# FORMER ALBERTA RCMP OFFICER FACES CRIMINAL CHARGES

### Submitted by Alberta RCMP

Today, the Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) announced that former Alberta RCMP officer Aaron Sayler was charged with the following:

- One count of theft under \$5000
- One count of obtaining by false pretenses
- One count of uttering a forged document
- One count of fraud under \$5000 Mr. Sayler is no longer a police officer but at the time of the offences was a sworn member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police working

out of the Stony Plain Detachment.

The Director of Law Enforcement asked ASIRT to begin the investigation into Mr. Sayler on February 18, 2016. With respect to the alleged theft, it is believed that on March 6, 2015, then Constable Aaron Sayler participated in a search of a vehicle and found an airsoft pistol that, instead of seizing as evidence and properly handling as an exhibit, he simply took.

With respect to the remaining counts, it is alleged that on October 27, 2015, then Cst. Sayler engaged in insurance fraud by creating a false hit and run collision report that he submitted to his insurance com-

pany for the purpose of obtaining insurance money.

Mr. Sayler was suspended from duty on February 19, 2016. His suspension was standard RCMP practice and not a disciplinary measure. An internal RCMP Code of Conduct investigation is also underway in relation to Mr. Sayler's conduct. Mr. Sayler resigned from the RCMP on October 19, 2016.

Mr. Sayler had eight years and eleven months of RCMP service. He was posted to the Stony Plain Detachment in 2012. Before that he was posted to the Slave Lake Detachment from 2007 to 2011.

# ARRESTED MALE CHARGED AND REMANDED INTO CUSTODY

RCMP File 2016-1382870: Whitecourt RCMP have been tracking an recent uptick in break & enter offences, especially to outbuildings and garages within the municipality.

In the early morning hours of Tues-

# MONTHLY UPDATE OF THE GROWTH ALBERTA BOARD

### Submitted by GROWTH Alberta

The following report provides a brief overview of the Board meeting of the Grizzly Regional Economic Alliance Society held September 26, 2016.

CARES Program

The government awarded each REDA 100,000 dollars per year for the next two years including this year. These funds are over and above the current MOU. This is an opportunity to bring forth new project ideas. This is noncompetitive non-matching funding. There is more money available in a competitive funding model.

Troy Grainger, Manager - "The recognition and value of belonging to a REDA is quite evident with the increased access to project revenue under the CARES program and other streams. In the last year, GROWTH Alberta members have seen additional access to 4 potential streams where non-members would have access to only one. Separate matching grant resources are being allocated specifically to REDAs to undertake digital connectivity projects, a non-matching portion over the next two fiscal years and ability to access the CARES program as a REDA and as a sub-geographical collaboration. Board strategies and direction will allow membership fees to be leveraged up to 5:1 on projects that will benefit members as individual areas and GROWTH Alberta as a region."

# INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM **BEGINS MONDAY**

Starting Monday (October 24), Albertans will have the opportunity to protect themselves and others against influenza through Alberta's annual influenza immunization program.

Offering influenza immuniza-

tans six months of age and older, Alberta's program will make vaccine available at hundreds of Alberta Health Services (AHS) public influenza immunization clinics - as well as some pharmacists and physician offices around the province.

"We are already seeing cases of influenza in Alberta," says

Officer of Health in North Zone. "You may be healthy now, but without immunization everyone is at risk. Prevention is your only protection."

Immunization is the most effective means of protecting against the strains of influenza virus circulating this season. Because those strains change from season to season, Albertans are reminded that they cannot rely on having been immunized in years past.

"Last season, influenza immunization cut Albertans' risk for influenza in half. That's great, but last year's immunization won't protect you this season. You need this season's immunization to be protected," says Dr. Koliaska.

In six months alone last season, more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized with influenza and 62 Albertans died. Influenza causes more emergency department visits than heart attacks and strokes, and hospitalizes more children than poisonings.

"Influenza does not discriminate," reminds Dr. Koliaska. "Though some Albertans are at greater risk of severe complications, no one is immune to its potentially severe impact. Please don't take that risk.

"For yourself, and your loved ones, get immunized."

# **PARLIAMENT UPDATE - WEEK OF OCTOBER 17, 2016**

This week in Parliament, we covered a range of topics including ISIS, gender equity, GST rebates for schools, maternity assistance, and human rights.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-4 An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act (Third Reading)
- Bill C-13 An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act (Report Stage & Third Reading)
- Bill C-16 An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code (Second Reading)
- Bill C-24 An Act to amend the Salaries Act and to make a consequential amendment to the Financial Administration Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-26 An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-225 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (injuring or causing the death of a preborn child while committing an offence). This bill was defeated at Second Reading in a vote on Wednesday (76 in favour and 209 opposed).
- Bill C-237 Candidate Gender Equity Act (Second
- Bill C-240 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (tax credit - first aid) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-241 An Act to amend the Excise Tax Act (school authorities) (Second Reading)
  - Conservative motion

on the Softwood Lumber Agreement

- Bill C-243 National Maternity Assistance Program Strategy Act (Second Reading)
- Conservative motion concerning genocide of the Yazidi people by ISIS
- Motion 42 -Tax Avoidance

Government to take immediate action on softwood lumber. The government failed to negotiate a final agreement with the U.S. before the expiry of the last trade agreement on October 12, 2016. # **REASONS FOR A CHECK ENGINE LIGHT**

Vehicles rely on many components working harmoniously to function at optimal capacity. Any number of systems can go wrong, and oftentimes the first indication that something has gone awry is an illuminated dashboard signal.

One such signal is the "check engine" light. Many drivers have little idea what to do when this indicator lights up, and this light can cause some anxiety. According to Consumer Reports, a check engine light turning on does not usually require immediate action. However, it does mean that you should make an appointment to have the vehicle inspected for potential problems.

Check engine lights are part

of a car's onboard diagnostics. The light turning on may indicate something minor, such as a loose fuel cap, or something more serious like a misfiring engine. When the light turns on, drivers wondering why may want to see if the answer is related to one of the following issues.

- 1. Loose gas cap: Fuel vapors can leak out and air can get in when the fuel cap isn't secured correctly. This can compromise the fuel system and make the check engine light come on. Take off the cap and then reseal it to see if that alleviates the problem. Cracked caps will need to be replaced.
- 2. Dirty oxygen sensor: A faulty or clogged sensor may

not provide the right information about unburned oxygen from the vehicle's exhaust. This sensor monitors how much fuel is burned. Compromised data can cause a decrease in fuel efficiency. Some do-it-yourselfers can replace an oxygen sensor on their own, but those who can't should have the issue addressed immediately by a professional.

3. Too much speed or load: Towing a trailer or another heavy item may put strain on the vehicle and cause the light to come on because of loss of power. Lightening the load and reducing speed can help fix the problem. Always consult with the owner's manual to determine the towing capacity of

your vehicle.

4. Short or faulty code: Computers aren't always fool-proof, and sometimes an electrical short or another similar problem can cause a light to come on. Bring the vehicle to an automotive supply store. Such stores typically have diagnostics tools that can be hooked into the car's computer and provide a more detailed understanding of what is triggering the check engine indicator.

In many cases, a steady check engine light is not a serious concern. However, when such a light comes on, drivers should try to find out why as soon as possible.

### **HOW TO PROTECT YOUR CAR'S RESALE VALUE**

Few drivers start thinking about resale value when driving a new car off of the dealership lot for the first time. Still enamored with that new car smell, drivers can be excused for not thinking of resale value as they put the pedal to the metal and speed off in their brand new ride.

But it's never too early to start protecting a vehicle's resale value, especially if you hope to recoup as much of your vehicle investment as possible when the time comes to sell your car or trade it in for a newer model. The following are some ways motorists can protect the resale value of their vehicles from the moment the dealer tosses them the keys.

· Keep all maintenance records. New cars typically do not require much maintenance. But drivers should keep records of all work and maintenance done on their vehicles, even if that work does not extend beyond routine tuneups or oil changes. Keeping maintenance records shows prospective buyers you prioritized taking care of the vehicle over the years, and that makes the car or truck more attractive to preowned vehicle buyers who want to avoid buying a lemon or a car that has not

been taken care of.

- · Don't overlook looks. Looks can be deceiving, but new car buyers who eventually plan to sell their vehicles should do all they can to keep the car looking as new as it did the day it was first driven off the dealership lot. Much like homeowners benefit when selling a home with curb appeal, a car that looks good gives buyers the impression that it was well taken care of. But a dirty car or one with lots of dings and dents is a red flag to preowned car buyers.
- · Keep a clean interior. New car owners typically maintain some strict rules with regard to food and beverages in their vehicles. After all, no one wants their brand new car to succumb to stains or spills. But the longer drivers have a car the more lax they tend to become with regard to allowing food and drinks into their cars, and that can ultimately hurt the resale value of the vehicle. Maintain a clean interior whether you just bought the car or have driven it for a few years. Much like an impressive exterior leaves a lasting impression, a clean interior that has not succumb to coffee stains or muddy boots is more likely to impress buyers than a car with

an interior that has seen better, cleaner days.

- Drive defensively. It's not just what you do to a car but how you drive the car that can affect its resale value. Driving defensively reduces your risk of accident, and an accident-free preowned vehicle is a top priority for potential buyers. But driving defensively also reduces wear and tear on your vehicle, as over time constant stop-andgo, aggressive driving takes its toll on vehicle engines and other components.
- · Periodically examine the vehicle history report. Today's preowned car buyers know to ask for a vehicle history report before buying a car. If your vehicle history report contains

any suspicious or inaccurate information, you may be forced to sell the car for less than it's worth or delay selling until you can have any issues corrected. That won't necessarily happen overnight, but you can avoid dealing with a host of issues all at once by periodically examining the vehicle history report. Any discrepancies on the report can be brought to the attention of your insurance company, who can then work with you to correct the issues and restore your vehicle's reputation.

Resale value may not be foremost on the minds of new car owners, but the earlier buyers begin to factor resale value into their car-care routines, the more they will benefit down the road.






