THORSBY/BRETON RCMP HAVE LAID FRAUD CHARGES AGAINST THE TREASURER OF THE THORSBY SOCCER CLUB

As a result of a complaint lodged in February 2016, the Thorsby/Breton RCMP launched an investigation into a potential fraud involving the Thorsby Soccer Club. The investigation has been completed and as a result a total of 13 charges have been laid against 48-year-old Julie Ann Velasquez of Thorsby, Alberta. Velasquez was at the time of the alleged fraud the Treasurer of the Club.

Julie Velasquez is charged with one count of Breach of Public Trust and 12 counts of fraud dating back to April 2014. Velasquez is set to appear in Breton Provincial Court on July 27, 2016.

CITY OF LEDUC CROSSES 30,000 THRESHOLD FOR 2016 CENSUS

Leduc Census 2016 results show a new population count of 30,498; growth rate of four per cent over 2015, and 80 per cent since 2006.

"It's a very positive milestone for us to surpass 30,000 citizens, welcoming 1,194 new citizens to our community over a one-year period," says Leduc Mayor Greg Krischke. "Leduc is a fantastic community to live, work and raise a family, and we're pleased to see that more and more people are realizing this fact."

The 2016 municipal census ran from April 1 to May 31 and citizens were provided two options to participate, online or at their door. This year's campaign saw more people accessing the online census than in previous years at 39 per cent (33.5 per cent in 2015).

Member of Parliament for Provencher, Ted Falk's Private Members Bill - C-239 - 'The Fairness in Charitable Gifts Act', would have allowed registered charities to provide their donors with the same generous donation receipts that politicians can now issue. Unfortunately, on June 8th the Liberal and New Democrat Members of Parliament voted against this bill ensuring its demise.

On June 7th, I spoke in the House of Commons on this bill and below are a few excerpts from my speech. My complete speech can be found at: http://www.parl.gc.ca/content/ hoc/House/421/Debates/067/ HAN067-E.PDF (See page 77.)

"The bill before us is a great bill for all members of the House and their ridings. It would help every riding in this country. The

depth and scope of the non-profit and voluntary sector in Alberta has provided a wide variety of services to the communities. Non-profit and volunteer organizations touch virtually all aspects of our communities."

"I do not think anything could be clearer than what has transpired in Fort McMurray, Alberta, in the last month. Donations flooded into charities from across Canada. Hotels opened their doors, and people donated

personal money, food, rations, and gas.'

"Bill C-239 is a great initiative to level the playing field. The primary motivation for donating is the compassion and personal belief of most people."

"It is very interesting to note how Canadians pulled together in all parts of this country to support services in their communities. It is the generosity of donors that makes these agencies work, such as the Red Cross, animal shelters, senior centres, and community groups."

It is sad that C-239 did not pass Second Reading. It would have put receipts for charities and political donations on an even playing field. Unfortunately, on June 8th the Liberal and New Democrat Members of Parliament voted against this bill. Bill C-239 would have given more money to those who need it and less to those who do not. I firmly believe that if we had a fair tax exemption program, as this bill was asking for, people would give more generously. Charities are suffering, and they need donations in order to operate.

On June 15th, 2016 Leduc RCMP received a report of an attempted fraudulent use of a credit card, which resulted in a

vehicle stop and 2 people being taken into custody.

A large amount of property was seized that was obtained through the fraudulent use of credit cards. An approximate value of the recovered merchandise was (ca. value of \$26,000). Also recovered were tools to forge documents and credit cards. Dozens of victims have been identified. It appears that the subjects have been active all across the Province for some time. Roy Lapina of Calgary, Alberta and Rebecca Lafreniere of Gatineau, Quebec are both facing 21 Fraud related charges.



RCMP PARTICIPATE IN PROVINCIAL INTEGRATED TRAFFIC UNIT CONDUCTED COMMERCIAL VEHICLE COMPLIANCE CHECK

On June 20 and 21, 2016, the Leduc Municipal Integrated Traffic Unit (MITU) conducted a commercial and passenger vehicle compliance check on Highway 2A near 38 Avenue in the City of Leduc.

The Leduc MITU joined forces with RCMP Provincial Integrated Traffic Unit, Sheriff Provincial Integrated Traffic Unit, County of Leduc Enforcement Services, Beaumont Enforcement Services, City of Edmonton Community Standards and the Alberta Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Branch. This Joint Force Operation primarily focused on the safe operation of motor vehicles on our roadways. Throughout inspections, members located issues such as defective brakes, insecure cargo, improperly labeled dangerous goods, and defective steering components. Over the course of the two days, 134 vehicles were checked and the following was obtained:

18 vehicles passed

13 vehicles required attention 41 vehicles were placed out of service

3 vehicles were towed

1 24-hr suspension issued for alcohol

1 Form 21 warrant was executed

10 federal hours of service charges were laid

4 mandatory Court appearances issued

92 violation tickets issued 284 warnings issued

FIRE SERVICES BATTLES BLAZE AT **APARTMENT COMPLEX**

City of Leduc Fire Services (LFS) responded to and suppressed a 3-alarm structure fire at a local apartment complex on June 12.

"A very quick response from fire crews, and strong tactical and critical decision making made by command staff prevented this fire from further extending to the interior of this apartment complex," said George

Submitted by John R. Clancy, fire chief with the City of Leduc. "A strong, aggressive fire attack by our firefighters saved this property from further damage and allowed the majority of residents return to their homes within a couple of hours of the start of the fire."

> Crews arrived to find a working fire on the balcony of a first story apartment at 3604 Rolleyview Road at approximately 10:24 p.m. Fire damage was confined to the balcony of the fire occupancy and three balco

nies above.

Following a thorough investigation by fire investigators on scene, the cause of the fire was deemed to be a malfunctioning barbecue.

RCMP assisted LFS with the evacuation of all residents, and there were no injuries reported. Leduc Victim Services also responded to assist those that may have been affected by the trauma of this event.

A total of 22 firefighters responded, with the first truck arriving on scene within five minutes of being dispatched, and had the fire suppressed within two and a half hours.

FRAMEWORK FOR RECREATION IN **CANADA INTRODUCED IN REGION**

Leduc, AB — The Leduc region - comprised of seven individual municipalities - is the first collective group in the province to publicly support the Framework for Recreation in Canada, which sets a common vision, goals and priorities for recreation.

Representatives from each municipality in the region gathered Monday to demonstrate support for the framework, and showcase the many ways it is reflected in local recreation and parks services [see backgrounder for a list of initiatives].

"We all know the importance of being active, both physically and mentally," says Ricardo Miranda, minister of Alberta Culture and Tourism. "Active communities are also healthy communities, and I applaud the Leduc region for its initiative and leadership in taking this national framework and turning it into a local plan for action."

The goals of the framework centre on the enhancement of individual and community well-being through recreation and include: active living, inclusion and access, connecting people and nature, supportive environments and recreation capacity.

"By supporting this framework, we acknowledge that the five goals provide us with a shared vision for recreation in the region," says City of Leduc Mayor Greg Krischke. "Together, we are committed to enhancing recreation in the community and creating a strong recreation system in the region for all to enjoy."

The Framework for Recreation in Canada was developed by the Interprovincial Sport and Recreation Council and the Canadian Parks and Recreation Association, in an effort to stimulate coordinated policies and practices in recreation aimed at improving the wellbeing of individuals, communities and the built and natural environment. The Government of Alberta, in partnership with the Alberta Recreation and Parks Association, has developed the Municipal Recreation Engagement Strategy to support a coordinated implementation of the goals identified in the framework, and is encouraging municipalities in Alberta to adopt this strategy.



ALBERTA PARKS MAKES BOOKING CAMPSITES EASIER WITH MOBILE ACCESS



In response to user demand, many campsites in Alberta's provincial park campgrounds can now be booked on personal devices through Reserve.AlbertaParks.ca (RAP). People can use RAP while on the go, making it easy to change a campsite booking, extend a stay or reserve their next camping trip.

And there's more. The RAP website has undergone a complete revamp, including an updated campsite vacancy calendar.

"Albertans love to use our provincial parks and with the new improvements to the RAP website, it will be much easier to get outside and explore Alberta's great outdoors."

The system boasts many new features, including a responsive design to make it more user-friendly and interactive from both personal mobile devices and desktop computers. Enhancements will give campers more access to information for trip planning (deep linking, event and program information) and sharing of information via social media. It also features a more intuitive search function (users can search campsites by map, nearest community or campground).

Bookings as of May 12 of this year are six per cent higher than in 2015, with more than 55,000 reservations processed.

To book a campsite, group camping area or comfort camping unit through a mobile device, just go to the Reserve. AlbertaParks.ca website, search and book a spot.

Alberta Parks encourages wildfire evacuees of Fort Mc-Murray to access free camping options through its contact centre by calling 1-877-537-2757 and not the RAP mobile feature.

Campers are reminded that fire bans and restrictions remain in place for areas of the province. People camping this weekend should check ahead to beta. AlbertaFirebans.ca or AlbertaParks.ca to check on the status of fire bans and restrictions, including off-highway vehicle restrictions, to avoid fines.

Anyone experiencing an issue with the mobile access booking function can get technical assistance at Reserve.AlbertaParks. ca or phone the Alberta Parks Contact Centre at 1-877-537-2757.

The RAP system, introduced in 2009, has processed almost 800,000 camping reservations since inception and boasts more than 433,000 account holders. Last year alone the system processed more than 151,000 camping reservations.
