RESIDENTS OF YELLOWHEAD HAVE SPOKEN

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, today released the survey results of his householder on electoral reform.

Of 1,903 responses from 1,042 households, 95% of residents want the Government to hold a referendum on changing Canada's voting system.

"I am pleased that so many residents in our riding took the time

to voice their opinion. Prime Minister Justice Trudeau and his Liberal Government are trying to change what a vote means — without giving all Canadians a say. Politicians and party insiders should not have this power. Only the Canadian people should determine how Canadians elect their governments," said MP Eglinski.

The Liberal Government has claimed their 2015 election victory gives them a mandate to change the voting system in

whatever way they want. Yet, they still haven't told Canadians what system they want to implement. Even though a committee was established, the Federal Liberal Government will be deciding, behind closed doors, on the changes to the way we vote.

"I strongly believe that all voters in Canada must have the opportunity to provide input, and the only way for every Canadian to be heard is through a referendum," concluded MP Eglinski.

IMITATION GUN SAFETY TIPS

Acheson Alberta -On Wednesday September 21, 2016 at approximately 8:00 AM the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP responded to a complaint of a male employee attending his place of work with a firearm on his person. Police attended the business and set up containment of the area. The male was soon located and detained. It was learnt at this time that the firearm was an imitation firearm.

No one was injured.

RCMP would like to remind the public of the potential risks involved with possessing an imitation gun in public places. Imitation firearms can pose a safety hazard as they often create fear and panic by the general public when seen in public places. A fake/imitation gun can easily be mistaken for a real gun, which could have serious or even deadly consequences. Due to the threat to the public, police take firearms complaints seriously and will respond quickly with appropriate resources, tactics and level of force.

Imitation Gun Safety Tips

Please use imitation guns in a safe, responsible and lawful manner:

- Never play with an imitation gun in public places such as malls, parks or schools.
- Use air gun imitations

only at designated play areas, gun ranges, or on private land outside of the city.

- Do not point an imitation gun at another person, even if you are joking.
- Handle air gun imitations with care to avoid injuries, and consider taking a safety class.
- Set rules for children playing with imitation guns so they understand the dangers of misusing them.
- Keep imitation guns out of sight and locked in a case to prevent misunderstandings, accidents or theft.
- If you are carrying an imitation gun and are approached by police, put the gun down and obey their instructions.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Public Hearing 13.16 – Council held a Public Hearing for Bylaw 13.16 for a section of land located south of Edson adjacent to Tollerton Estates that would rezone the property to Country Residential. The surrounding areas are residential based lands, and the proposed zoning

would be a better fit for this particular property and allow for the property owner to subdivide the property separating the house and the shop. No concerns were brought forward during the hearing.

West Fraser on Caribou Recovery Plan – Representatives from West Fraser presented their concerns on the province's Little Smoky and A La Peche Caribou Recovery Plan including how their business could be negatively impacted. They are urging the province to respect their current forest tenure agreements and not to pursue the timber pooling concept.

Bickerdike Speed Reduction — Council gave the first reading for Bylaw 16.16 that would reduce the speed limit to a portion of Bickerdike Road to a new speed of 60 km/hour, down from the current 80 km/hour. Yellowhead County is seeking input from residents and others that use this portion of the road prior to Council making a decision..

Property Tax Recovery Auction – The 2016 Property Tax Recovery public auction for the parcels of land on the tax arrears list will be November 30, 2016. A municipality must offer for sale, at a public auction, any parcel of land on its tax arrears list if not paid prior to the auction.

The next Council Meetings are October 11 & 25, 2016. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is October 31, 2016. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE WEEK OF SEPT 19, 2016

This week Parliament reconvened for the fall session.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-2 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (Third Reading)
- Bill C-4 An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations

Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act Bill C-5 – An Act to repeal Division 20 of Part 3 of the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act (Second Reading)

• Bill C-13 – An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, the Pest Control Products Act and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act and to

make related amendments to another Act (Second Reading)

- Bill S-201 Genetic Non-Discrimination Act (Second Reading)
- Opposition Day motion to call on the government to respect the custom of regional representation when making appointments to the Supreme Court of Canada.
- Bill C-232 An Act to amend the Excise Act, 2001 (spirits) (Second Reading)
- C-234 An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code (replacement workers) (Second Reading)
- C-247 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (passive detection device) (Second Reading)

I returned to Ottawa on Thursday, September 22nd after spending the first half of the week travelling in our riding with the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI) to obtain feedback on our 'study of Federal Protected Areas and Conservation Objectives'. On September 24th, I attended the Ukrainian National Federation's presentation of 'Reconstructing Casualties of War: Canadian Humanitarian Efforts in Ukraine'. The guest speaker, Dr. Oleh Antonyshyn, has dedicated his career to reconstructing deformed and damaged skulls, jaws and faces in patients with acquired or congenital malformations. He traveled to Ukraine for the third time in late October last year to provide specialized post-traumatic reconstructive surgeries that would have been otherwise unavailable to the military and civilians injured in the recent conflict.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE WEEK OF SEPT 26, 2016

This week in Parliament, we covered topics including labour unions, national security, and the protection of animals.

My second son had been born a few months prior,





I learned many of my "skills" through trial and error and watching my own mother preserve.
