Recreation Program & Event Grant

• Registered non-profit groups will be eligible to apply for funding up to \$2000 for programs and events that provide cultural, fitness, sport and/or other recreational opportunities to the community

Arts & Recreation Initiatives Fund

• Registered non-profit groups will be eligible to apply for funding for new initiatives in recreation and culture facilities, programs and services that will have ongoing benefits to the community

On September 23rd, MP Eglinski made the following statement in the House of Commons:

"Mr. Speaker, it is great to be back with my fellow colleagues from across Canada.

Tomorrow, September 24, Parkland County in my riding of Yellowhead will be holding a grand opening ceremony for its newest park. I was extremely moved to learn that local residents voted to name this park 'Constable Chelsey Robinson Park'.

Constable Robinson, aged 25, was a member of the RCMP for only seven months when she lost her life in the line of duty. For

a member who paid the ultimate sacrifice, I am confident that the naming of this park will keep her memory close to the hearts of her family, friends, and community.

Although I am unable to attend in person, I look forward to visiting the park personally to pay my respects to the memory of Constable Robinson."


Please book your seat by Oct 5th so we can let the caterers know how much steak and chicken to prepare. There will also be a cash bar.

KEY MESSAGES FROM GYPSD'S PUBLIC BOARD MEETING

School Highlight - PGMS

Starting this school year, GYPSD's Board of Trustees is pleased to begin Public Board Meetings with different schools sharing good news or special highlights. This meeting was joined by 5 students and 3 staff from École Pine Grove School in Edson who spoke about their popular drama program as part of the school's cross-graded options. The students spoke about their enthusiasm of the junior and/or senior drama programs and the various skills and competencies they each have devel-

oped as part of the program. The school puts on a musical performance as well as participates in zone one act drama festivals. This year's musical is 'Alice in Wonderland' and rehearsals have already begun.

Help Name Our School!

Trustees approved the process for encouraging the Edson community to join in the fun to submit possible names for the new replacement school in Edson. Nomination forms will be available on the division's website or you can pick up hard copies at all Edson schools. They can be emailed to board@gypsd.ca; mailed to the Education Services Centre

c/o Nikki Gilks or can be dropped off in the yellow box at all Edson schools.

Provincial Exam News

Learning Services went over the upcoming changes to the 2016-17 Student Learning Assessments (SLAs), Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) and Diploma Exams:

- SLAs for Grade 3 are still in a pilot phase however our division was not chosen to participate in the pilot this year.
- PATs will continue to be written at the Grade 6 and 9 levels.
- Two new calculators (fx9750 G Plus & Ti-84 Plus C Silver) are now ap-

proved for use on diploma exams.

 Quick Facts sheets and Information Bulletins on both PATs and Diploma Exams will be sent home from schools if their child is expected to write one of the exams this year.

Capital Projects Update

Along with a monitoring report on completed summer maintenance projects across the division, Facility Services provided their regular update to the Board on two current capital projects in the division: the modernization project for Grande Cache Community High School (GCCHS) and the replacement school in Edson.

The GCCHS project is continues to move ahead as Phase 2 and 4 were completed and turned over to the school on September 2, 2016. The library was completed at the end of August and staff moved into the new library the first week of September. The paving was completed on September 12, 2016 with landscaping to follow. Phase 5 footings (gymnasium area) and foundation work and masonry work has started.

The A.H.Dakin/ Evergreen Replacement School project has started to see some construction work begin with a construction fence set up onsite. The site has been cleared and piles started the week of September 12, 2016 followed by foundation work. The project is scheduled for completion by June 30, 2017

In addition, a small renovation project was started over the summer to the student and staff gathering areas, as well as the installation of new washrooms at Grand Trunk High School in Evansburg.

Other News in Brief

- Transportation Services presented their report on school start-up routes and bus safety information. The division currently transports 2,640 students. Director Gail Prokopchuk also reminded the Board that School Bus Safety Week is October 17-21, 2016. The full transportation report can be read on the division's website.
- Ongoing supports and services focused on literacy development greatly assists GYPSD in meeting their goal of one year's growth for every student each school year. The division's literacy plan for the 2016-17 school year includes a division-wide testing protocol for both reading and writing assessments; strategies to improve literacy struggles across different subject areas and continuing to support literacy interventions.
- A preliminary look at the fourth quarter Statement of Revenue and Expenses for year ending August 31, 2016 indicates that the expected deficit may be slightly lower than expected.



COUNTY MAKES \$5 MILLION REVENUE-SHARING CONTRIBUTION TO EDSON

The mayors of Yellowhead County and the Town of Edson signed a new Revenue Sharing Agreement on August 5, 2016, in Edson, Alberta and the Town of Edson was recently presented with a cheque for \$5,033,681 for this year.

The revenue sharing payment to the Town of Edson of just over \$5 million is a voluntary payment made by Yellowhead County and is to: help share the costs for services that are used by ratepayers across municipal boundaries; and ensure long-term stability, mutual benefit, and quality of life for all stakeholders. This is in addition to the \$2 million that Yellowhead County contributes towards services provided by the Town of Edson such as the operation of the Edson Airport, the Galloway Museum, the Edson Landfill and Recycling Services, Family and Community Support Services

(FCSS), and other programs that are available to County residents within Edson.

Yellowhead County realizes that the Town of Edson contributes to the quality of life in the area by providing a service hub for some of the social, recreational and cultural support that is required in the region and is vital to the local industrial sector for its continued operations and growth.

The Town of Hinton received \$1,946,904 million in revenue sharing from Yellowhead County and another \$2 million for cost-sharing for fire services, waste management services, FCSS, and community recreation based services for 2016.

Yellowhead County continues to work with the towns of Edson and Hinton, as well as Parkland County, to help share in the costs for services that impact ratepayers across municipal boundaries, ensure long-term stability, mutual benefit, and quality of life for all stakeholders.

The Revenue Sharing Agreement is a formula based agreement that takes into account the amount of industrial activity within Yellowhead's County's jurisdiction surrounding each town. Both towns have received incrementally larger annual revenue-sharing payment amounts over the past nine years.

Frequently Asked Revenue and Cost Sharing Questions:

Does the County fund other initiatives in the Town?

The County cost-shares on the operating and capital costs for many programs and services that County residents and industry utilize. Cost-sharing agreements are in place for Airport Operations, Recreation and Culture, Recycling and Landfill Operations, and Family & Community Support Services.

How much money does the County contribute toward revenue and cost sharing annually?

In 2016, Yellowhead County will pay approximately \$11 million in both Revenue and Cost Share funding to these municipalities.

What is the duration of this agreement?

This revised agreement will start with the first annual payment in 2016 and will conclude at the end of 2020 for the agreement with the Town of Edson.

Why is the agreement timeframe so long?

The Councils decided on a longterm time frame to allow financial stability and consistency to the funding model to allow the Towns to plan long term future initiatives knowing that the revenue source is somewhat stable and consistent year to year.

Can this agreement be terminated?

The agreement can be terminated under a few different circumstances: 1) If the Province changes legislation or regulations

that negatively affect the revenues of the County, 2) if the Town pursues amalgamation or dissolution without the support of the County, or 3) if either party terminates the agreement by giving notice.

Where does this money come from?

As over 85% of the County's assessment base comes from non-residential assessments, it was decided that any revenue sharing formula would only be applied to the non-residential tax base and not the residential and farmland tax base.

How is the amount decided?

The agreement is formula-based and is allocated only to the non-residential assessment base. The dollar value generated by this formula is then divided by the percentage of the non-residential assessment in and around the town's service areas.

ATTEMPTED THEFT OF VEHICLE/SHOTS FIRED

Wabamun Alberta -On Monday September 12th, 2016 at approximately 7:00 AM the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP responded to a complaint in which two unknown persons had attempted to steal a truck and travel trailer from a residence in Wabamun. An an-

ti-theft device prevented the vehicle from leaving the area. It is believed that one of the suspects fired a handgun in the direction of the victim's home during this offence.

No one was injured.

Video surveillance footage of this offence was provided to the police right away and may provide important evidence in identifying and charging the 2 suspects.

The video has also been re-

leased on social media. The RCMP would like to remind people that the police do release video and still images once all other efforts to identify offenders have been exhausted. Dissemination of video without the authorization of the police can seriously compromise the police's ability to preserve evidence, and identify offenders. Although most social media groups have good intentions in posting videos for public viewing, the effects on a

case are not known in the early stages of an investigation.

Preference will be given to those contractors that submit their company safety program including safe work practices and up to date equipment maintenance records.



HOW TO PREPARE A HOME FOR ELDERLY RESIDENTS

· Convert a room on the first floor into a bedroom. While this may not apply to all seniors, some men and women struggle with stairs as they age, and that can make it difficult for them to fully participate in a household. Homeowners with an extra room to spare can convert a room on the first floor of their homes into a bedroom so seniors won't have to climb up and down stairs throughout the day. That ease of accessibility to the primary floor of the house encourages seniors to be active participants in a household.

If possible, choose an area that is close to a first-floor bathroom.

• Take steps to make bathrooms safer. The National Institute on Aging says that more than one in three seniors over age 65 fall each year, and 80 percent of those falls take place in the bathroom. Slippery tile floors can make it difficult for seniors to navigate bathrooms safely, and bathtubs and shower stalls present additional challenges. Install

grab bars on bathroom walls and next to toilets to provide support. In addition, consider installing a shower chair or bench and removable shower nozzle in the shower or tub so seniors can sit down while they bathe and rinse without having to stand up on slippery surfaces. Make sure any mats around bathtubs and sinks are nonskid to reduce the risk of falls even further.

· Install an extra phone line or two. While kids and adults between the ages of 18 and 50 may never use the landlines in their homes, many seniors still rely on traditional telephones as their primary means of communicating with the outside world. Install extra landlines in your home, including in seniors' bedrooms, so they can more readily access the phone should they fall and need to call for emergency help. Phones in seniors' bedrooms may


also provide some additional privacy to seniors who don't want to carry on phone conversations in busy areas of the home, such as the kitchen or living room. Such lines may also reduce feelings of isolation.

Prioritize accessibility when storing items. When storing groceries, books, magazines, or other items seniors are likely to use, choose locations that are accessible to seniors. Avoid storing items on the top shelf of pantries, bookcases or entertainment centers, as seniors with limited mobility may not be able to reach them.
