Leduc, AB - On October 24, 2016, the Leduc RCMP's Municipal Integrated Traffic Unit (LMITU) partnered again with the Youth Initiatives & Education in Lifestyles & Driving (Y.I.E.L.D) Association to present a hands-on demonstration about the dangers of distracted and impaired driving. The event was held at the Leduc Composite High School where students were given the opportunity to participate during their free time. Events included texting and driving in a sophisticated driving simulator, as well as doing basic coordination tests while wearing goggles that showed the effects of alcohol at different levels of impairment. In this environment, students were able to experience the very real results of distracted driving, and the effects of alcohol on balance and coordination.

This education comes just before Pedestrian Safety Month, which runs through the entire month of November. The most recent statistics from Alberta Transportation show that pedestrians between the ages of 15 to 19 are most likely to be injured in a collision, and international research shows that 20 to 30 percent of all collisions involve distracted driving.

MP JIM EGLINSKI QUESTIONS PARLIAMENT ON THE AGRICULTURAL STATE OF DISASTER IN BRAZEAU COUNTY

OTTAWA: On November 4th, in the House of Com-

mons, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, asked the Liberal government if they are planning any income disaster assistance to the Alberta agricultural state of disaster, in Brazeau County.

"Mr. Speaker, recent years have been tough on farmers in my riding of Yellowhead, especially in Brazeau County. In July of last year, the county declared an agricultural state of disaster due to drought. Earlier this week, constant rain forced Brazeau County to declare another state of agricultural disaster. Up to 75% of local crops remain on the ground.

What is the government planning to provide in income disaster assistance to this vital sector?"





AHS Promotes National Addictions Awareness Week

However, there are some things individuals can to do to help prevent addiction in themselves, and others, even small actions can make a big difference.

Nov. 13 – 19 is National Addictions Awareness Week and provides an opportunity to talk about what individuals can do to help prevent addiction.

Addictions are very common,

but they are very complicated to explain. They seem to depend on a lot of things:

- the drug or behaviour in-
- the person's psychology, biology, and genes
- the person's past experiences
- the person's life situation
- how available the drugs are to the person
- how acceptable the drug or behaviour is to the person, their

friends, and society

Fortunately, there are things that can help anyone avoid addiction:

- A person has choices. If they seem to be using a drug more and more in certain situations, they can look for ways to avoid those situations.
- If someone has a history of addiction in their family, it's wise to be extra alert and take the time to learn about that problem.
- Learn how addictive any drugs are. This includes alcohol, caffeine, and prescription drugs.
- With some drugs, like nicotine and heroin, the percentage of users who get addicted is so high that it's best not to use the drug at all.
- If someone is already having trouble with a drug or type of behaviour, they should go for help.

A number of resources are available to help individuals, families, schools and communities prevent through the Alberta Health Services Addiction Prevention Toolkit, visit www. ahs.ca. These resources include information on what individuals can to do for their mental well-being including self-care tips, a key in reducing the chance of addiction occurring.


Some examples of positive self-care include:



Leduc, Alberta - On October 31, 2016, the Leduc Municipal Integrated Traffic Unit conducted a Distracted Driving joint force operation in partnership with the Leduc County Enforcement Services, and the Leduc Integrated Traffic Unit, targeting distracted drivers within the City of Leduc. Over the course of 6 hours, officers issued Violation Tickets on 19 distracted driving offences, 10


seatbelt offences, and 23 other offences including red light violations.



On October 27, 2016 at approximately 6:00 p.m. following a tip to the Thorsby/Breton RCMP from a member of the public, a 17 year old male youth was arrested in relation to the vehicle which had fled from RCMP and was later determined to be stolen. Charges are pending. RCMP are no longer looking for any other suspects in relation to this event.

ORGINAL RELEASE:

On October 27, 2016 at approximately 1100hrs RCMP Integrated Traffic Services attempted to stop a vehicle on Hwy 770 just north of HWY 39. The truck, a 2011 Toyota Tundra silver in color, was found traveling at a very high rate of speed.

Members attempted to stop the vehicle but it continued west from Hwy 770 departing the roadway and entering farm fields through barbed wire fences. The pursuit was immediately terminated due to the dangers it presented.

The vehicle was later located on a farm yard near RR43 and Twp Rd 492. The vehicle had struck a tree and caused significant damage. The driver fled the scene.

The vehicle contained a firearm which has since been recovered.

After an extensive search by Thorsby/Breton RCMP, Stony Plain RCMP, and RCMP Police Dog Service the driver was not located.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE

Week of October 31, 2016

This week in Parliament, with the release of the 2016 Fall Economic Statement, we largely focused on the Liberal Government's budget and deficit. We also covered topics including poverty, the ethics around Liberal ministers' "cashfor-access" fundraising events, and aquaculture in British Columbia.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-29 – Budget Implementation Act, 2016, No. 2 (Second

Reading)

- Bill C-26 An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (CPP) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-306 Crimean Tatar Deportation ("Sürgünlik") Memorial Day Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-228 An Act to amend the Fisheries Act (closed containment aquaculture) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-245 Poverty Reduction Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-311 An Act to amend the Holidays Act (Remembrance

Day) (Second Reading)

- Bill C-235 An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Corrections and Conditional Release Act (fetal alcohol disorder) (Second Reading)
- CPC Opposition Motion Conflict of Interest and Ethics Commissioner
- Motion 10 Fall Economic Statement

On Friday, I presented a petition requesting that the government appoint a Minister for Seniors as well as develop a National Strategy for Seniors. Also on Friday, I asked the Liberal Government how it is planning to provide income disaster relief to the agricultural sector in our riding, especially Brazeau County. Finally, I asked a question during debate on C-26, and two questions during debate on C-306. This week, I attended seven meetings and five events. As Parliament will be down next week, my following update will be on my travels, meetings, and events in the riding.

Week of October 24, 2016

This week in Parliament, we covered topics including the Canadian Pension Plan, the government's budget, immigration, and First Nations children.

- Bill C-26 An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-29 Budget Implementation Act No. 2 (Second Reading)
- Bill C-224 Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act (Report Stage)
- Bill S-201 Genetic Non-Discrimination Act (Second Reading)
- Bill S-208 An Act Respecting National Seal Products Day (Second Reading)
- Motion No. 39 Immigration to Atlantic Canada (Resuming Debate on Amendments)
- Motion No. 40 Abandoned vessels (Resuming Debate on Amendments)
- NDP Motion Care for First Nations Children

On Tuesday, I participated in the debate on Bill C-26, which would expand the Canada Pension Plan by raising the CPP premium rate.




