ALBERTA RCMP AND AMA JOIN FORCES FOR THE #ROOMTOWORK CAMPAIGN

The Alberta RCMP and the Alberta Motor Association (AMA) have partnered together for the #RoomToWork campaign. The campaign's goal is to decrease the number of motorists who speed past emergency workers and tow operators when they are at the scene of an accident. AMA Service Vehicle Operators (SVOs) and emergency responders have had an increasing number of close calls and near misses while working at the side of the road.

The campaign kicked off today with a media event that included a mock accident scene and the RCMP pulling over motorists who failed to slow down for a friendly roadside chat about what drivers should do when they see flashing lights.

"In 2015, the RCMP and the Alberta Sheriffs handed out 662

tickets for speeding past emergency vehicles. So far this year, we've handed out nearly 400, so that is a significant increase," said RCMP Sgt. Darrin Turnbull.

Darren Klassen, an AMA SVO, had a near death experience when he had to leap out of the way of an oncoming vehicle that plowed right through the safety pylons he set out in front of the vehicle he was preparing to tow.

FOUR SUSPECTS ARRESTED IN HOME INVASION WITH A FIREARM

On July 25, 2016 at approximately 7:40 PM Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain/Enoch RCMP responded to a call of four unknown males entering a home in Spruce Grove with a firearm.

Inside the home they had confronted the homeowner, insisting that she send her two children out of the house while they conduct their business. Although one of the males had taken the cell phone of the homeowner, she was able to make contact with a family member using a tablet, asking for help.

Following the call from the family member, police surrounded the home where they soon located and arrested four men, Chad Pashko (36), John Natowcappo (28), Braden Foster (26), and Troy Beuregard (23). I it believed that two of the men are known to the homeowner, and that at no time was the general public in danger. Police also seized a firearm and a substance believed to be Methamphetamine.

All four males are now facing multiple charges including kidnaping, forcible confinement and extortion with a firearm. They have been remanded into custody and will be appearing in Stony Plain Provincial Court on August 3rd, 2016

No one was injured during the incident.

"When you see those flashing tow truck lights, it means I'm helping rescue a stranded motorist – someone who could be your friend, your neighbour or even a family member," said Klassen. "If just one person slows down, everyone behind follows – and



it makes the biggest difference. People's lives are on the line."

Brian Mason, Minister of Transportation attended the #RoomToWork media event. "In Alberta, about a quarter of all fatal collisions involves a driver travelling at an unsafe speed – and the fine for speeding doubles if motorists don't slow down when they pass an emergency vehicle with its flashing lights activated," said Minister Mason. "First responders make your safety their priority, so please make their safety your priority."

PROTECTING ALBERTANS AGAINST UNFAIR POWER BILLS

The Government of Alberta is going to court to protect Albertans from being forced to pay for the business losses of five power companies.

The companies are trying to offload their losses onto Albertans because of a deal made between the former government and Enron, a discredited and now-bankrupt U.S. electricity operator.

Albertans shouldn't have to pay for the losses of electricity companies.

This 'Enron clause' was never raised during months of public hearings that were supposed to ensure Albertans got a fair deal as their electricity system was deregulated.

And, there is evidence the Enron clause was enacted unlawfully by the previous government and then deliberately withheld from the public.

The Government is asking the court to overturn the Enron clause and protect Albertans against an estimated \$2 billion in business losses over the next four years.

If successful, any additional electricity fees charged to the public due to the Enron clause will be refunded back to Albertans.

Albertans shouldn't be on the hook for a backroom deal that allows companies to collect the profits when power prices are high and hand consumers the losses when prices are low.

RCMP SCHOOL YEAR END REPORT SHARED

St. Albert, AB - St. Albert RCMP share a Year End School Resource Officer Report with the St. Albert Public School Division, St. Albert Greater Catholic School Division, Centre Nord School Division and the Sturgeon School Division at the close of the school year. Once this report is shared with the School Divisions, the RCMP Inspector shares the report with Mayor and Council for their information. This year, St. Albert RCMP is sharing this report with the St. Albert community as a whole.

St. Albert RCMP consider youth to be an important part of the community and through the increases to policing numbers that the St. Albert Mayor and Council have approved in recent years, the police officers dedicated to working in the schools and the community doing prevention work has increased from a total of 4 officers in 2008 to a team of 1 Corporal, 4 Constables, 2 Reserve Constables and 1 Auxiliary Constable for a total of 8 in 2016.

The 2015/ 2016 School year was another successful year for the St. Albert RCMP. In addition to delivering Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) classes to all grade 6 students, Drug Awareness classes to all grade 8

Pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statues of Alberta, 2000, and amendments thereto, the Council of the Summer Village of Ross Haven hereby gives notice that their intention is to consider proposed amendments to Land Use Bylaw # 232-10. The purpose of the amendment is as follows;

Sec. 63(3)(h) Minimum Side Yard Setback page 42

The minimum side yard setback of 1 meter (3 feet) has been removed and the following applies: Any structure located closer than 8 feet (2.4 meters) from the property line will be required to comply with the High Intensity Residential Fire Regulations (HIRF). Contact Superior Safety Codes to discuss how this may affect your development.

Accessory Building

means a building which is normally subordinate to, and the use of which is incidental to that of, a principal building and which includes such buildings as a garage, storage shed and guesthouse. This structure can be up to $1\frac{1}{2}$ storeys in height with a maximum height of 22'. This height cannot exceed the height of the principal residence. If a garage is $1\frac{1}{2}$ story's in height it can include sleeping accommodation over the garage, and shall not include cooking facilities or a kitchen. The maximum height of 22' and the height of the principal residence shall be measured from grade to the peak of the roof.

As many of the social media problems revolve around inappropriate comments or photos being taken without permission, the School Resource Officer can help the youth articulate their concerns and mediate with the person causing the problem without these matters becoming official police investigations. Any parents in St. Albert will know how quickly these problems can crop up for youth and how much of the day can be devoted to helping young people navigate the challenges they face as they grow up. The School Resource Officers are very busy working with youth, but find the work rewarding as most young people are able to transition to adulthood safely when guided by the team of their parents, the schools, the police and the community.

St. Albert RCMP look forward to the 2016/ 2017 School year and the new and continuing positive, professional relationships they will have with the schools, the youth and their parents. Watch your school web page to see your School Resource or DARE officer.





PALLIATIVE CARE IN CANADA

All Canadians should have access to high quality palliative care. Bill C-277, 'An Act Providing for the Development of a Framework on Palliative Care in Canada' was introduced by my Conservative colleague, MP Marilyn Gladu, in the House on May 30th. With the recent assisted dying legislation, Canadians now need palliative care more than ever to offer them a viable choice for their end of life care. This Bill will do just that. C-277, when passed, will close the Palliative Care Gap in Canada.

Bill C-277 is recognized by various healthcare and stakeholder groups as being an urgent and important piece of legislation. It will directly help implement a framework for palliative care in Canada, including the definition of services included; required training; and most importantly, measures to ensure consistent access to palliative care across the Country. This bill recommends evaluating the advisability of amending the Canada Health Act to include palliative care as a covered service.

During the previous session of parliament, the 'All-Parliamentary Committee on Palliative and Compassionate Care' brought forward numerous recommendations that are now captured in this Bill.

I strongly believe that having access to quality palliative care would enable one to choose to live as well as they can, for as long as they can.

Protecting Alberta Lands

Tickets for public land offences will range from \$100 to \$500.

Alberta is known for its vast, beautiful land - and it's important we take the steps to protect it.

Starting August 6, 2016, tickets with specified fine penalties can be issued on the spot for irresponsible off-highway vehicle use, damage and destruction to fish or wildlife habitat and inappropriate waste disposal.

These tickets are another tool for enforcement personnel, who may also issue written warnings, require the person(s) responsible to repair any damage they caused or compel the person(s) responsible to appear in court.

IDENTITY THEFT ARREST LEADS TO SEARCH WARRANT

St. Albert, AB - On July 15, 2016, at approximately 1:30 p.m., St. Albert RCMP received a report of a possible Identity Theft incident at the Walmart store in St. Albert. It is alleged that a man used stolen identification documents belonging to a St. Albert resident to apply for a

credit card at the Walmart store. The identification documents are alleged to have been stolen from a St. Albert residence that had been broken into during the day on July 13, 2016.

The man was arrested and a search warrant of his car located a small quantity of drugs and more identification documents belonging to 3 other people, all St. Albert residents that are alleged to be stolen from their parked vehicles earlier this

week

The St. Albert RCMP investigation continued and on July 17, 2016, St. Albert RCMP conducted a second search warrant on a property in the Forest Lawn area of St. Albert. 1 male adult. 2 female adults and 1 female under the age of 18 were arrested from this home. A small quantity of drugs and at least 25 items that are believed to be stolen property was seized by RCMP. The seized property included identification documents, electronics and jewelry.

As this investigation is ongoing, some charges have been sworn and some are still being processed.





MARIJUANA

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

The Liberals have created a task force to study the legalization of marijuana. Within five months this task force will have to assess the potential legal, financial, moral and medical ramifications of legalizing the drug.

At the recent Conservative Policy Convention, we passed a resolution stating, "...in order to expand the means which law enforcement authorities have at their disposal to combat drugs and their negative impacts, particularly among young people, and to reduce the volume of judicial proceedings, we recommend that peace officers be enabled to issue tickets for simple possession of small quantities of marijuana."

Our policy resolution is in line with recommendations from the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police on the marijuana file. They support providing front-line officers the ability to ticket individuals found with 30 grams of marijuana or less. The Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police do not recommend the legalization of marijuana.

As a former RCMP officer, I have serious concerns about a number of issues regarding the Liberal's promise to legalize marijuana. How are the Liberals going to address the current proliferation of illegal, unregulated marijuana dispensaries (in Vancouver, there are currently more illegal marijuana dispensaries than Starbucks locations)? How will they address the public safety issue of people driving and operating heavy equipment while high, or ensure that marijuana is kept out of the hands of children? Will they balance our international obligations regarding the legality of marijuana?

I do not have confidence in the Liberals to put forward a plan to legalize marijuana that will adequately address all of these serious concerns. Justin Trudeau and the Liberals have made a complete mess of the marijuana issue by their failure to provide any policy coherence whatsoever.



DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:



Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.

4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.

3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds.

5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

FIVE TOP GOLF TIPS TO HELP BOOST YOUR GAME

(NC) When it comes to golf, it's the little things that can have the biggest impact on your game. Whether it's your first attempt, or 10th season, golf expert Bob Weeks has got you covered at the links this summer with these five tips:

Choose the right clubs: Regardless of your experience or skill level, choosing the right equipment can be the difference between duffing it and striking the ball straight down the fairway. It's important to work with a professional to get the clubs best-suited to your game and then, to have them custom fit. You should be fit for the length, loft, lie angle, shaft flex and even the grip size. If your clubs aren't custom fit, it will be like walking around in shoes that are the wrong size.

Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally twopiece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or fourpiece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.

Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round. 
