WOMAN ASSAULTED NEAR SPRUCE GROVE BUSINESS

File # 2016665612 - On May 31st, 2016 the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP received a complaint from a female who reported that she had been assaulted while walking near a business in Spruce Grove. The female claimed that at approximately 12:30 AM on this date, she was walking in the area of the Westland Market Mall Parking Lot, near the Bulk Barn,

located at 70 Mc Leod Avenue in Spruce Grove when a male approached her. The unknown male tried to talk to the woman, when she told him not to bother her he reacted by punching her in the face. The victim then fell to the ground while the suspect fled westbound on foot. The victim suffered minor injuries to her teeth and gums. The suspect is described as follows.

Age: possibly 25 - 35 years Race: dark skin tone, possibly Aboriginal Hair: black, short Facial Hair: clean shaven

Clothing: black hoodie with a skull on it, Blue Jeans, dark coloured Nike runners

STONY PLAIN RCMP CONTINUE THEIR INVESTIGATION INTO THE MURDER OF JOLENE MARIE COTE

Stony Plain, AB – In the early morning hours of October 13, 2011, police began their investigation into the murder of 36-year-old Jolene Marie Cote whose body was found at her residence located on RR 264 in the rural area just outside of Stony Plain.

Starting today and continuing tomorrow the RCMP's Underwater Recovery Team from British Columbia ("E" Division) will be searching the body of water located east of RR 264 on TWP Road 532A, near the home in which Jolene Cote lived at the time of her death.

In support of the underwater search operation there will be a police presence in the area, however, the RCMP would like to assure residents that it is related to the search and that there is not any risk to public safety.

In the early days of the investigation in late 2011, it was reported that theft or robbery may have played a role in the attack on Jolene Cote which resulted in her death as wedding rings and a necklace belonging to her were reported missing. Consequently,

one of the tasks of the investigation was to determine whether the missing jewelry was related to the offence. Police have determined that Jolene Cote was not wearing the jewelry on the evening of October 12, 2011, when she was killed. In addition, police confirm that there is not any evidence to suggest that theft or robbery was a motive in the attack that ended Jolene Cote's life, nor do police believe this to have been a random act.

NEW SIGNS DEPICT LOCAL BRULE HISTORY & LANDMARKS

After a lot of diligent work from Yellowhead County's Heritage Advisory Group and input from local historians and historical groups, the new outdoor heritage signs are up. The signs highlight the rich history of explorer David Thompson's travels through the area as well as other significant spots near Brule.

Yellowhead County Mayor Gerald Soroka and Deputy Mayor Jack

Williams were in attendance, along with members from the Yellowhead County Heritage Advisory Board and the Hinton Historical Society for the official unveiling ceremony for the new signs.

The signs are located on the Solomon Hill Turnout on Brule Road between Highway 40 and the Hamlet of Brule overlooking the Brule Lake section on the Athabasca River northwest of Hinton.


The two signs showcase many of the historical landmarks and locations in the Brule area. One focuses on David Thompson, the explorer who, with the assistance of local First Nations and Métis explorers, established a route through the Rocky Mountains beginning in 1810 for the North West Company. The second sign has information on both historically relevant sites as well as geographical landmarks such as the nearby dunes and waterfalls.

Stony Plain RCMP Continue Their Investigation Into The Murder Of Jolene Marie Cote

The investigation to date, including examination of the crime scene, autopsy reports, witness statements, forensic examinations and other pieces of evidence gathered during the course of the investigation, indicate that whoever attacked Jolene Cote was someone who had the intention to seriously harm or kill her. The evidence obtained by police does not support the idea that Jolene Cote in-

terrupted someone in the midst of committing a robbery or theft at her residence as was suggested initially in some media reports.

Jolene Cote is known to have been driving a 2002 silver Jeep Liberty on the night of her murder on October 12, 2011. Police are asking for anyone who may have seen this vehicle that evening to contact them. (*- Photo of vehicle attached for reference)

The RCMP continue to inves-

tigate this murder and have allocated additional police resources to their ongoing efforts.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MAY 30

This week in Parliament, we covered topics including physician-assisted dying, the unionization of the RCMP, and electoral reform.

The following was debated:

• Bill C-7, An Act to amend the Public Service Labour Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations and Employment Board Act and other Acts and to provide for certain other measures. I gave a speech on this bill before it passed Third Reading and was sent to the Senate. - Bill C-14, An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying), passed Third Reading and is now before the Senate.
- Bill C-10, An Act to amend the Air Canada Public Participation Act and to provide for certain other measures, passed Third Reading and is now before the Senate.
- Bill C-210, An Act to amend the National Anthem Act (gender), passed Second Reading and is at Report Stage.
- Bill C-238, National Strategy

for Safe Disposal of Lamps Containing Mercury Act.

- Liberal MP Geng Tan's Motion No. 38 (Spring Festival).
- NDP Motion—Special Committee on Electoral Reform.
- Bill C-240, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (tax credit — first aid).
- Bill C-15, An Act to implement certain provisions of the budget.
- Bill C-6, An Act to amend the Citizenship Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act.
- Bill C-224, the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act.

This week in the Standing Committee on Environment and

TIPS FOR NEWCOMERS TO THE GAME OF GOLF

Few hobbies can be as enjoyable one moment and as frustrating the next as golf. Golfers know a great putt can be quickly followed by a bad tee shot, and maintaining their composure through the highs and lows of the game is a key to success on the links.



As kids approach school age, don't overlook the nearby putt-putt or miniature golf range as a valuable teaching tool. Miniature golf clubs are small enough for many children to use comfortably, and kids can use miniature golf courses as a place to put any lessons or advice on putting to good use. What's more, a miniature golf course is more than just golf, with creative courses and other fun activities, so kids won't feel overwhelmed with golf.

When kids move on from preschool to elementary school, some might want to tag along with Mom or Dad to the driving range. When your child finds a set of clubs that suits him or her, teach the proper way to swing and consider signing up your son or daughter for lessons. Those first few lessons can prove invaluable, turning a pastime into a passion kids will carry with

them throughout their lives.






