RIDING UPDATE

Week of May 23, 2016

Parliament was down this week and I had the opportunity to spend time in the riding with constituents and business groups on Monday and Wednesday.

On Tuesday, I prepared a couple of radio messages in recognition of Environment Week (June 5-11); Senior's Week (June 6-12); a congratulatory message to all our 2016 high school graduates, and Canada's upcoming149th birthday (July 1). Later that evening, I was present at the Mayerthorpe Town Council meeting.

The latter part of the week, I attended the 'Conservative Party of Canada National Convention 2016' in Vancouver. The convention was open to all members of the party who wished to attend and was a chance for our grassroots to bring forward policy resolutions and amendments.

The candidates running for party leadership also had the opportunity to speak and gain prospective supporters for their campaigns. The vote to select our next party leader will take place in exactly one year.

I look forward to returning to Ottawa,

as Parliament will be sitting next week. I will take part in the debate on Bill C-7 (regarding RCMP unionization) on May 30 and on Bill C-10 (regarding Air Canada) on June 1. The historic final vote on physician-assisted dying is also expected to take place early next week.

Week of April 25, 2016

Parliament was down for the week, allowing me the opportunity, while in the riding, to attend town council meetings, meet with mayors, as well as local business owners and students.

On Friday, April 22, I attended the Woodlands County Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. I had the pleasure of speaking to two grade nine classes at Holy Redeemer High School on Monday. Following this, I met with members of the RCMP.

I stopped in to say hello to residents in Jasper on Tuesday, and met with two more classes in Grande Cache on Wednesday. Also in Grande Cache, I met with numerous local organizations and later attended the town council meeting.

I spent Thursday in Rocky Mountain House for the grand opening of my new satellite office, as promised during the election campaign. Here I was able to meet with residents from the town and surrounding area, as well as councillors and the mayor. This office will be open Tuesday through Thursday, weekly, to better serve constituents in the south part of Yellowhead.

On Saturday, I attended an event in Sunnybrook for the re-opening of the community hall.

Weeks of March 28 and April 4

Parliament was down for two weeks, allowing me the opportunity to meet with local mayors, business leaders, stakeholders, and constituents.

I spent the latter half of the week in Lethbridge attending the funeral service for my former colleague, MP Jim Hillyer. Mr. Hillyer passed away in Ottawa on March 23, and he leaves behind a wife and four children.

During the second week, I met with several key leaders of communities and industries. In Edson, I had the opportunity to speak with a company working on a renewable energy storage project in the riding. I also met with Edson Mayor, Greg Pasychny, as well as several representatives of the community concerning the viability and future of the Edson Air Cadets squadron. I believe this is a fantastic opportunity for youth and I would highly recommend it to anyone looking to get their children involved in the community.

To end the week, I travelled to the south end of the riding to attend the Rocky Mountain House and Clearwater County Annual Agriculture Banquet. I flew back to Ottawa on April 10, and am looking forward to representing the residents of Yellowhead as we debate the Liberal Government's budget.

Week of March 14

As Parliament was down the week of March 14th, I attended local community meetings and events in the riding. This allowed me the opportunity to engage with constituents.

While in Warburg, I said a few words at the Fish and Game Association's event. Later in the week, I participated in Jasper National Park's Annual Public Forum, where attendees were informed on the progress of implementing the Park's management plan. I also delivered a speech in Jasper on the occasion of the flag raising to mark the beginning of the annual Jasper Pride Festival. On Friday, my wife, Nancy, and I were in Rocky Mountain House and later in the evening we helped out with the Edson Rotary Club's fundraiser.

At the end of the week, I had the pleasure of speaking at the Evansburg Royal Canadian Legion Branch 196 regional Spring Rally. This was a great opportunity to recognize the support and involvement of our local legions within their communities.

As promised during the Federal Election Campaign last year, I will be opening an office in Rocky Mountain House to better serve the constituents in the southern part of the riding. I spent some time there, this week, assisting in setting up the office and it should be ready for its grand opening sometime late April.



POSSIBLE TORNADO/STRONG WINDS

On June 11th, 2016 at 3:35 PM the Leduc RCMP responded to a call of a possible small tornado that had touched down in the City of Leduc.

RCMP Officers responded to the affected locations on Highway #2, 54th Street and in the Willow Park Estates residential area. The storm caused damage residential properties, vehicles and uprooted several

trees. The City of Leduc Public Works and Leduc Fire Services attended the area to assist in removal of debris to prevent any possible road hazards.

Contact was made with the resi-

dents in the area where there were no injuries sustained to the public. The nature of the storm is unconfirmed at this time and whether the damage was caused by a small tornado or extreme winds.

MEDICAL EPISODE RESULTS IN MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

On June 14th, 2016 at 5:34 P.M, Leduc RCMP, along with Leduc and Edmonton emergency services responded to a two vehicle collision on Range Road 244 at 41st Avenue in Leduc, Alberta. A white pick up truck, driven by a 41 year old male, was travelling north on Range Road 244 approaching 41st Avenue. The male began to go into medical distress and collided with the vehicle in front of him. The collision was mi-

nor in nature however, the driver of the white truck was unresponsive to witnesses on scene. Access to the vehicle was gained and the driver was removed. CPR was initiated until fire and EMS arrived on scene. The male was transported to a local hospital where he was later pronounced deceased. The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) is an important trade deal for Canada's exporters because it will grant them access to 800 million consumers with a combined GDP of \$29 trillion. That's over 14 times the size of Canada's economy! It is a deal that will benefit farmers, business owners and manufacturers alike

and it is at risk of not being ratified by the current Liberal government.

The House of Commons Standing Committee on International Trade is conducting a prestudy of the Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement and has put a call out to Canadians for written submissions and requests to appear before the committee.

In addition to hearings that will take place in Ottawa, and fol-

lowing approval by the House of Commons, the Committee expects to hold hearings across Canada over the coming months. Once cross-country hearings are confirmed, information will be provided about dates and locations.

Canadians who wish to provide a written submission must do so before 23:59 EDT on April 30th, 2016. Written submissions are to be no more than

Week of June 13, 2016

This week in Parliament, we covered topics including organ donation, marijuana, life sentences, and the constitutional right for Canadians to trade with Canadians (internal trade).
