# GRANT AVAILABLE TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES TO PROMOTE FARM SAFETY EDUCATION

Agricultural roots run deep in Alberta. While history reminds us of settlement in the west from the fur trade and the oil industry, it is agriculture that brought settlement to Alberta in the first place. It is rare to find a second or third generation Albertan without farming roots in their background somewhere. The communities in the constituency of Leduc-Beaumont, just like so many others in the province grew up around farms and the people who built them.

Over 285 Agricultural Societies in

Alberta have played a critical role in the development of rural Alberta, promoting rural life and sharing agricultural innovation and best practices among farmers and communities. They do everything from hosting local farm fair days to supporting local swimming pools and playgrounds to running camps so that city kids can experience farm life.

In the constituency of Leduc-Beaumont, the Beaumont & District Agricultural Society (BA-DAS) and New Sarepta Agricultural Society are active throughout the county. Recently, BADAS held a rural roots fair in on August 7 & 8 and the New Sarepta Demolition Derby

is coming up September 11. I know there are many other Ag societies throughout the region that work hard to inform, educate and connect communities as well.

Ag Societies in Alberta also promote and educate about agriculture and about farm safety. I'm very happy to help spread the word that the Alberta Association of Agricultural Societies (AAAS) has announced a new grant program for Ag Societies. This new grant program is specifically designed to fund programs about farm safety – to raise awareness, to educate and to support programming.

#### RCMP INVESTIGATE SEXUAL ASSAULT NEAR OMNIPLEX

Members of the Drayton Valley RCMP Detachment responded to a report of a woman having been attacked and sexually assault on the trail system near the Omniplex in Drayton Valley at approximately 10:30 P.M. on the evening of Wednesday, August 10, 2016.

The 18-year-old woman was walking along the trail when she was grabbed by a lone male and dragged into nearby bushes where she was sexually assaulted by him. After the assault the suspect fled the scene and the woman was able to call police. She was taken to the hospital where she received treatment and released.

The male is described as fol-

lows:

- Larger physical build;
- Dressed in black clothes;
- · Wore a black mask and gloves. The investigation by the Drayton Valley RCMP Detachment is ongoing and police are looking for the public's assistance in solving this crime. # SAFETY ISSUES DRIVE POTENTIAL PILOT PROJECT ON HWY 2 IN LEDUC

Four deaths in three years and 218 incidents on a 6 km stretch of highway running through Leduc has raised significant safety concerns at the City of Leduc for its emergency first responders, as well as travellers along Highway 2.

The city has proposed a two-year pilot project for automated traffic enforcement (photo radar) on Highway 2 through Leduc from Airport Road to the weigh scales. The request was submitted to the

Solicitor General's Office and the city is currently awaiting a decision.

"This is a controversial issue—we recognize that. However, the safety of others will always supersede any ideas the public has of us padding our bottom line," says Leduc Mayor Greg Krischke. "The piece of Highway 2 we're focusing on is arguably one of the most dangerous portions of Highway 2 between Edmonton and Calgary, and the statistics support that."

STATISTICS

• 4 deaths in 3 years

- 218 incidents (2010 2015)
- 171 were motor vehicle collisions (MVCs)
- Over 102,000 motorists (annually) travel at excessive speeds 30 km/h over posted speed limit
- Average of 280 motorists per day travel more than 140 km/h through Leduc on Highway 2
- Leduc Community Peace Officer was struck in 2015; sideswiped by a semi/trailer when attending to help secure the scene of an MVC

If the city receives approval, the pilot project would focus on two components – excessive speeding

and speeding past emergency vehicles. It would include a three-month public awareness campaign that includes a four-week issuance of warnings in the place of tickets. The campaign would be October to December with full implementation starting in the New Year when fines would be issued. As it's something new to photo enforcement, the goal is to reduce the number of motor vehicle collisions causing injury by 25 per cent.

"Safety of our emergency service personnel and the travelling public is paramount," says Krischke.


Leduc RCMP and fire investigators continue to investigate the arson and are seeking the public's assistance to identify the male suspect.

# DROWNING UPDATE

Submitted by Leduc RCMP

Update #1: On August 9, 2016 the 24-year-old male involved in a near drowning on August 5 at the Leduc Recreation Centre succumbed to his injuries in the hospital.

The Leduc RCMP in collaboration with the Edmonton Office of the Medical Examiner continue to investigate this incident. An autopsy was held on August 10th, in order to determine the cause of death.

In accordance with the Government of Canada Privacy Act, the name of the deceased male will not be released

This incident does not appear to be suspicious, but the cause of death remains under investigation and further details are not available at this time.

Background: Leduc RCMP investigate near drowning

Today at 11:30 a.m., RCMP attended the Leduc Recreation Centre in response to a near drowning incident. Leduc Emergency Medical Services were on scene and providing medical assistance to a 24-year-old male who was unconscious and not breathing.

Thanks to the response of bystanders, the aquatics staff and Leduc EMS the male has been transported to an Edmonton hospital where he remains in critical but stable condition.

While the Leduc RCMP are actively investigating this incident it does not appear that this was a suspicious occurrence.

# RCMP CHARGE MAN IN KIDNAPPING AND THEFT OF VEHICLE INVESTIGATION

A 24-year-old Edmonton woman was lured to a residence located in a south side neighbourhood in Edmonton where her ex-boyfriend, another man and a woman pushed the victim into the back of her own vehicle and drove away. The victim was driven to an isolated location in south Edmonton where she was threatened with physical harm if she did not repay an amount of money which she owed allegedly to one of her abductors.

A 17-year-old youth from Leduc has been identified. As a matter of privacy, the RCMP will not be naming him.

Investigation into this fatality continues by the Leduc RCMP in collaboration with CP Police. Foul play does not appear to be a factor in this occurrence and consequently there will be no further updates by the RCMP.

#### BACKGROUND:

On the morning of August 1, 2016, Leduc RCMP responded to a report of human remains found by a passerby on the railroad tracks near Highway 2A and 50 Street in Leduc, Alberta. Officers arrived on scene to find a deceased adult male with injuries consistent with a train versus pedestrian collision. The Leduc RCMP were assisted in their investigation by Leduc Fire Services and CP Police Service.

Leduc RCMP believe that the collision occurred sometime after 10:00 pm Sunday evening. The identity of the deceased male is not known at the time of this release. The investigation remains ongoing.

The group then drove the victim to another location south of Edmonton before finally stopping in the parking lot of a restaurant in Leduc where the victim was able to escape from the vehicle and call police.

Upon arriving at the restaurant, members of the Leduc RCMP Detachment were able to remove the victim to safety and secure the victim's vehicle. One of the suspects was apprehended while the two other suspects fled the scene prior to the arrival of the police.

Charged with several offences relating to this incident is 30-year-old, Gregory Zinck of Edmonton. He is to appear in Provincial Court in Edmonton on Thursday, August 11 on the following charges:

- Kidnaping
- Unlawful Confinement
- Theft of Motor Vehicle
- Fail to Comply with Probation (x2)

# of vehicles placed out-of-service = 24


