



You may or may not be aware that the Yellowhead Regional Library received funding from the Public Library Services Branch to expand services to on-reserve and on-settlement populations. We are pleased to announce that our proposal was submitted and has been approved and we will be receiving funding to expand our services to these populations.

The project: a joint application which includes, Darwell Public Library, Rich Valley Public Library, Alberta Beach Municipal Library, Onoway Public Library and the Stony Plain Public Library, will bring us closer to providing culturally appropriate services to these communities. We are collaborating with representatives from the Alexis Nakota First Nation to establish the priority needs of the community. To start with we will be establishing a library at their ECS-Grade 12 School in a large space that has been provided. We will be consulting with the teachers and students on design, set-up and running of the library. Once the school library has been established we will start to create mini libraries that will roll out into other key community locations. We are very excited about the project and hope to have the library established and functional by March 2017.

The next Book Club meeting will be on Monday, December 5, 2016 at 6:00p.m. to discuss "The Bone Clocks" by David Mitchell. This will be our Christmas potluck so bring your favorite dish to enjoy before the discussion. Do you love to read? Do you like to discuss what you have read with others? We have a few open spots and are always interested in a new perspective to add to our conversation. If you are interested in participating you can register and make arrangements for loan of the current title by calling the library @ 780-892-3746.



# PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF OCTOBER 31, 2016

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

This week in Parliament, with the release of the 2016 Fall Economic Statement, we largely focused on the Liberal Government's budget and deficit. We also covered topics including poverty, the ethics around Liberal ministers' "cash-for-access" fundraising events, and aquacul-

ture in British Columbia.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-29 Budget Implementation Act, 2016, No. 2 (Second Reading)
- Bill C-26 An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (CPP) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-306 Crimean Tatar

Deportation ("Sürgünlik") Memorial Day Act (Second Reading)

- Bill C-228 An Act to amend the Fisheries Act (closed containment aquaculture) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-245 Poverty Reduction Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-311 An Act to amend the Holidays Act (Remembrance Day) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-235 An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Corrections and Conditional Release Act (fetal alcohol disorder) (Second Reading)
- CPC Opposition Motion Conflict of Interest and Ethics Commissioner
- Motion 10 Fall Economic Statement

### CHICKEN HEALTH WORKSHOP

(November 3, 2016) - "Dr. Savannah Howse and Dr. Michelle Woodruff, Veterinarians from the Rocky Rapids Vet Clinic in Drayton Valley have been invited out to go over one of the most important aspects of owning any animal, keeping them healthy." says Yellowhead County's agricultural services coordinator Melissa Marquis. "This work-

shop is for anyone who wants to raise backyard poultry flocks and has an interest in learning how to recognize and prevent common poultry diseases."

Dr. Howse and Dr. Woodruff will be presenting for two hours, starting off with disease prevention. This topic will include information on good purchasing practices, proper housing, vaccinations, medicated feed/water and more. The second part of the presentation will be on recogniz-

ing the signs of illness such as those for nutritional, respiratory, ocular, and gastrointestinal diseases. The final portion of the presentation will be on regulations, good microbial stewardship, and vet-client-patient relationships. # SHARING A LASTING LEGACY

November 2016 – People often can't help but smile when they see six-year-old Kamryn Bond lay a wreath with her friend, Shannon Krasowski, 40, at their local Remembrance Day ceremony. Although an unlikely pair, they are both amputees and are part of a legacy that goes back nearly 100 years.

Kamryn is a member, and Shannon a graduate, of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program. It was war amputee veterans who created The War Amps in 1918, its Key Tag Service in 1946, and later, the CHAMP Program. Since 1975, thousands of child amputees across Canada have received financial assistance for their artificial limbs through CHAMP and attended regional seminars where they learn about growing up as an amputee.

When Kamryn was 11 months old, both of her legs, right hand, and several fingers on her left hand, were amputated due to a respiratory illness. Shannon's left leg was amputated when she was 13 years old due to bone cancer.

They met three years ago at their

Evansburg 780-727-2791 local Remembrance Day ceremony. That year, Kamryn watched Shannon lay a wreath on behalf of The War Amps Operation Legacy, but ever since, it has been a tradition they share.

While growing up as a Champ, Shannon met many war amputee veterans and heard their firsthand accounts of the devastation of war. "They passed this legacy to us younger amputees and now it's our turn to share their stories, so that we never forget their sacrifices," she says.

Although Kamryn is still quite young, her mom, Dale, says it is important for her daughter to lay a wreath on Remembrance Day. "It builds the foundation for her to understand how much our war veterans gave up for our freedom."

Dale adds, "We will always be appreciative of the work of the war amputee veterans and the message they have left for young amputees like Kamryn to carry into the future. It is for this reason that she lays a wreath every year in their honour, and will do so for many years to come."

# GYPSD PUBLIC BOARD MEETING KEY MESSAGES

Today is 'Take Your Kids to Work Day' and on behalf of the division, we offer a sincere thank you to all the businesses and volunteers who have opened their workplaces to our Grade 9 students who will be spending the day with them to learn more about the world of work.

Learning Updates

The Learning Services department provided key updates for the Board on a number of initiatives and strategies taking place throughout the division such as implementing strategies for elementary students on self-regulation. This year's focus on literacy started with data analysis of students requiring specific needs and increased collaboration sessions for staff on developing sustained reading and vocabulary acquisition skills. The dual credit program for students has expanded new opportunities for those wishing to pursue a career as a Oil and Gas Pipeline operator with GYPSD's new partnership with NAIT. Reviewing technology trends and creating policies is underway with a new group of stakeholders taking part in a Learning and Technology Advisory Committee who held their first meeting in October.

Other News in Brief

• Trustees approved their 2015-16 Board Self-Evaluation document which was a self-evaluation questionnaire used to review the board's past year performance and to align with future goals. The four areas of equal focus were increasing partnerships with local businesses/industries for benefit of students; improving apprenticeship opportunities; developing community citizenship skills in students and what schools are currently doing and how trustees can expand those opportunities; and increasing literacy/numeracy and

links to lifelong learning.

- An amendment to Policy 6 Role of Board Chair was approved.
- An overview of the division schools' budgets for the 2015-16 school year was presented by J. Karén, Asst. Supt. - Business Services.
- The Board received an update in regards to the school naming process for the new replacement school in Edson that is currently under construction. A total of 135 names were submitted and will be forwarded to the School Naming Committee for consideration at their first meeting on Wednesday, November 9th. As per the process approved on September 7th, The School Naming Committee is to review all name submissions and forward three names in order of preference by Wednesday, November 30, 2016 to the COTW for consideration at their meeting on December 14, 2016. The COTW will forward their recommendation for the Board's approval at the Public Board Meeting on January 11, 2017.
- Nikki Gilks, GYPSD's Communication Manager, shared news about two communications awards received at this year's annual conference for the Canadian Association of Communicators in Education (CACE) on October 23-25, 2016 in Ottawa. (see separate press release).
- · A preliminary review of the 2015-16 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) and diploma exam results were discussed. High school graduation rates were also reported for Grande Yellowhead which showed a slight decline in areas hit by an economic downturn in communities where families have relocated out of the jurisdiction or province. Noted Sandy Axmann, Supervisor of Learning Services, "We have had families struggle this past year, and the stress this has had on our students is demonstrated with these results. On a more positive note, the division's Indigenous graduation rates continue to be well above provincial norms."
- Trustee Zaporosky recently attended the opening of a new mosque in Edson which was very well attended by community members including many local GYPSD staff.

On Wednesday, November 2nd our Grade 9's will be absent from school and on the job! Along with most Grade 9 students in Alberta, Wildwood's Grade 9's will spend that day shadowing an adult in the workplace as that host person carries out their typical workday. The intent of the day is for youth to get a true idea of what it is like to work for a living and to see what it takes to get a job and keep a job. The day these teenagers enter the workforce is really not far off, however preparation for the world of work gets a MAJOR emphasis for any age of student at Wildwood School. Wherever possible, teachers here strive to create real life learning opportunities that will prepare children to be successful at their future jobs. These students pictured from the Grade 4/5 class are learning about simple machines in the science unit called 'Wheels and Levers'.

Their teacher created an opportunity for students to work in crews of three to set up a miniature gantry system to learn about pulleys and how they can make lifting easier. The simulation included lots of problem solving and lots of hands on. One person yelled out, "I would not want to be under that weight in a shop the day the rope slips!" A BIG discussion about workplace safety came up naturally. Everyone agreed: Never stand under a suspended load. Life saving learning. Parents frequently ask teachers what they can do at home to help their children

become even more successful as kids work towards becoming an adult in the workforce.

From the earliest age two simple skills can get extra attention at home. Foremost is TALKING, TALKING, TALKING, TALKING! Expect children to be specific and descriptive when they are talking. Excellent communication skills are always sought after when hiring. Second is engaging in any activity where kids can build up the grip muscles in the palms of their hands: cutting with scissors, crafts and projects, any squeezing, grabbing, turning, holding or stirring.

Development of these muscles is foundational not only for printing but for doing any work in the skilled trades. Good manners and a strong work ethic are also success indicators. Both parents and teachers strive to be consistent and set a high standard for students in these two important areas.
