CHARGES LAID AGAINST MALE PASSENGER ON FLIGHT

Leduc, Alberta – Following an investigation into a 20-year-old male causing a disturbance on a flight bound for Edmonton, charges have been laid by the RCMP. Yusuf Hassan of Edmonton has been charged with Mischief over \$5,000 under the Criminal Code of Canada, Endanger the safety or security of an aircraft and Fail to comply with aircrew, both charges under the Aeronautics Act. Hassan remains in custody and is scheduled for an appearance in Leduc Provincial Court on September 8, 2016.

This matter is now before the courts and RCMP will not provide further information relating to this investigation.

September 10 marks World Suicide Prevention Day, an internationally recognized event designed to raise awareness and dispel some of the myths related to suicide.

Suicide affects people of all ages and genders. Each year more Albertans die by suicide than motor vehicle collisions. As a result, many Albertans have been impacted by losing someone to suicide.

Suicide is a preventable tragedy that starts with learning how to recognize the signs that someone may be suicidal. Although not all people show warning signs, most suicidal people show signs of their distress. Being aware of these signs can help someone identify and talk to a person at risk.

There are many different warning signs and being aware of them is an important step in helping to prevent suicide. Talking to someone who may be suicidal does not put the idea in their head. In fact, being able to openly discuss suicide lets the person know you care and can make a difference.

Some of the suicide warning signs include:

• Talking about suicide or a plan

• Making statements about hopelessness, helplessness or worthlessness

• Showing a loss of interest in pleasurable activities

Personality changes

• Becoming cheerful after a period of depression, which may mean the individual has already made the decision to escape their problems through suicide.

Suicidal people are in pain and want their pain to end, but do not necessarily want to die. Talking about suicide provides a clearer picture of how the person feels so they can get the help they need.

4 SIMPLE WAYS TO WINTERIZE YOUR HOME

Trimming hanging branches and removing debris from their yards is one simple way homeowners can prepare their properties for winter.

Although crown molding is generally identified as trim for the area where a wall meets the ceiling, molding is used for many other home décor applications. Molding creates an appealing visual element when used at chair height along a wall, sometimes with thin vertical pieces attached to accent a wider area. Molding also serves as an attractive window cornice or as a frame for a wall-hung flat screen television or vertical mirror. The possibilities are only limited by homeowners' imaginations and finances. "Crown molding is an inexpensive approach to adding beautiful detail to your home," Woodcraft national power tool sales manager Andrew Bondi said, "and Woodcraft is the goto source for tools and supplies for molding and trim projects."

"Cutting and Installing Crown Molding," a DVD by Jim Heavey, and "Crown Molding & Trim: Install It Like a Pro!," a book by Wayne Drake, are good resources.

A miter saw, like DeWalt's 10" Single-Bevel Miter Saw, is essential for cutting crown molding joints. To make the process easier, Woodcraft recommends using a cutting jig with the miter saw - either the General Tools EZ Pro Crown King Crown Molding Jig or the Kreg Crown-Pro Miter Saw Guide that features a bonus measurement transfer angle finder. If your project involves a coped cut, Woodcraft stocks Eclipse Coping Saws and Gröz Coping Saw Frames.

"Remember to protect your eyes," product manager Jessica Douglas said. "Pick up a pair of SAS Safety Glasses before you begin your project. The lightweight glasses can be worn alone or over eyeglasses."

For all the marking and measuring necessary to prepare the molding, you will find the multipurpose Kreg Multi-Mark Marking Gauge indispensable. To fill any small gaps, Woodcraft recommends Famowood Wood Filler, along with Norton 5X Small Area Sanding Sponges for smoothing filled holes.

Once the molding is cut and

ready for fastening, use the Grex 18-gauge Green Buddy Nailer, which offers precision control and both sequential and contact trigger applications.

"If you are going to back your molding with an adhesive prior to nailing, Titebond's No-Run, No-Drip Wood Glue for molding and trim is a great product to use," said Woodcraft senior product manager Peter Collins, "especially if you are going to use a headless pinner to install trim."

Painting crown molding can be simple - blending in with the wall or ceiling color - or new color can be introduced to match furnishings or accent the overall décor.

"General Finishes Milk Paint

and Old Fashioned Milk Paint, both water-based, are available in many colors and can be mixed to create an extensive palette of custom colors," product manager Kent Harpool said. "Both brands also offer related products to produce special decorative effects, such as antiquing and distressing."

Harpool recommends Redtree Bristle Brushes or Foam Brushes for applying paint. Use Microfiber Tack Cloths to remove sanding dust before applying paint or after distressing.




Fun By The Numbers

It's that time of year again. Store shelves are stacked with back-toschool supplies and racks of summer clothes are being replaced with sweaters and long pants. Getting your child ready for the new school year includes stocking up on notebooks, binders and pencils, but there's more to making the most of the year ahead: taking care of your child's health. As the most important head-start you can give your child, beginning the year with good health is also simple with this back-to-school health check-list:

• Immunization: Ensure your child's immunizations are up-to-date for his or her age. This is especially important for kids entering kindergarten or elementary school. If your son or daughter is in Grade 5 and/or Grade 9, also watch for immunization consent forms coming home early in the school year. Remember: your signature on these forms is needed for your child to get his or her important grade 5 and/or grade 9 immunizations.

• Vision screening: Have your child's vision tested before he or she starts kindergarten (ideally by age three) and again every year, until 18 years of age. It's estimated that up to 80 per cent of learning is visual, so keeping your kid's eyes healthy goes a long way in encouraging their full learning potential. Eye exams for children up to 18 years of age are free of charge, covered by Alberta Health.

Left untreated, these problems could interfere with your child's learning.

• Dental checkup: Regular dental checkups start early! If your child hasn't had his or her teeth examined prior to starting school, now is a good time to start. Remember: good oral health is essential to good overall health. Regular checkups and cleanings help detect dental problems early, and ensure your child's teeth stay healthy for life.

• Emergency contacts: Make sure the school has up-todate emergency numbers for each of your children, including contact information for parents, physicians, etc.

• Health conditions: Ensure the school has up-to-date information about any health conditions, allergies or physical impairments your child may have. Also inform the school about any medications your child takes.

Backpack basics: Your child's backpack should fit properly and shouldn't be too heavy for him or her to carry, which means it should weigh no more than 10 to 15 per cent of your child's body weight. The backpack should have broad shoulder straps and a waist strap that keeps the bag firmly on the spine. Watch for warning signs that the bag may be too heavy, including sore shoulders or changes in posture. • Nutrition plan: Ensure your child has a healthy breakfast before heading to school in the mornings, and help him or her pack a nutritious lunch. Planning meals ahead of time and involving children in planning and preparation can make this task more manageable and fun.
