BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR JACKFISH LAKE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

EDMONTON – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Jackfish Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

- Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can

safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any lake, including Lake Isle, at any time. Boiling lake water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae (cyanobacteria).

Blue-Green Algae (Cyanobacteria) Bloom Advisory Issued For Jackfish Lake

Continued From Page 1

An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is naturally occurring, and often become

visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with vis-

ible blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), or who ingest water containing blue-green algae (cyanobacteria), may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symp-

toms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Jackfish Lake, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Jackfish Lake in which the blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Blue-green Algae (Cyanobacteria) Advisory is in place.



YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL **HIGHLIGHTS**

June 28, 2016

Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers (CAPP) - A representative from CAPP gave an overview of issues currently affecting oil and gas producers in regards to local governments' policies and decisions, emphasizing that services provided by the municipalities, tax policies and rates, and keeping tax dollars in areas where industry is active is important to the long term health of oil and gas producers.

Edson Forest Products - West Fraser Mills LTD asked for a letter from Council in support of their request for a 2-year extension from the province for the continued use of their burner to deal with the stockpile of wood bark accumulating at the Edson Forest Products plant. According to West Fraser Mills, the stockpile is due to their inability to sell the fuel to the oil and gas industry at this time. The request will be brought back to Council at the next regular meeting.

County Parks & Open Spaces Plan - The County's Parks & Open Spaces plan highlights an emphasis on trail networks, ice rinks, parks and playgrounds, and other recreation focused facilities and other infrastructure. Recommendations in the plan are based on input from County residents through public open houses and surveys over the past year. The recommendations will be brought back to council for further consideration.

Edson Revenue Sharing -Council approved the agreement, in-principle, and will forward the agreement to the Town of Edson for review and comment. The expenditure associated with Yellowhead County budget as a result of entering into this agreement (depending on assessments) is just under \$5 million annually.

Marlboro Paving - Council approve a contract extension to E Construction Ltd. for the paving work in Marlboro. The approved 2016 budget includes sufficient funding for the skating rink and community hall work, but will require an additional \$564,000.00 for the paving of the Marlboro access road and fire hall. The additional funding will be reallocated from the 2016 construction budget.

Vegetation Control Policy -Council approved an Agricultural Services Board update to the Vegetation Control Policy. The updated policy better reflects brush control products that are currently used, and moves the no spray agreement deadline from July 15 to July 1 as many species are going to seed by this point.

Land Transfer Proposal - Council approved the transfer of the Green Grove Recreation Board's land and buildings in Niton Junction to Yellowhead County with the understanding that these lands are to be retained, in principle, for continued use as a parks and

recreation space within the com-

Shotgun Program -Yellowhead County Peace Officers were authorized by Council to carry shotguns in patrol vehicles to enforce several animal control acts and bylaws and can be used to dispatch an animal that is injured or vicious and posing an immediate danger to the peace officer or the public. Authorization to obtain and the use of the firearms is strictly controlled by the Alberta Justice and Solicitor General Department.

Bylaw 06.16 - Council gave first reading to Bylaw 06.16 for a property adjacent to Long Lake (Part of NE 31- 55-15-W5M) to rezone it from Rural District to County Residential District. The rezoning is due to density of nearby surrounding residential oriented lands. A Public Hearing will be held on July 26, 2016.

Bylaw 14.16 - Council gave first reading to Bylaw 14.16 to rezone a property on Hwy 16 between Niton Junction and Nojack (Plan 5741 RS. Lot A in NE 26-53-12-W5) from Rural District to Recreational Use District to accommodate a proposed future campground/rental cabin development. A Public Hearing will be held on July 26, 2016.

Bylaw 09.16 - Council passed Bylaw 09.16 to amend a property in Niton Junction (part of SW 31-53-12-W5) from Hamlet Residential District to Hamlet Commercial District to accommodate a future commercial storage facility.

Sun Gro Range Road 85 Access - Council agreed to extend their road building agreement with Sun Gro until June 30, 2017 and increase the bond to \$307,500. The road upgrades are being done by Sun Gro on a public county road near Wildwood for their commercial use; all roads developed by independent contractors on county allowances must meet minimum county road standards.

The next Council Meetings is July 26, 2016. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is July 19, 2016. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Submitted by Parkland County

Building a budget is a year-long process. By the time Council approves the tax rate bylaw in the spring to fund the draft budget approved in December, Administration is already looking towards next year's budget. Part of this is done as part of Council's annual strategic plan review, where we look at the long term vision for the County and prioritize resources to help achieve that vision. Administration takes this information and incorporates it in the departmental business plans that form the budget.

The Strategic Plan provides direction for the County, but there are many things that influence the budget, including service levels, infrastructure, and inflation.

For 2016, Parkland County Council has approved a budget that will result in a tax increase of 2.13% for the average residential property and 8.70% for the average commercial/industrial property. We are proud to have one of the lowest tax increases in the Capital Region, as well as one of the lowest non-residential tax rates.

While it did not prove to be a factor in this year's budget, the expected phase out of coal-fired power generating plants by the current provincial government will result in a loss of over \$224M in tax revenues for Parkland County by 2030. Obviously, this could have significant implications on future service levels and financial contributions made by the County.

Despite this, Council remains steadfast in maintaining a low tax rate that will not place adverse pressure on its citizens. Further, we remain committed to creating new sources of revenue to offset some of the financial obligations that are met by our residents and business.

Every May and June school groups, Kindergarten up to Grade 8, visit Tipple Park Museum for a day of history and hands-on activities. The Pioneer School Program, created by current president Irene Lawton, is celebrating a decade of success!

Mrs. Lawton, dressed in Pioneer garb, arrives early in the day and sets up the fire, boils water, and readies the ovens for outdoor baking. Soon the students arrive and it's time for Mrs. Lawton to take a step back in time. She is now Ms. Jones, pioneer.


Ms. Jones tells the kids all about Mr. Evans and the his-

tory of Evansburg. The day is not all talk as there are chores to be done! Broken into groups students wash clothes by hand. First they must haul water from the "well", then use washboards to scrub the clothes clean. Students also make candles, biscuits and butter. They even get to try buttermilk! Older grades enjoy tie-dyeing and log cutting.

"This is hard work," comments one of the students. "I wish I could do this every day," comments another student.

After lunch a round of games is a must while Ms. Jones slips off and transforms into Ms. Brown, school marm. The hand-held school bell rings signalling students to join Ms. Brown at Holly Springs School.

Despite her serious demeanor, Ms. Brown knows how to have fun! After a brief lesson in spelling and math, students get to make a toy such as a whizzer or a pinwheel. Too soon students must step back into the present and head home. On their way

out students bow or curtsey, pack up their toy, candle and leftover butter and head home.
