October 11, 2016 THORSBY/BRETON RCMP REPORTS FROM SEPTEMBER

On September 16, 2016, the Thorsby/Breton RCMP received a complaint of a break in and theft to a property that was being renovated in Leduc County. Sometime between September 12 and the morning of September 16, 2016 an unoccupied residence that was being renovated was entered and several power tools were stolen from the contractor. The property is located on Twp Rd 504 near Range Road 15.

Between 10pm on September 12th and 10AM on September 13th a generator and other tools were stolen from a rural property located off of Range Road 44 South West of Breton. The generator is described as a 4000 watt yellow coloured unit, possibly a Champion brand.

On Tuesday, September 13th, 2016 between 4:30 AM and 8:20 AM the Pendryl Store located off of Highway 13 near Buck Lake was broken into and a small amount of cash stolen. A vehicle was noticed parked along the West side of the building earlier that morning.

On Saturday, September 17th, 2016, a truck was stolen from a rural residence in the Buck Creek area between 12:00 noon and 3:30 PM. The stolen Ford F-350 was located soon after stuck along the edge of a hayfield and towed from the area. Two males were seen earlier at the stolen truck in a regular cab older model (early 90's) ford half ton, two wheel drive, also light brown/ beige in colour. One was wearing blue work coveralls, described as being short, approximately 5'7" with short dark hair.

Early on Friday September 23rd, 2016 items were being prepared to be stolen from a rural property located North of Township Road 470 on Range Road 22. Vehicles were rum-

maged through, an ATV was pushed out of a storage shed and attempts had been made to start a skid steer. The would be thieves were believed to have been scared off and nothing was stolen in the end. This is a good reminder to ensure your vehicles remain locked and all valuables removed from them at night.

File # 2016-1271865: On Saturday September 24th Breton RCMP received reports that a concrete barrier which protects a gas line had been shot. There were targets drawn onto the concrete. It occurred sometime between September 23rd and September 24th. The person responsible was lucky they hit their "target" as if they didn't there could have been a very different ending. Although not believed to have been done to cause damage, however to sight in a hunting rifle for the up-

coming season, RCMP wish to remind hunters to sight in their rifles using the proper safety precautions.

Located north of the Leduc Recreation Centre, the transfer station is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and welcomes all yard and garden waste including flowerbed plants, leaves, weeds, small twigs and tree branches.

"Throughout the year, using your green organics cart is the best option for proper disposal of yard and garden waste, however fall cleanup often produces more organic material than one green cart can accommodate," says Kerra Chomlak, environmental sustainability co-ordinator with the City of Leduc. "Taking your extra material to the transfer station is an efficient option as you prepare your yard for winter."

When visiting the Leduc Yard Waste Transfer Station, on-site signage directs citizens where to deposit their materials. When using bags, it's important to note that brown paper bags containing materials can be left in the appropriate pile(s), however



PARLIAMENT UPDATE WEEK OF SEPT 19, 2016

This week Parliament reconvened for the fall session.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-2 – An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (Third Reading)

Bill C-4 - An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act Bill C-5 - An Act to repeal Division 20 of Part 3 of the Economic Action Plan 2015 Act (Second Reading) Bill C-13 – An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, the Pest Control Products Act and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act and to make related amendments to another Act (Second Reading)

• Bill S-201 – Genetic Non-Discrimination Act (Second Reading)

• Opposition Day motion to call on the government to respect the custom of regional representation when making appointments to the Supreme Court of Canada.

• Bill C-232 – An Act to amend the Excise Act, 2001 (spirits) (Second Reading)

• C-234 – An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code (replacement workers) (Second Reading)

• C-247 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code (passive detection device) (Second Reading)

I returned to Ottawa on Thursday, September 22nd after spending the first half of the week travelling in our riding with the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI) to obtain feedback on our 'study of Federal Protected Areas and Conservation Objectives'. On September 24th, I attended the Ukrainian National Federation's presentation of 'Reconstructing Casualties of War: Canadian Humanitarian Efforts in Ukraine'. The guest speaker, Dr. Oleh Antonyshyn, has dedicated his career to reconstructing deformed and damaged skulls, jaws and faces in patients with acquired or congenital malformations. He traveled to Ukraine for the third time in late October last year to provide specialized post-traumatic reconstructive surgeries that would have been otherwise unavailable to the military and civilians injured in the recent conflict.


Fun By The Numbers
