## LEDUC RCMP INVESTIGATING TWO DEATHS

Members of the Leduc RCMP detachment with the assistance of the RCMP's Major Crimes Unit from Edmonton are investigating the deaths of a man and a woman who were found deceased within their residence. The matter was

Initial evidence suggests that the deaths were not the result of any random criminal activity nor the consequence of any action by an unknown individual. Police can confirm that they are not seeking anyone in connection to this incident and that there is no risk to public safety.



#### THEFT FROM A DEEP FREEZE



## ALBERTA RCMP AND AMA JOIN FORCES FOR THE #ROOMTOWORK CAMPAIGN

Edmonton, AB - The Alberta RCMP and the Alberta Motor Association (AMA) have partnered together for the #Room-ToWork campaign. The campaign's goal is to decrease the number of motorists who speed past emergency workers and tow operators when they are at the scene of an accident. AMA Service Vehicle Operators (SVOs) and emergency responders have had an increasing number of close calls and near misses while working at the side of the road.

The campaign kicked off today with a media event that included a mock accident scene and the RCMP pulling over motorists who failed to slow down for a friendly roadside chat about what drivers should do when they see flashing lights.

"In 2015, the RCMP and the Alberta Sheriffs handed out 662 tickets for speeding past emergency vehicles. So far this year, we've handed out nearly 400, so that is a significant increase," said RCMP Sgt. Darrin Turnbull.



Darren Klassen, an AMA SVO, had a near death experience when he had to leap out of the way of an oncoming vehicle that plowed right through the safety pylons he set out in front of the vehicle he was preparing to tow.

"When you see those flashing tow truck lights, it means I'm helping rescue a stranded motorist – someone who could be your friend, your neighbour or even a family member," said Klassen. "If just one person slows down, everyone behind follows – and it makes the biggest difference. People's lives are on the line."

Brian Mason, Minister of Transportation attended the #RoomToWork media event. "In Alberta, about a quarter of all fatal collisions involves a driver travelling at an unsafe speed – and the fine for speeding doubles if motorists don't slow down when they pass an emergency vehicle with its flashing lights activated," said Minister Mason. "First responders make your safety their priority, so please make their safety your priority."

## FIRST NATIONS FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY ACT (FNFTA)

I am disappointed to learn that the Government will be reinstating transfer payments to band councils that did not publicly disclose the salaries of Chiefs and Band Councillors as was required by the First Nations Financial Transparency Act (FN-FTA). The FNFTA is seen as an important measure for indigenous peoples living on reserves to hold their band leadership to account.

The Honourable Carolyn Bennet, Minister of Indigenous Affairs, announced on December 18th that the Government will be reinstating all funds that were frozen for non-compliance with the FNFTA as well as halting compliance measures that would require bands to post financial information online. Presently, 38 of 581 First Nations bands had yet to file the required financial information. The FNFTA is an important piece of legislation

that our Government brought in to ensure that there was accountability and transparency surrounding funding to be used on reserves.

What the Liberals are doing is a step backwards for transparency for all Canadians. Our Conservative government supported this legislation because it is based on the premise that all Canadians deserve accountability and transparency from their leadership. First Nations governments operating under the In-

dian Act had been the only level of government in Canada that was not obligated to make basic financial information public.

This move by the Liberal government would only leave First Nations people in the dark about how their elected leaders spend public money. Aboriginal people deserve to know where the money in their communities go. After all, this is public funding.

## (E.I.A) RCMP APPREHEND MAN AT THE EDMONTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Leduc, Alberta – This afternoon, members of the RCMP detachment at the Edmonton International Airport apprehended a man after he had gained access to the airfield by climbing a fence.

The initial report was that a lone man climbed the fence at the south west side of the airfield at approximately 1:20 P.M., and exited the area by going under the fence on the south side of the

airfield shortly afterward.

The RCMP responded quickly to the report and, with the assistance of the RCMP's Police Dog Services, apprehended the man. No one was harmed during this incident nor was there an impact upon the flights and passengers utilizing the E.I.A.

No additional details are available at this time as the investigation is ongoing. Should new information pertaining to any criminal charges become available, an update will be provided.

These tickets are another tool for enforcement personnel, who may also issue written warnings, require the person(s) responsible to repair any damage they caused or compel the person(s) responsible to appear in court.

## The Government of Alberta is going to court to protect Albertans from being forced to pay for the business losses of five power companies.

## ANNUAL COMMERCIAL VEHICLE INSPECTION OPERATION SEES ONLY 34 PER CENT OF VEHICLES PASS

Leduc County, Alberta – Leduc County Enforcement Services, in conjunction with other enforcement agencies, conducted their annual inspection operation of commercial vehicles in Nisku on June 29 and 30.

Over the course of the two-day event, 104 inspections were observed with 35 (34 per cent) commercial vehicles passing inspection,

40 (39 per cent) being taken out of service and another 29 (27 per cent) requiring attention. Vehicles were inspected based on the Level 1 Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance Inspection criteria, a North American standard inspection for all commercial traffic.

"It is concerning to see less than half of the vehicles inspected over the two-day period pass the inspection," said Leduc County Peace Officer Joel McDonald. "We hope to see this number increase in the future and implore businesses to ensure their commercial vehicles are compliant with the safety criteria outlined by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance."

In total, 246 ticketable offences were noted and 33 violation tickets were issued.

Agencies involved in the commercial inspection operation included: Leduc County Enforcement Services, City of Grand Prairie Enforcement Services, Red Deer County Patrol Division, Flagstaff County Enforcement Services, Wetaskiwin County Enforcement Services, Strathcona County Enforcement Services, City of Edmonton Community Standards Enforcement, Edmonton Police Service, City of Leduc Municipal Integrated Traffic Services, Commercial Vehicle Enforcement – Leduc and Town of Beaumont Enforcement Services.

## RECORD YEAR FOR LRC'S ANNUAL SPRING FITNESS 50/50 CHALLENGE

The City of Leduc has wrapped up its most successful Spring Fitness 50/50 Challenge to date at the Leduc Recreation Centre (LRC) and awarded Janelle Strandberg the grand prize trip for two to Vancouver

"We had an incredibly successful LRC Spring Fitness 50/50 Chal-

lenge this year with a total of 674 registered participants," said Lee Ann Weller, recreation services manager with the City of Leduc. "We gave away some great prizes throughout the entire challenge to encourage our patrons to keep striving for the 50-day goal."

## LEDUC RCMP LAY CHARGES AFTER FIREARMS SEIZURE

Leduc AB - On July 13th, 2016 Leduc RCMP attended a residence in the City of Leduc to assist Leduc Regional Child and Family Services with an Apprehension Order. As a result of further information obtained during the course of this investigation, Leduc RCMP obtained a subsequent search warrant for the residence. Numerous weapons were seized from the home; including prohibited firearms (e.g. a sawed-off shotgun), restricted and prohibited handguns, other rifles, other shotguns and ammunition. Arrest warrants were issued for the homeowners, and on July 15th, 2016 at

approximately 10:00 A.M. an adult male and female who cannot be named in accordance with the Child, Youth and Family Enhancement Act to protect the identities of children in the home, were arrested and taken into custody. Charges at this time include Possession of a Prohibited/ Restricted firearm, Careless storage of a firearm, and a Breach of a Re-

cognizance. The accused persons remain in custody and are awaiting a bail hearing. Leduc Regional Family Child and Family Services have taken two children into their care and continue to investigate the original complaint in this matter.


