LEDUC COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVES 2016 BUDGET, SETS TAX RATES

Leduc County, Alberta – Leduc County council approved the final 2016 budget and set the 2016 tax rates at its special council meeting this morning.

Council approved an \$83.4-million operating budget and \$38.5-million capital budget, which represents a total tax dollar budget increase of approximately 1.37 per cent over 2015.

"We were challenged to hold the line on spending and find efficiencies in these uncertain economic times," says Mayor John Whaley. "We approved modest, fiscally responsible increases to ensure we can continue providing residents and business owners with high-quality municipal services."

The 2016 capital budget includes \$9.9 million for the annual road surfacing program, \$4.9 million for a building expansion, \$2.4 million for capital equipment purchases for protective services, \$1.2 million for bridge rehabilitation and \$500,000 for parks and recreation purposes.

2016 tax rates


The modest budget increase resulted in a minimal tax increase for most land owners. Approximately 80 per cent of Leduc County property owners can expect a property tax increase of less than \$100 over 2015, with five per cent receiving an increase between \$101 and \$250.

Property taxes are comprised of municipal taxes, other requisitions

and the provincial education tax. Leduc County is obligated to collect the provincial education tax, as set by the Government of Alberta, as part of its property taxes. Leduc County's total 2016 education property tax is \$22.4 million, which represents an approximately 8.4-percent, or \$1.7-million, increase over 2015.

"The marginal property tax increase ensures the level of service provided to landowners is maintained," says Renee Klimosko, director of finance.

Tax notices will be mailed to residents no later than the last week of May 2016. Taxes are due by June 30, 2016.

THORSBY RCMP LOCATE BODY OF MISSING 23-YEAR-OLD WOMAN

UPDATE #1: Thorsby, AB - On April 1, 2016, the RCMP concluded its search for 23-year-old Kelsey Nicole Kramer when her body was discovered in a densely wooded rural area near the Genesee Natural Area, north of St. Francis Alberta.

Kelsey Kramer had been reported by her mother to the Drayton Valley RCMP Detachment as a missing person last week, on Tuesday, March 22. Investigation by police had determined that Ms. Kramer was last seen and heard from on the night of Saturday, March 19. Police located a vehicle that Ms. Kramer was known to be driving in a rural location within the Breton RCMP Detachment's area.

The RCMP Missing Persons Unit was engaged as well as the RCMP Major Crimes Unit (MCU) from Edmonton. The police investigation and search for Ms. Kramer utilized resources from the Drayton Valley, Breton and Thorsby RCMP detachments. Participating in the search of

various locations were the RCMP's Special Tactical Operations (STO) troop, RCMP Police Dog Services (PDS) and RCMP Air Services.

Ms. Kramer's family has been notified by police. An autopsy is scheduled for next week at the Office of the Medical Examiner in Edmonton; the results of which will determine the cause and manner of Ms. Kramer's death.

No additional details are available at this time as the investigation into the death of Ms. Kramer continues, however an update will be issued once new information is confirmed.

BACKGROUNDER: Drayton Val-

ley RCMP along with Breton and Drumheller RCMP are looking for the public's assistance in locating missing 23 year old Kelsey KRAMER. KRAMER was last seen in Drumheller on Saturday March 19th, 2016 and was believed to be heading back to Drayton Valley. KRAMER was driv-

ing a green 2006 Ford Freestyle at the time of her disappearance. KRAMER is believed to have gone missing in the Breton/Drayton Valley area.

Kelsey is described as approximately 5 foot 5 (165cm) and 140lbs (64kg) with blue eyes and light brown hair.



SENIORS WELCOME ANNOUNCEMENT THAT OAS AGE WILL STAY AT 65

Seniors and retirees represented by the National Pensioners Federation will welcome today's announcement by Prime Minister Trudeau that the eligibility age for Old Age Security will stay at age 65 and not be increased as enacted by the previous government.

Today Prime Minister Justin

Trudeau announced during a town hall with Bloomberg TV in New York that Tuesday's budget will restore the eligibility for Old Age Security to 65 from 67.

The National Pensioners Federation opposed the increase in the eligibility age, due to take effect in 2023, because so many seniors depend on OAS and the Guaranteed Income Supplement and could not have waited the extra two years to receive these benefits




