FORMER ALBERTA RCMP OFFICER FACES CRIMINAL CHARGES

The Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) announced that former Alberta RCMP officer Aaron Sayler was charged with the following:

- One count of theft under \$5000
- One count of obtaining by false
- One count of uttering a forged document
- One count of fraud under \$5000

Mr. Sayler is no longer a police officer but at the time of the offences was a sworn member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police working out of the Stony Plain Detachment.

The Director of Law Enforcement asked ASIRT to begin the investigation into Mr. Sayler on February 18, 2016. With respect to the alleged theft, it is believed that on March 6, 2015, then Constable Aaron Sayler participated in a search of a vehicle and found an airsoft pistol that, instead of seizing as evidence and properly handling as an exhibit, he simply took

With respect to the remaining counts, it is alleged that on October 27, 2015, then Cst. Sayler engaged in insurance fraud by creating a false hit and run collision

report that he submitted to his insurance company for the purpose of obtaining insurance money.

Mr. Sayler was suspended from duty on February 19, 2016. His suspension was standard RCMP practice and not a disciplinary measure. An internal RCMP Code of Conduct investigation is also underway in relation to Mr. Sayler's conduct. Mr. Sayler resigned from the RCMP on October 19, 2016.

Mr. Sayler had eight years and eleven months of RCMP service. He was posted to the Stony Plain Detachment in 2012. Before that he was posted to the Slave Lake Detachment from 2007 to 2011.

CARFENTANIL DETECTED IN TWO DEATHS IN ALBERTA

Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health is alerting the public, as well as health and law-enforcement officials, that the illicit opioid carfentanil has been confirmed by the Chief Medical Examiner in two recent deaths.

"Albertans need to know that the drug carfentanil has made its way into our province and that it is an extremely dangerous and deadly opioid. The smallest trace of carfentanil can be lethal and Albertans should be aware of the life-threatening dangers in using this drug." - Dr. Karen Grimsrud, Chief Medical Officer of Health

Earlier this week, the Chief Medical Examiner notified the Chief Medical Officer of Health that carfentanil was detected in the deaths of two men in their 30s. One of the deaths occurred in the Edmonton area, the other in Calgary. Until very recently, toxicology tests could not confirm the existence of carfentanil in human blood due to the very low level of the drug being deadly.

"To my knowledge, there are very few laboratories in North America that are able to measure carfentanil in human blood. Alberta's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is believed to be the first toxicology laboratory in Canada to positively identify carfentanil in human blood. The discovery of this dangerous drug is concerning to us, and we will continue to work closely with our health partners, as part of sharing information and raising awareness of opioids." - Dr. Elizabeth Brooks-Lim, Acting Chief Medical Examiner



MALE KIDNAPPED AT GUNPOINT

Stony Plain Alberta -On Saturday October 8th, 2016 at approximately 5:40 AM the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP received a call from Edmonton Police Service advising they have a male at South Division reporting that he was kid-

napped early that morning in the town of Stony Plain. The victim advised that at approximately 4:30 AM that morning, he left a friend's apartment in Stony Plain and was getting into his vehicle when he was kidnapped at gunpoint by 4 males. His hands and mouth were duct taped and he was placed in the back seat of a gold colored Ford Escape. The victim was driven to a south Edmonton condominium complex

where he managed to escape.

The male victim was not injured.

Joshua Lark, age 26 of Stony Plain has been charged with Kidnapping while using a firearm, Forcible confinement, and Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose. Lark had been remanded into custody and will appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on October 19, 2016.

It is believed that Lark and the

victim are known to each other.

"We are already in the eye of a deadly storm in fighting the horrific impacts of fentanyl in our communities. We are now even more challenged by the arrival of carfentanil on our streets. The primary role of the Alberta RCMP is to stop the flow of these substances and the criminal activities that support them. We will work together with our partners to weather this storm." - Deputy Commissioner Marianne Ryan, Commanding Officer, RCMP in

Carfentanil is an opioid drug licensed for use with large animals, but not for humans. Carfentanil is 100 times more toxic than fentanyl. An amount as small as a grain of sand could be lethal.





INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM BEGINS MONDAY

Starting Monday (October 24), Albertans will have the opportunity to protect themselves and others against influenza through Alberta's annual influenza immunization program.

Offering influenza immunization, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older, Alberta's program will make vaccine available at hundreds of Alberta Health Services (AHS) public influenza immunization

clinics – as well as some pharmacists and physician offices – around the province.

"We are already seeing cases of influenza in Alberta," says Dr. Kathryn Koliaska, Medical Officer of Health in North Zone. "You may be healthy now, but without immunization everyone is at risk. Prevention is your only protection."

Immunization is the most effective means of protecting against the strains of influenza virus circulating this season. Because those strains change from season to season, Albertans are reminded that they cannot rely on having been immunized in years past.

"Last season, influenza immunization cut Albertans' risk for influenza in half. That's great, but last year's immunization won't protect you this season. You need this season's immunization to be protected," says Dr. Koliaska.

In six months alone last season, more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized with influenza and 62 Albertans died. Influenza causes more emergency department visits than heart attacks and strokes, and hospitalizes

more children than poisonings.

"Influenza does not discriminate," reminds Dr. Koliaska. "Though some Albertans are at greater risk of severe complications, no one is immune to its potentially severe impact. Please don't take that risk.

"For yourself, and your loved ones, get immunized."



FOURTEEN ARRESTED IN OPERATION ICE REIGN

Edmonton... Operation ICE Reign, an ALERT investigation focusing on child sexual exploitation offenders, has resulted in the arrest of 14 suspects from across northern Alberta.

Between June-October 2016, ALERT's Internet Child Exploitation (ICE) unit charged 14 suspects with 33 offences related to online child sexual exploitation. ICE is an integrated unit comprised of Edmonton Police Service and RCMP members.

Operation ICE Reign was launched in response to a noted increase in child sexual exploitation offences. In the past six years the ICE unit has experienced a 75% increase in the number of new child sexual exploitation cases it investigates. ICE investigates offences involving child pornography, any computer-related child sexual abuse, child luring over the Internet, voyeurism involving victims under the age of 18, and child sex trade/tourism.

"Operation ICE Reign resulted in the seizure of thousands of photos and videos of children being abused and each one of those image represents a real-word victim. As a society we have a collective responsibility to protect children and shield them from sexual exploitation," said ALERT Insp. Dave Dubnyk.

ALERT is also hoping to use Operation ICE Reign to raise awareness about the pervasiveness of child sexual exploitation and has partnered with the Canadian Centre for Child Protection.

"While the internet did not create this problem, it has created unprecedented opportunities for offenders to access, possess and distribute child sexual abuse material-as well as actively participate in the market of child sexual abuse. Today's announcement not only underscores how significant a problem this is, but also challenges the misconceptions about who and what type of individuals participate in these crimes against children," said Lianna McDonald, Executive Director, Canadian Centre for Child Protection.

The arrests took place between June and October. All of the accused are all men and range in age from 26 to 61 years old.

None of the accused were deemed to work in professions of trust and/or authority. There is no definitive link between the suspects other than the offences allegedly committed.

Operation ICE Reign investigators utilized information from a variety of agencies and partners during the investigation, including RCMP's National Child Exploitation Coordination Centre, Cybertip, Canada Border Services Agency, Interpol, Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, Tennessee Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, and numerous

RCMP detachments.

Anyone with information about this investigation, or any child exploitation offence is encouraged to contact local police or cybertip.ca.

ALERT was established and is funded by the Alberta Government and is a compilation of the province's most sophisticated law enforcement resources committed to tackling serious and organized crime. Members of Alberta Sheriffs, Calgary Police Service, Edmonton Police Service, Lethbridge Police Service, Medicine Hat Police Service, and RCMP work in ALERT.



HOW DRIVERS CAN REDUCE FUEL EMISSIONS

According to the United States Environmental Protection Agency, many cities across the country can claim automobiles as their single greatest contributor to pollution. While emissions from individual cars are somewhat low, emissions from millions of vehicles can add up to a substantial amount of pollution, and it takes residents working collectively to reduce those emissions and improve their local air quality.

Hydrocarbons are among the many exhaust pollutants that find their way into the air. When fuel molecules in a vehicle's engine do not burn or burn only partially, the resulting hydrocarbon emissions can contribute to ground-level ozone, which can irritate the eyes, damage the lungs and aggravate existing respiratory problems. Carbon dioxide is another exhaust pollutant that

can affect air quality and human health.

Reducing fuel emissions is an effective way for drivers to improve air quality and preserve their own health, and the following are a few simple steps motorists can take to do just that.

· Rearrange your work habits. Technology has changed how many businesses approach the traditional office environment, and men and women who are looking to reduce fuel emissions and cut costs may want to approach their bosses about rearranging their work habits. Telecommuting to work, even if you only do so for one or two days per week, can drastically reduce your fuel emissions over the course of a year. In lieu of meeting with clients or colleagues in person, which often requires travel, suggest teleconferences or video conferences so

your fuel consumption and exhaust emissions are reduced.

· Maintain your vehicle. Another way to cut back on fuel emissions is to adhere to your vehicle's maintenance schedule and have any issues addressed immediately. A poorly maintained vehicle will force the engine to work harder, and that in turn will burn more fuel. Many auto manufacturers now build vehicles that require less frequent maintenance. For example, whereas oil changes were once required every 3,000 miles, many newer vehicles can now last twice that long before they need oil changes. That makes maintaining a vehicle easier than ever before.

· Maintain a safe and steady speed. Rapid acceleration and frequent stops and starts make for very inefficient use of fuel, increasing both consumption and emissions. While city drivers may not be able to avoid frequent stops and starts, they can avoid rapid acceleration between those stops and starts. Drivers who do the bulk of their driving on highways should maintain safe speeds, as driving too fast is another way to waste fuel and increase emissions.

Embrace public transportation. Many drivers never consider public transportation, but mass transit is a great way to save money, reduce fuel consumption and emissions and protect your automotive investment. Over a typical year, the cost of mass transportation will likely pale in comparison to the amount of money you spend on fuel, and your car will last a lot longer if you opt for public transportation and avoid rush hour traffic each day.

HOW TO HANDLE CAR TROUBLE WHILE DRIVING

Sudden car trouble is something no driver wants to experience, but many a driver has been driving down the highway only to feel his or her vehicle start to sputter. Such sputtering might indicate a car is running low on fuel, or it could be a sign of something more serious that requires motorists to think as quickly and safely as possible.

When car trouble strikes while a vehicle is on the road, the first thing many drivers do is check their fuel gauges. A car that runs out of gas is certainly inconvenient, but if you can pull over to the shoulder or make it to the nearest filling station, then this unfortunate situation can be remedied rather easily. But when a car's tank is full and it is still showing signs of trouble, drivers must take steps to protect themselves, their passengers and their vehicles. The following are a few simple tips motorists should keep in mind so they can safely handle any car trouble that may arise while they are out on the road.

• Keep a first-aid kit, spare tire and tire jack in the car at all times. Flat tires are no fun, but they are even more of a nuisance when drivers are not prepared to address them. Always keep a jack and spare tire in your car, even if the spare

is a donut you can temporarily use to replace a flat tire until you make it to a filling station or automotive supply store. As an added safety measure, keep a fully stocked first aid kit in your vehicle in case you cut yourself while changing the tire or need to address another medical situation. Visit www.redcross.org for a list of items to include in your automotive emergency kit. Keep a blanket in the trunk as well so your passengers can stay warm should you experience car trouble on a cold day or night.

- Make note of your surroundings. Some car troubles can only be fixed by the professionals, so pay careful attention to your surroundings in case an issue arises and forces you to pull over and call for help. Always pay attention to mile markers and any landmarks that might help you describe where you are. Car troubles can strike at any time and anywhere, so be sure to pay special attention to your surroundings when driving in unfamiliar areas.
- Pull over. Don't panic if an issue arises suddenly. Remain calm and pull over onto the shoulder. The right shoulder is the area for pulling over on most roads, but you may also use the left shoulder on multilane highways with medians.

Try to get as far away from traffic as possible without driving off of level ground, and always use your signals when pulling onto the shoulder. If the vehicle can't make it to the median, put your emergency flashers on and get out of the car, moving away from both the vehicle and traffic. Immediately call for emergency roadside assistance, alerting the authorities if need be.

• Use flares or triangles to alert other drivers. So long as you are not risking your well-being, you can place flares and/or warning triangles behind your vehicle so oncoming traffic knows to drive around it. The popular not-for-profit motor club AAA recommends placing the first flare or triangle 10 feet directly behind the side

of the vehicle that is closest to the road. The second should be placed between 30 and 60 feet (increase the distances as the posted speed limit increases) behind the middle of the bumper, while the third flare or triangle should be placed between 120 and 360 feet behind the vehicle's right side.

- Stay with the vehicle. Once you have called for help and set up flares or triangles, stay with the vehicle, though do so at a safe enough distance so you are not in harm's way.
- Sudden car troubles can be scary, but drivers who approach such issues calmly and quickly can reduce their risk for accident or injury.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF OCTOBER 17, 2016

This week in Parliament, we covered a range of topics including ISIS, gender equity, GST rebates for schools, maternity assistance, and human rights.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-4 – An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code, the

Parliamentary Employment and Staff Relations Act, the Public Service Labour Relations Act and the Income Tax Act (Third Reading)

• Bill C-13 – An Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, the Hazardous Products Act, the Radiation Emitting Devices Act, the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999, and the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act (Report Stage & Third Reading)

- Bill C-16 An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code (Second Reading)
- Bill C-24 An Act to amend the Salaries Act and to make a consequential amendment to the Financial Administration Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-26 An Act to amend


the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (Second Reading)

- Bill C-225 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (injuring or causing the death of a preborn child while committing an offence). This bill was defeated at Second Reading in a vote on Wednesday (76 in favour and 209 opposed).
- Bill C-237 Candidate Gender Equity Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-240 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (tax credit – first aid) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-241 An Act to amend the Excise Tax Act (school authorities) (Second Reading)
- Conservative motion on the Softwood Lumber Agreement
- Bill C-243 National Maternity Assistance Program Strategy Act (Second Reading)
- Conservative motion concerning genocide of the Yazidi people by ISIS
- Motion 42 Tax Avoidance

On Monday, I participated in the debate on the Conservative motion calling on the Liberal Government to take immediate action on softwood lumber. The government failed to negotiate a final agreement with the U.S. before the expiry of the last trade agreement on October 12, 2016.
