FOUR SUSPECTS ARRESTED IN HOME INVASION WITH A FIREARM

On July 25, 2016 at approximately 7:40 PM Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain/Enoch RCMP responded to a call of four unknown males entering a home in Spruce Grove with a firearm.

Inside the home they had confronted the homeowner, insisting that she send her two children out of the house while they conduct their business. Although one of the males had taken the cell phone of the homeowner, she was able to make contact with a family member using a tablet, asking for help.

Following the call from the family member, police surrounded the home where they soon located and arrested four men, Chad Pashko (36), John Natowcappo (28), Braden Foster (26), and Troy Beuregard (23). I it believed that two of the men are known to the homeowner.

and that at no time was the general public in danger. Police also seized a firearm and a substance believed to be Methamphetamine

All four males are now facing multiple charges including kidnaping, forcible confinement and extortion with a firearm. They have been remanded into custody and will be appearing in Stony Plain Provincial Court on August 3rd, 2016

No one was injured during the incident.




CARVEL CHAMP WARNS KIDS ABOUT "MEAN MACHINES"

SECOND READING OF 'THE FAIRNESS IN CHARITABLE GIFTS ACT'

Member of Parliament for Provencher, Ted Falk's Private Members Bill - C-239 - 'The Fairness in Charitable Gifts Act', would have allowed registered charities to provide their donors with the same generous donation receipts that politicians can now issue. Unfortunately, on June 8th the Liberal and New Democrat Members of Parliament voted against this bill ensuring its demise.

On June 7th, I spoke in the House of Commons on this bill and below are a few excerpts

"The bill before us is a great bill for all members of the House and their ridings. It would help every riding in this country. The depth and scope of the non-profit and voluntary sector in Alberta has provided a wide variety of services to the communities. Non-profit and volunteer organizations touch virtually all aspects of our communities."

"I do not think anything could be clearer than what has transpired in Fort McMurray, Alberta, in the last month. Donations flooded into charities from across Canada. Hotels opened their doors, and people donated personal money, food, rations, and gas."

"Bill C-239 is a great initiative to level the playing field. The primary motivation for donating is the compassion and personal belief of most people."

"It is very interesting to note how Canadians pulled together in all parts of this country to support services in their communities. It is the generosity of donors that makes these agencies work, such as the Red Cross, animal shelters, senior centres, and

community groups."

It is sad that C-239 did not pass Second Reading. It would have put receipts for charities and political donations on an even playing field. Unfortunately, on June 8th the Liberal and New Democrat Members of Parliament voted against this bill. Bill C-239 would have given more money to those who need it and less to those who do not. I firmly believe that if we had a fair tax exemption program, as this bill was asking for, people would give more generously. Charities are suffering, and they need donations in order to operate.

PROTECTING ALBERTANS AGAINST UNFAIR POWER BILLS

The Government of Alberta is going to court to protect Albertans from being forced to pay for the business losses of five power companies.

The companies are trying to offload their losses onto Albertans because of a deal made between the former government and Enron, a discredited and now-bankrupt U.S. electricity operator.

Albertans shouldn't have to pay for the losses of electricity companies.

This 'Enron clause' was never raised during months of public hearings that were supposed to ensure Albertans got a fair deal as their electricity system was deregulated.

And, there is evidence the Enron clause was enacted unlawfully by the previous government and then deliberately withheld from the public.

The Government is asking the court to overturn the Enron clause and protect Albertans against an estimated \$2 billion in business losses over the next four years.

If successful, any additional electricity fees charged to the public due to the Enron clause will be refunded back to Albertans.

Albertans shouldn't be on the hook for a backroom deal that allows companies to collect the profits when power prices are high and hand consumers the losses when prices are low.

That's why the Government of Alberta is taking legal action – to protect Albertans.

Tickets for public land offences will range from \$100 to \$500.

Alberta is known for its vast, beautiful land - and it's important we take the steps to protect it.

Starting August 6, 2016, tickets with specified fine penalties can be issued on the spot for irresponsible off-highway vehicle use, damage and destruction to fish or wildlife habitat and inappropriate waste disposal.

These tickets are another tool for enforcement personnel, who may also issue written warnings, require the person(s) responsible to repair any damage they caused or compel the person(s) responsible to appear in court.

Bylaw 06.16 Public Hearing – A Public Hearing was held to rezone a property adjacent to Long Lake from Rural District (RD) to County Residential District (CR) as this zoning will fit the zoning of the adjacent residential properties. This bylaw will be brought back to council for second reading.





SAFE SUMMER WEEKENDS

Many Albertans like to take advantage of the long summer evenings and warmer weather to get outdoors, go traveling or visit with family and friends. Weekends and celebrations can be fun for Albertans of all ages.

If you, your friends or family are planning on using alcohol as part of your celebratory gatherings, there are some things you can do to help keep you and those around you safe.

Drinking alcohol is not risk-free. Experts have set low-risk drinking guidelines to help limit the risks of alcohol including what constitutes as a standard drink.

Men should avoid drinking more than three standard drinks in a day and 15 in a week, while women should limit consumption to two drinks in a day and 10 in a week. Be sure to have non-drinking days as part of your weekly routine, and on special occasions reduce your risk of injury and harm by drinking more than three (women) or four (men) drinks in a night.

The following common drinks contain equal amounts of alcohol and are often referred to as a drink or a standard drink:

• One mixed drink containing 43 mL (1.5 fl oz) of 40 percent hard liquor, such as vodka, gin, rye whiskey, or rum

• One 142 mL (5 fl oz) glass of 12 per cent wine

• One 341 mL (12 fl oz) bottle of 5 per cent beer or wine cooler.

Choosing to not drink is okay, but if you do decide to drink, here are a few tips to help reduce health and safety risks:

- There are many situations when alcohol should be avoided entirely, like if you are pregnant or breastfeeding. Don't drink if you're planning on driving or using heavy machinery, if you're working or expected to make important decisions, or if you're responsible for other's safety.
- Those living with physical or mental health problems

should also avoid alcohol, or if you're taking certain medications.

- It's important to teach young people about the risks associated with alcohol, as well. If you are the parent of a youth, be sure to have a conversation with your teen about drinking and its effects.
- There are a variety of ways to help reduce your alcohol consumption this summer, or any season. Set limits for yourself before you decide to drink, taking your age, gender, body size and health into consideration when deciding on your limits. Eating before and while you're drinking and alternating between alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages is also a good idea.
- Also, remember to support others in their decisions to reduce alcohol intake. Offer alternative beverages for family or friends who don't drink alcohol or are trying to cut back on their use. If you're concerned, you can talk to a health care professional about strategies to reduce your use.

PROVINCE FUNDS SUPPORTIVE HOUSING IN CALGARY

The Alberta government is investing \$4 million for permanent supportive housing for Albertans with disabilities.

Construction is expected to begin this summer on the site of Accessible Housing's Fourth Dimension Group Home. Once complete, the new building will offer 45 units of barrier-free accessible housing with 24-hour, onsite supports for individuals with disabilities or limited mobility, many of whom are currently in hospitals or otherwise in need of supportive housing.

"Every Albertan deserves to live with dignity and opportunities to thrive at home and in their communities. Our government's housing investment ensures that Albertans with disabilities have a safe and supportive place to call home."

"Through significant capital investments in building more affordable housing and renewing existing housing, our government is creating safe places for Albertans to call home and jobs in the construction sector."

The new building will be operated by Accessible Housing, a Calgary-based, not-for-profit organization supporting individuals with limited mobility. Construction is expected to be complete by fall 2017.

The \$4-million investment supplements a \$9.3-million philanthropic contribution from the RESOLVE campaign, a Calgary fundraising collaboration of nine agencies to support the building of affordable and supported rental housing for the homeless and other vulnerable Albertans. The provincial investment is part of \$1.1 billion in funding for housing in the 2015-18 Capital Plan.

STAY SAFE IN SUMMER WEATHER

Summer is made for BBQs, outdoor sports, and relaxing on the deck. It's a time where most Albertans spend as many hours as possible outside enjoying the warm weather. As temperatures soar, it is important to keep a few things in mind as you head outdoors.

Though most people can handle moderate summer weather without issue, even healthy Albertans need to keep heat safety in mind during warmer months. When temperatures are high, make sure to take frequent breaks from the heat, spending some time indoors at home, or in a cooled public building—like a mall or indoor pool. Ensure that sunscreen of at least SPF 30 is applied 20 minutes before heading outdoors (be sure the product blocks both UVA and UVB rays), and reapply frequently. Rescheduling outdoor activities to cooler hours of the

day is also smart way to beat the heat.

When spending time outdoors, what you wear makes a big difference in keeping your body cool. If you know you will be out in the heat, light colored clothing is suggested. A widebrimmed hat and sunglasses (with a UVA/UVB CSA- certified seal) along with long sleeves and pants can help protect you from the sun's rays. ALBERTA RCMP AND AMA JOIN FORCES FOR THE #ROOMTOWORK CAMPAIGN

Edmonton, AB - The Alberta RCMP and the Alberta Motor Association (AMA) have partnered together for the #Room-ToWork campaign. The campaign's goal is to decrease the number of motorists who speed past emergency workers and tow

operators when they are at the scene of an accident. AMA Service Vehicle Operators (SVOs) and emergency responders have had an increasing number of close calls and near misses while working at the side of the road.

The campaign kicked off today with a media event that included a mock accident scene and the RCMP pulling over motorists who failed to slow down for a friendly roadside chat about what drivers should do when they see flashing lights.

"In 2015, the RCMP and the Alberta Sheriffs handed out 662 tickets for speeding past emergency vehicles. So far this year, we've handed out nearly 400, so that is a significant increase," said RCMP Sgt. Darrin Turn-


Darren Klassen, an AMA SVO, had a near death experience when he had to leap out of the way of an oncoming vehicle that plowed right through the safety pylons he set out in front of the vehicle he was preparing

"When you see those flashing tow truck lights, it means I'm helping rescue a stranded motorist - someone who could be your friend, your neighbour or even a family member," said Klassen. "If just one person slows down, everyone behind follows - and it makes the biggest difference. People's lives are on the line."

Brian Mason, Minister of Transportation attended the #RoomToWork media event. "In Alberta, about a quarter of all fatal collisions involves a driver travelling at an unsafe speed and the fine for speeding doubles if motorists don't slow down when they pass an emergency vehicle with its flashing lights activated," said Minister Mason. "First responders make your safety their priority, so please make their safety your priority."

DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries: Side bending stretch

- 1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.
- 2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.
- 3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.
- 4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

- 1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.
- 2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds.
5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

FIVE TOP GOLF TIPS TO HELP BOOST YOUR GAME

(NC) When it comes to golf, it's the little things that can have the biggest impact on your game. Whether it's your first attempt, or 10th season, golf expert Bob Weeks has got you covered at the links this summer with these five tips:

Choose the right clubs: Regardless of your experience or skill level, choosing the right equipment can be the difference between duffing it and striking the ball straight down the fairway. It's important to work with a professional to get the clubs best-suited to your game and then, to have them custom fit. You should be fit for the length, loft, lie angle, shaft flex and even the grip size. If your clubs aren't custom fit, it will be like

walking around in shoes that are the wrong size.

Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally twopiece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or fourpiece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.


Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be

considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round.
