CITY URGES RESIDENTS TO USE CAUTION WHEN USING FIRE PITS

The City of Leduc Fire Services is asking residents to be vigilant and respectful when using residential or public fire pits, especially with the current dry conditions.

"It is imperative that all City residents are conscious of the current dry conditions as we enter the weekend," said Fire Chief George Clancv with Leduc Fire Services. "We have had a few grass fires already this year, and we are preparing for a busy grass fire season ahead."

If residents witness careless use of a fire pit, whether it is residential or public, please notify Leduc Fire Services as soon as possible by calling Fire Services Administration at 780-980-8475 during regular business hours, or 9-1-1 during an emergency.

"Unfortunately, we are not receiving anywhere near the precipitation that we would normally be present this time of year," said Clancy, "and while we have not imposed a fire ban as of today, Leduc Fire Services will continue to monitor the situation closely over the next few weeks.'

LEDUC COUNTY UNDER A FIRE BAN

Leduc County, Alberta - All areas of Leduc County are under a fire ban, effective April 1 at 10 a.m. until further notice, due to extremely dry conditions, forecasted temperatures and windy conditions.

"Leduc County Fire Services has issued a fire ban in an effort to keep the county safe from fire," says Brad Gurmin, Fire Marshal. "With the


cooperation of all residents and visitors, we can minimize the fire risk in the county."

While under a fire ban, Leduc County's fire guardians are prohibited from issuing fire permits, all fire permits previously issued are suspended and all outdoor fires presently burning must be extinguished immediately.

The fire ban prohibits open fires, campfires, fires used for cooking or warmth, burning barrels and the discharge of fireworks.

The fire ban does not apply to fires contained in cooking and heating appliances which are fueled by liquid fuel.

Any individual responsible for setting a fire prohibited under the ban will be responsible for the costs of extinguishing the fire, pursuant to Leduc County bylaws, and may be charged under the Forest and Prairie Protection Act.







FIND AND MAINTAIN THE RIGHT CARPET FOR YOU

DO become knowledgeable about different carpet styles, such

as frieze, Berber, Saxony, textured, and more. This will help ensure you make the most educated decision.

DON'T purchase at the first store you visit. Shop around to investigate different pricing and specials. Also, consider the professionalism and expertise of the staff responsible for carpet installation. High-cost carpet may not look very good if it isn't installed correctly.

DO stain-protect rugs and carpeting, which can help repel stains that would otherwise become permanent and can prolong the longevity of the flooring.

DON'T forget to vacuum carpets frequently to prevent ground-in dirt and debris.

HOW TO CREATE EXTRA SPACE FOR GUESTS

Homeowners who enjoy entertaining frequently sometimes host overnight guests. While many hosts and hostesses have spare bedrooms for overnight or long-term guests, many others do not. But those among the latter group willing to get a little creative can find more places for overnight guests to rest their heads.

Sofa: Living room or den sofas can double as bedding for overnight guests. As a shortterm solution, a night or two on the couch can be comfortable enough. Be sure to cover the sofa with freshly laundered sheets and provide those amenities one would expect in a guest space. Access to a television, a reading lamp, a fan for some

white noise and a table on which to place a phone or alarm clock are helpful to have. Such items will make guests more comfortable. If your living room or family room has a door that can be closed, this will help create more privacy for guests.

· Convertible bed: Marketed frequently under the brand name Murphy Bed, convertible beds can incorporate sleeping options into rooms with limited space. This furniture essentially is a bed that folds vertically or horizontally into a frame. When closed, the bed can look like a decorative storage closet or armoire. Some convertible beds come with bookcase accessories to expand storage space and also make the piece look like a more

cohesive unit. Designers also have experimented with these beds, and some transform from a desk or even from a low-lying bookshelf or bench into a bed.

· Sofa bed or chair: Sofa beds and chairs have a fold-out bed nestled beneath their cushions. Depending on the size of the couch, a twin, full or queen-sized bed may be housed within. Sofa beds vary in regard to their comfort levels, so prospective hosts should investigate their options to ensure guests have the most comfortable sleeping situations possible. A bed in a couch can turn an office or living space into a guest sanctuary in a matter of minutes. In addition, some sofa beds also have extra space built within for storing blankets and

pillows. Many popular furniture retailers offer couch brands that can be equipped with a bed. And if space is especially tight, consider a convertible chair that has a twin-sized bed tucked away.

· Bunk beds: Bunk beds may seem like child's play, but they make great use of vertical space. Share a kid's room with your son or daughter and let the guest take your own bedroom. Otherwise, equip a home office with bunk beds and have two more sleeping spaces available.

Accommodating guests when you don't have a guest bedroom can take some creativity, but those willing to think outside the box can find options that don't compromise guests' comfort.

that online census will now be available for the duration of this year's program, augmented by census workers going into the community, April 23 – May 15."

Every household will receive a formal letter with a personal identification number (PIN) required to participate online, and this year's online census will also feature a Leduc Travel Trends survey.

"We've also partnered with the Leduc Public Library again this year to offer residents the use of a secure and dedicated computer terminal to complete the census online," says Hormaza-

Households that have not participated through online census will receive a visit from a City of Leduc census worker between April 23 and May 31, 2016.



NATIONAL RAILWAY SAFETY WEEK

Rail Safety Week is April 25-May 1, Here at CN we are especially focused on the message "see tracks, think trains." Every year we see far too many injuries and fatalities as a result of poor decisions. Here are some helpful tips to keep in mind:

Railroad tracks and bridges are private property, and any unauthorized person who is on railway property which is not designated as a crossing, is committing an offence under the law. Too often the penalty paid is death. If caught, you could receive a fine of \$287.00 with mandatory court. Trespassing also includes operating any type of All Terrain Vehicle on or next to the railway tracks.

Walking near the railway tracks with headphones, or any other audio device will interfere with your ability to hear an approaching train. A train travelling 105km/hr will take up to 2km to stop – that's more than 18 football fields!

Many photographers don't even know that trespassing on railway property is illegal. For example by attempting to get this enticing train track "wedding shot", you and your clients are putting yourself in danger.

The emergency phone number 1800-465-9239 is an important number to remember. This number is displayed on a bright yellow sticker on every cross buck or electronic drop gate. This phone number with detailed information about the location can be used to report suspicious activity, trespass or railway related concerns.

Remember, when it comes to trains: Stay off! Stay Away! Stay Safe!


