EXCESSIVE MOISTURE CONDITIONS IN CROPS

(November 8, 2016) – Due to excessive moisture conditions across the County nearly half of the crops have not yet been harvested. For this reason, producers are reminding recreational users and hunters to be aware that driving over unharvested crops will cause negative impacts. Driving over sensitive crops like canola will cause shelling losses and driving on cereals will make it difficult to pick up with a combine. This awareness still applies when the snow falls. Agricultural

Services is reminding recreational users to stick to the ditches and recreational trails.

Agricultural Services is also reminding producers that with wet field conditions crops should be taken off the field immediately and stored grain should be monitored more frequently. Fito Zamudio Baca, Forage and Livestock Manager at West Central Forage Association reminds producers to get a nutritional test done in grain and or forage crops damaged by wet weather. Feeds like this can vary greatly in nutritional value. If there are signs of mold, bacteria or fungus growth

further tests are likely needed.

Information on Feed & Grain Testing labs can be found on the Alberta Agriculture website. www.agric.gov.ab.ca

If you are a West Central Forage Association member, WCFA will send the test to the lab for you, help you interpret the results and balance a ration for your livestock. Test costs and shipping are paid by the producer.





THE ROOTS OF A CHRISTMAS TREE

Have you ever given any thought to the historical roots of the Christmas tree? Did you know that the evergreen tree has been used to celebrate both pagan and Christian holidays over the centuries? The branches of the fir tree were first used to decorate the homes of the Romans to celebrate the pagan holiday, the Winter Solstice. The green branches represented the spring to come and gave the Romans

hope for the future. Branches of evergreen trees were also suspended from ceilings of the Polish people. These branches were then decorated with nuts. fruit, cookies, ribbons and stars made of straw. The Polish people believed that the trees were magical and would help to bring a fruitful harvest the following year. Both Estonia and Latvia claim to be the first documented countries to put up an actual tree in their town square. Single men and women would then meet in the square, sing and dance and then set the tree on fire, perhaps

creating the first Yule log. Obviously this was quite a bit of time before tinder or match.com!

Christmas trees began popping up in European countries as early as the 1500's. There are pictures of Martin Luther, St. Boniface and others carrying Christmas trees. There are also several legends and stories explaining how the Christmas tree came to be. One of my favorites is the German legend of a family that found a poor, starving child on Christmas Eve and they brought him in and warmed, fed, washed him and then put him to

bed. In the morning the family woke up to angels singing as the poor boy had turned into Jesus, the Christ Child. He then presented the family with an evergreen branch for thanking them for their kindness. The family then put up a Christmas tree every year after that to remember him. There is another legend that explains how St. Boniface was out walking in a forest when he found some pagans that were about to sacrifice a small boy while worshipping an oak tree. St. Boniface was infuriated and chopped down the offending oak tree. In amazement he watched as a fir tree immediately sprung up from the roots of the oak tree. St. Boniface then decorated and used the tree as a symbol of Christianity as he preached to the pagans.

Germany decorated their Christmas trees with edible gingerbread, candies and apples; eventually they began adding glass and paper ornaments. It is amazing to think that decorated Christmas trees have been put up in homes since the 1600's! In the early 1800's European nobility began putting up Christmas trees. Royal courts in Germany, England, France and Denmark to name a few became avid devotees of this latest fad. They posed for portraits beside their beautifully decorated trees that had been topped with images of baby Jesus, stars and angels. The Fir Tree, by Hans Christian Anderson came out in 1844 a block buster hit that remains in circulation today in forms of books, cartoons and movies.

Americans saw the pictures and heard the legends about Christmas trees, so they too began to decorate their homes with trees at Christmas time. Soon just about every home had a tree on display. They became so popular that a charity was developed during World War 1 for children in the London slums, so that they too might enjoy the delights of a Christmas tree. A variety of traditions developed over the years, due to North America's influx of immigrants.

Bickerdike Speed Limit Reduced – Council passed a bylaw that will reduce Bickerdike Road to a 60 km/hr speed zone down from 80 km/hr. A number

of residents signed a letter in support of the speed reduction for the entire length of the roadway. Yellowhead County will be installing the new speed limit signs shortly.

Policy Change May Affect Future Bidding Opportunities – A change to the County's open tenders policy restricts any entity involved in a law suit or is seeking arbitration with the County, regarding a contract dispute, would not be allowed to bid on future County contracts until three years after the dispute is resolved.

The next Council Meetings are

scheduled for November 22 & December 13, 2016. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is scheduled for December 20, 2016. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

My grandmother, on the other hand, allowed the tree to go up on December 24th and as soon as the presents were unwrapped that tree was chucked out the door on December 25th! Many families wait until after the Orthodox Christmas celebration, which means your tree is up until well into January.

Last Saturday in Drayton Valley, I observed a province-wide rally against the Alberta NDP Carbon Tax Initiative. I believe the provincial and federal carbon tax grabs will chase away jobs and do nothing to achieve our national climate change goals.

AHS PROMOTES NATIONAL ADDICTIONS AWARENESS WEEK

Now more than ever, Alberta Health Services is dedicated to reducing risk factors to help prevent addiction and substance abuse in all Albertans.

There is no single root cause for addiction and most times there are number of reasons why an individual suffers from an addiction. However, there are some things individuals can to do to help prevent addiction in themselves, and others, even small actions can make a big difference.

Nov. 13 – 19 is National Addictions Awareness Week and provides an opportunity to talk about what individuals can do to help prevent addiction.

Addictions are very common, but they are very complicated to explain. They seem to depend on a lot of things:

- the drug or behaviour involved
- the person's psychology, biology, and genes
- the person's past experiences
- the person's life situation
- how available the drugs are to the person
- how acceptable the drug or behaviour is to the person, their friends, and society

Fortunately, there are things

that can help anyone avoid addiction:

- A person has choices. If they seem to be using a drug more and more in certain situations, they can look for ways to avoid those situations.
- If someone has a history of addiction in their family, it's wise to be extra alert and take the time to learn about that problem.
- Learn how addictive any drugs are. This includes alcohol, caffeine, and prescription drugs.
- With some drugs, like nicotine and heroin, the percentage of users who get addicted is so high that it's best not to use the drug at all.
- If someone is already having trouble with a drug or type of behaviour, they should go for help.

A number of resources are available to help individuals, families, schools and communities prevent through the Alberta Health Services Addiction Prevention Toolkit, visit www. ahs.ca. These resources include information on what individuals can to do for their mental well-being including self-care tips, a key in reducing the chance of addiction occurring.

Some examples of positive self-care include:

- Asking for help
- Treating yourself as you would treat a friend, with respect
 - Going for a walk
- Practicing gratitude
- Laughing often
- Understanding your emotions
- Embracing a new hobby.
