Stony Plain, Alberta – On Tuesday July 12, 2016 at approximately 9:20 AM, Stony Plain RCMP were investigating a report of a stolen vehicle. When police located the vehicle, a white Ford F550 flat deck, the suspect vehicle attempted to strike the occupied marked police vehicle as it fled. The Stony Plain RCMP engaged in a pursuit with a Ford F550. A short time later the suspect vehicle was attempting to enter Hwy 16A eastbound at Boundary Road when it collided with a civilian vehicle. The occupants of the civilian vehicle were not injured but their vehicle sustained heavy damage.

The pursuit was terminated by RCMP as the suspect vehicle entered the city of Spruce Grove. The Ford F550 proceeded to drive thru the wooded path system near the Marlborough area, in Spruce Grove before it was located unoccupied by police.

RCMP are looking for 2 male suspects and a female suspect but no descriptions are available at this time.

Alberta Parks encourages wildfire evacuees of Fort Mc-Murray to access free camping options through its contact centre by calling 1-877-537-2757 and not the RAP mobile feature.

Campers are reminded that fire bans and restrictions remain in place for areas of the province. People camping this weekend should check ahead to beta. AlbertaFirebans.ca or AlbertaParks.ca to check on the status of fire bans and restrictions, including off-highway vehicle restrictions, to avoid fines.

Anyone experiencing an issue with the mobile access booking function can get technical assistance at Reserve. Alberta Parks. ca or phone the Alberta Parks Contact Centre at 1-877-537-2757.

The RAP system, introduced in 2009, has processed almost 800,000 camping reservations since inception and boasts more than 433,000 account holders. Last year alone the system processed more than 151,000 camping reservations.

## MOUNTAIN PINE BEETLE – WHAT IS THE LIBERAL'S PLAN?

OTTAWA: On May 16th, in the House of Commons, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, asked the Liberal government what their plan was to stop the Mountain Pine Beetle from spreading.

"Mr. Speaker, Jasper National Park, in my riding of Yellowhead, is in trouble. From the west along Mount Robinson to the east park gates, the park has been overtaken by the mountain pine beetle. Local government and forest companies are counting on Parks Canada to stop this epidemic before it moves into Alberta's west central forest

area.

The Liberals say they have a plan, but, as usual, nothing is being done. What is the Liberal plan to stop these evil weevils?"

Again, on May 17th, MP Eglinski asked the following question in the House:

"Mr. Speaker, yesterday in the House, the member opposite said he was more than happy to have a conversation with me about the mountain pine beetle. Unfortunately, on the ground in Alberta, government employees have been told they cannot talk to the local officials about this issue.

Why are the Liberals muzzling scientists and researchers who are critical to this issue?"

## A REFERENDUM ON ELECTORAL REFORM

Instead of doing the right thing by giving Canadians a chance to vote in a referendum, the federal Liberals released a 38-page booklet for Canadians to organize their own electoral reform discussions. Even if Canadians do wish to organize events like this, the Liberal Government has no obligation to legislate what is laid out in the responses.

A recent poll by Forum Research says 65% of Canadians agree that a national referendum must occur before any changes are made to the way we elect our MPs. Just 18% said that giving Canadians a vote on the matter is not necessary and the remaining 17% had no opinion. Yet Prime Minister Trudeau and his Liberal Government continue to come up with new ways to avoid letting Canadians vote on this important question.

If the Liberals truly believe that Canadians will support their plan, why are they dragging their heels on calling a referendum? To be fair, the Democratic Institutions Minister, the Honourable Maryam Monsef, hasn't ruled out a referendum, but she has expressed that she doesn't feel a national vote is needed.

However, precedence shows that referendums are expected by Canadians when it comes to electoral reform. Prince Edward Island (2005), Ontario (2007), and British Columbia (2005 and 2009) all held provincial referendums on whether to get rid of the first-past-the-post system. Our best examples of voting system consultations in Canada all concluded with a referendum. That's the standard of behaviour that Canadians now expect. These provincial governments knew that this was not their decision, but the

decision of voters. Maybe it's time the Liberals let the majority of Canadians decide what they want -a referendum.



### July 26, 2016 **ALBERTA SECURITIES COMMISSION EMPOWERS SENIORS TO IDENTIFY AND** AVOID INVESTMENT FRAUD

Financial abuse is one of the most frequently reported forms of elder abuse in the province according to the Government of Alberta. With World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (June 15) approaching, the Alberta Securities Commission (ASC) is empowering Alberta's seniors to self-protect against investment fraud by providing straightforward tips. These 10 simple tips will assist seniors to combat investment fraud and help to safeguard their hardearned money.

Financial fraudsters often target seniors in Alberta for various reasons. Many seniors are trusting individuals and, by virtue of their age, have typically amassed more wealth than other segments of the population, in the form of retirement savings, residential and vacation properties and other assets. In addition, new online technologies are sometimes difficult for seniors to navigate, making them a vulnerable target. Further, because of shame or embarrassment, seniors are not likely to speak up when fraud happens to them.

"Investment fraud costs Albertans millions of dollars annually, and many victims are elderly," says Alison Trollope, Director, Communications and Investor Education, Alberta Securities Commission. "We encourage seniors to have open lines of communication with their advisors or the person managing their

finances to diminish the chances of investment fraud and help protect their retirement savings and assets. The most important thing to remember is your money belongs to you, and you alone.'

In conjunction with the North American Securities Administrators Association (NASAA), the ASC has outlined 10 tips to protect seniors' retirement savings and assets. They include:

Don't be a victim of your 1. manners - Con artists will exploit your good manners. It's OK to say "no" to an investment opportunity.

2. Check out strangers touting "strange" deals - Trusting strangers is a mistake anyone can make in their personal finances. Say "no" to any investment professional

who presses you to make an immediate decision, giving you no opportunity to check out the salesperson, firm and the investment opportunity itself. Visit Checkfirst.ca to check the registration of the person and organization offering the investment.

3. Always stay in charge of your money - Beware of someone asking to manage or invest your money into something you don't understand or who urges you to leave everything in his or her hands, including power of attorney.

Don't judge a book by its 4. cover - Successful con artists can sound and look professional.

Watch out for salespeo-5. ple who prey on your fears - Con artists know that you worry about your future, including having enough money to live the retirement of your dreams, being able to leave a legacy for your family and the possibility of outliving your savings. Scammers will use those fears to convince you to hand over your money.

6. Don't make a tragedy worse with rash financial decisions - The death or hospitalization of a spouse has many sad consequences - financial fraud shouldn't be one of them.

7. Monitor your investments and ask tough questions -Keep an eye on the progress of your investments. This is prudent even if you're not concerned about fraud.

8. Look out for difficulties retrieving your principal or cashing out profits

If the individual has assured you that you can withdraw your money at any time, but stalls when you want to pull out your principal or profits, you may have uncovered someone who has cheated you.

9. Don't let embarrassment or fear keep you from reporting investment fraud or abuse – Scam artists know that you might be hesitant to report you have been victimized by fraud.

10. Beware of "recovery room" scams – Faced with a loss of funds, some seniors who have been victimized once will go along with another scheme in which the scam artists promise to make good on the original funds lost, and possibly even generate new returns beyond those originally promised.

In addition to being aware of the tips on how seniors can protect themselves against investment fraud, Albertans are also encouraged to educate themselves on the ways that seniors are often approached:
Affinity fraud: A fraudu-

lent opportunity is introduced by a family member, friend or a member of a community organization (such as a church or a curling club) and exploits the trust built in these types of relationships.

• Online ads: Pop-up ads will appear on various websites that seniors may visit, such as lottery and investing sites and social media sites such as Facebook. These ads are designed to lure viewers in, with promises of "easy money" and "high return, low risk" investments. Clicking on the ad will lead to the fraudster's website, which contains more misleading information on the investment opportunity.

• Cold calls: Persistent sales people use aggressive sales tactics over the phone to pitch genuine-sounding investment opportunities.

• Investment seminars: Seniors are lured into an educational seminar, which often includes a free lunch or coffee. The seminars are usually sales pitches for "exciting" and "lucrative" investment opportunities. The elderly often feel obligated and pressured to invest because they have accepted the lunch or coffee.

Rather, purchase some instructional DVDs to learn the game during your down time throughout the week. Many golfers don't have time to hit the links during the week, but they do have time to

home from work. Such instructional DVDs can help you master your grip and stance, which you can then take with you to the course over the weekend.

\* Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links, and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.

## DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN **BE PAR FOR THE COURSE**

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.

4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with

3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds.
