flashing lights on. If any part of the emergency vehicle or tow truck extends into a lane, vehicles in the lane beside must also slow down. Vehicles in oncoming traffic lanes do not need to slow down, but should proceed with caution.
- In construction zones, motorists must observe the posted speed. When workers are present, fines for speeding are doubled. Drivers need to look out for workers who are behind construction equipment and less visible.
- Remember to avoid watching the emergency or construction and keep focused on driving!



For all the marking and measuring necessary to prepare the molding, you will find the multipurpose Kreg Multi-Mark Marking Gauge indispensable. To fill any small gaps, Woodcraft recommends Famowood Wood Filler, along with Norton 5X Small Area Sanding Sponges for smoothing filled holes.






