STONY PLAIN RCMP CONTINUE THEIR INVESTIGATION INTO THE MURDER OF JOLENE MARIE COTE

Stony Plain, AB – In the early morning hours of October 13, 2011, police began their investigation into the murder of 36-year-old Jolene Marie Cote whose body was found at her residence located on RR 264 in the rural area just outside of Stony Plain.

Starting today and continuing tomorrow the RCMP's Underwater Recovery Team from British Columbia ("E" Division) will be searching the body of water located east of RR 264 on TWP Road 532A, near the home in which Jolene Cote lived at the time of her death.

In support of the underwater search operation there will be a police presence in the area, however, the RCMP would like to assure residents that it is related to the search and that there is not any risk to public safety.

In the early days of the investigation in late 2011, it was reported that theft or robbery may have played a role in the attack on Jolene Cote which resulted in her death as wedding rings and a necklace belonging to her were reported missing. Consequently, one of the tasks of the investigation was to determine whether the missing jewelry was related to the offence. Police have determined that Jolene Cote was not wearing the jewelry on the evening of October 12, 2011, when she was killed.

Stony Plain RCMP Continue Their Investigation Into The Murder Of Jolene Marie Cote

tions and other pieces of evidence gathered during the course of the investigation, indicate that whoever attacked Jolene Cote was someone who had the intention to seriously harm or kill her. The evidence obtained by police does not support the idea that Jolene Cote interrupted someone in the midst of committing a robbery or theft at her residence as

was suggested initially in some media reports.

Jolene Cote is known to have been driving a 2002 silver Jeep Liberty on the night of her murder on October 12, 2011. Police are asking for anyone who may have seen this vehicle that evening to contact them.

The RCMP continue to investigate this murder and have allocated additional police resources to their ongoing efforts.

Anyone who knew Jolene Cote, as well as members of the public, who may have information that could assist investigators are asked to contact the RCMP Stony Plain Detachment at 780-968-7267. 

Parliament caught international headlines this week, as physician-assisted dying entered its final stages; a bill to protect transgender rights was tabled by the Liberal Government, and Prime Minister Justin Trudeau aggressively guided a Conservative member towards his seat.

The following was brought before the House:

• Conservative Private Member's Bill C-230 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code (firearm — definition of variant)

• Conservative Private Member's Bill C-229 – Life Means Life Act • Bill C-2 – An Act to amend the Income Tax Act

• Bill C-11 – An Act to amend the Copyright Act (access to copyrighted works or other subject-matter for persons with perceptual disabilities). This bill passed third reading and is now in the Senate.

• Bill C-14 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying) was debated further. Voting is expected to take place next week.

• Bill C-10 – An Act to amend the Air Canada Public Participation Act and to provide for certain other measures.

• Bill C-16 – An Act to amend the

Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code (the bill to protect transgender rights) was tabled.

• Liberal Motion No. 24 – Tamil Heritage Month

• Question of Privilege: 'physical molestation of the Member from Berthier – Maskinongé', when the Prime Minister's aggressive behaviour infringed on the Member's right to vote.

I had the opportunity to ask the Government questions on two separation occasions as to what actions they are taking on the Mountain Pine Beetle moving through Jasper National Park, slowly making its way into Alberta's forests: http://www.parl.gc.ca/ content/hoc/House/421/Debates/056/ HAN056-E.PDF on page 32, and http://www.parl.gc.ca/content/hoc/ House/421/Debates/057/HAN057-E. PDF on page 39.

This week the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development continued to study and hear witnesses regarding federal protected areas and conservation objectives, and began a review of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999. Throughout the week, I attended nine meetings and five events. As the House is not sitting the week of May 23rd, look for my update next Friday on my travels throughout the riding.

Parliament was down this week and I had the opportunity to spend time in the riding with constituents and business groups on Monday and Wednesday.

On Tuesday, I prepared a couple of radio messages in recognition of En-

vironment Week (June 5-11); Senior's Week (June 6-12); a congratulatory message to all our 2016 high school graduates, and Canada's upcoming149th birthday (July 1). Later that evening, I was present at the Mayerthorpe Town Council meeting.

The latter part of the week, I attended the 'Conservative Party of Canada National Convention 2016' in Vancouver. The convention was open to all members of the party who wished to attend and was a chance for our grassroots to bring forward policy resolutions and amendments.

The candidates running for party leadership also had the opportunity to speak and gain prospective supporters for their campaigns. The vote to select our next party leader will take place in exactly one year.

I look forward to returning to Otta-

wa, as Parliament will be sitting next week. I will take part in the debate on Bill C-7 (regarding RCMP unionization) on May 30 and on Bill C-10 (regarding Air Canada) on June 1. The historic final vote on physician-assisted dying is also expected to take place early next week. My next update will be on Friday, June 3, informing you of the happenings in Parliament.
