GREEN CART COLLECTION WINTER SCHEDULE STARTS NOVEMBER 14

The City of Leduc reminds homeowners of the upcoming changes to regular curbside pick-up program. Starting the week of Nov. 14, 2016, green organic carts will be emptied every two weeks until mid-April 2017 when the collection schedule re-

sumes to the weekly format.

The city offers the following tips to help residents keep their carts clean and well maintained throughout the winter months:

- Keep the cart lid closed
- Line the cart with approved 100 per cent compostable bags, paper towels or newspaper so other material doesn't stick to the bottom
- Wrap material in newspaper or soiled cardboard
- Alternate layers of 'brown' material such as leaves, shredded paper, cardboard or sawdust and 'green' material such food scraps
- Put the cart out for collection on scheduled collection days even if it isn't full

• Keep food scraps frozen until your collection day

"Items, such as food scraps, soiled paper and cardboard can be deposited into your green cart – yet clean and dry paper/cardboard should be placed in your blue bag as they can be recycled and remade into new products," says Kerra Chomlak, environmental sustainability co-ordinator

with the City of Leduc. "However, plastic bags must be placed into the black waste cart as they contaminate all the good organic waste you place in your green cart. Contaminated green carts are turned away and redirected for waste, which is something we all want to avoid."

Sorting organics helps Leduc work toward its residential waste diversion target of 65 per cent by 2020. At year-end 2015, Leduc

achieved 52 per cent residential waste diversion.

The City of Leduc publishes an Environmental Progress Report which can be found online (Leduc.ca) that provides a wide range of environmental initiatives and annual statistics on key milestones achieved within the city's environmental sustainability plan.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF NOVEMBER 14, 2016

This week in Parliament, we discussed the budget, the Canada Pension Plan, online access to violent sexual material, and controlled substances.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-16 An Act to amend the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Criminal Code
- Bill C-25 An Act to amend the Canada Business Corporations Act, the Canada Cooperatives Act, the

Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act, and the Competition Act (Second Reading)

- Bill C-26 An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, the Canada Pension Plan Investment Board Act and the Income Tax Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-29 Budget Implementation Act, 2016, No. 2 (Second Reading)
- Bill C-301 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act and to make a related amendment to another Act (registered retirement income fund) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-307 An Act to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act

(tamper resistance and abuse deterrence) (Second Reading)

- Bill C-309 Gender Equality Week Act (Second Reading)
- Motion 47 Instruction to the Standing Committee on Health (violent and sexual online material)
- Motion 64 Italian Heritage Month

As Parliament was down for the week, I attended events and meetings in the riding.

Last Saturday in Drayton Valley, I observed a province-wide rally against the Alberta NDP Carbon Tax Initiative. I believe the provincial and federal carbon tax grabs will chase away jobs and do nothing to achieve our national climate change goals.

I had meetings Monday morning in my Edson office, and later that evening I attended the celebration of Master Corporal Raymond Arndt. MCpl Arndt was killed in action during service in Afghanistan in August of 2006. He is remembered for his quick smile and his tenacity to follow what he loved.

LEDUC RCMP REPORTS

Leduc RCMP Apprehend Trailer Thieves - On November 11th 2016 at approximately 2:40 AM, the Leduc RCMP responded to a report of a cargo trailer being stolen. Police located the trailer attached to a truck within the City of Leduc. The female passenger was arrested on scene while the male driver fled. The Leduc RCMP contained the area and later located the male driver who was taken into custody without incident. The truck used in the theft was found to be stolen out of Rimbey, AB and contained assorted stolen property. Both suspects have been charged with numerous offences including Possession of Property Obtained by Crime. The Leduc RCMP wishes to remind the public to ensure they secure their property and report any suspicious activity to the RCMP.

Fatal Collision At Intersection Of Highway 39 And Highway 60 - At 2:24 PM on Sunday November 6th, 2016, Leduc RCMP and Calmar Fire Services responded to a fatal two vehicle collision at the intersection of Highway 60 and Highway 39 in Leduc County, Alberta. Upon arrival two people were found deceased in their vehicle. One person from another vehicle was transported to a nearby hospital in stable condition. An RCMP collision analyst attended the scene. The investigation into cause of the collision is ongoing.

26 Year Old Male Arrested For Possession Of A Weapon - On October 26, 2016 Leduc RCMP, with the assistance of the Leduc Integrated Traffic Unit and Airport RCMP members, responded to a call of a male brandishing a knife, threatening employees at a work site south of the Edmonton International Airport. The individual was apprehended without incident and subsequently charged with two counts of Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose and two counts of Assault with a Weapon. There were no injuries suffered by the victim or accused during this incident. The 26 year old male is scheduled to appear in Leduc Provincial Court December 15, 2016. The matter is still under investigation.

Apprehension of Escaped Prisoner – On October 25th, 2016, Leduc RCMP responded to a call for service at the CIBC bank on the corner of 50th Street and 50th Avenue, Leduc. There was a male reported inside believed to be wanted in connection with an investigation in Ontario of Escaping Lawful Custo-


dv. Members of the Leduc RCMP immediately attended the location and arrested Philip Robert Crosby (48yo) without incident. Crosby was wanted out of Ontario for Escaping Lawful Custody and currently faces multiple charges out of Saskatchewan, Alberta, and British Columbia which include Robbery with Violence, Personation with Intent, Impaired Driving, Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Breaching a Conditional Sentence Order and Criminal Flight. Crosby is currently being held in police custody pending a Judicial Interim Release Hearing. Police would like to thank the public for their on going assistance in making our communities safer.

Early Morning Fatal Motor Vehicle Collision - Shortly after 4:00 AM on Sunday, October 16th the Leduc RCMP and the City of Leduc Fire Services responded to a single vehicle collision on the corner of 50th Street and 54th Avenue in Leduc, AB. Upon arrival, a 20 year old female driver was found deceased in the car. Police have yet to determine the cause of the collision. The collision is still under investigation.

Social Media Safety - The Leduc RCMP has recently received reports from Leduc and the surrounding area of a social media scam. Vic-

tims are contacted through various social media platforms, with friend requests from unknown parties. In some cases, victims who accept these friend requests are then baited into providing compromising images of themselves, which are then being used to blackmail the victim. The blackmail includes demands for money, with the threat of the victim's compromising images being released to friends, family and posted on-line if they do not comply. The Leduc RCMP are encouraging all users on social media to exercise caution when accepting new friend requests, especially when private or compromising images are request-
