FLOWERS KEEP GOING MISSING IN WILDWOOD

Since early June 2016, several flowers have gone missing from containers that are part of the



Hamlet beautification done by Yellowhead County.

The thefts first occurred sometime between June 6 and June 10, 2016, and have been a regular occurrence since that time.

Yellowhead County staff, who plant and maintain the flowers in the Hamlet of Wildwood, noticed the theft of the flowers during routine maintenance.

The plants are always gone, not just ripped out and left behind. It is assumed that they are being transplanted since they are dug up carefully without leaving any damaged plants behind

or damaging the stolen plants. Plants continue to go missing and have been taken up until the end of July.

The missing plants are as follows:

- 30 x Calibrachoa various colours (red, soft pink, orange, yellow, purple)
 - 3 x Rudbeckia
 - 2 x Bidens (orange)
- 1 x Begonia



FEDERAL INMATE UNLAWFULLY AT LARGE UPDATE #1

Maskwacis, AB- RCMP have obtained a Canada Wide warrant for the arrest of 54 year old Darrell Moosomin. Moosomin had been a serving prisoner at the PE SAKASTEW Federal Prison in Hobbema for convictions dating back to 1995. Moosomin was serving an indeterminate sentence for several violent offences including aggravated assault, forcible confinement, and uttering threats. Moosomin is a dangerous offender, having been declared so in December of 2008. Moosomin had been

granted permission to attend the Samson Pow-Wow escorted by an Elder, when he was able to walk away. Moosomin has no known family or friends in the area and is originally from Saskatchewan (Mosquito Lake). Moosomin's intended destination is unknown. If you should encounter Moosomin or have information regarding his whereabouts, please contact police immediately. Police would ask the public not to approach Moosomin.



TIPS FOR NEWCOMERS TO THE GAME OF GOLF

Few hobbies can be as enjoyable one moment and as frustrating the next as golf. Golfers know a great putt can be quickly followed by a bad tee shot, and maintaining their composure through the highs and lows of the game is a key to success on the links.

Maintaining that composure isn't always easy, even for the professionals. * Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links, and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.

As kids approach school age, don't overlook the nearby putt-putt or miniature golf range as a valuable teaching tool. Miniature golf clubs are small enough for many children to use comfortably, and kids can use miniature golf courses as a place to put any lessons or advice on putting to good use. What's more, a miniature golf course is more than just golf, with creative courses and other fun activities, so kids won't feel overwhelmed with golf.

When kids move on from preschool to elementary school, some might want to tag along with Mom or Dad to the driving range. who are enjoying the game of golf can take advantage of the driving range if they haven't already begun to. A driving range typically has markers that indicate the distance of a regular hole, regardless of which tee you will play from on an actual golf course. Kids can aim for holes at shorter distances to learn how far their drives are going. You can then adjust the lessons you teach your children based on how far youngsters can drive the ball.

As a child gets closer to high school, you might want to buy the child his or her own set of clubs. Look for inexpensive clubs (oftentimes, thrift stores or other secondhand retailers have clubs for sale) because growing children will eventually grow out of their first set of clubs. When your child finds a set of clubs that suits him or her, teach the proper way to swing and consider signing up your son or daughter for lessons. Those first few lessons can prove invaluable, turning a pastime into a passion kids will carry with them throughout their lives.
