EVANSBURG RCMP SEEK ASSISTANCE IN LOCATING ATTEMPTED MURDER SUSPECTS

On November 19, at 2:53 a.m., Evansburg RCMP responded to an alarm at a rural residence and as a result, launched an investigation into an attempted murder and theft.

The RCMP were alerted that were was a home invasion and responded to locate a seriously injured 52-year-old male. He was transported to an Edmonton hospital. Information was received that three male suspects attacked him, searched his residence and then stole his truck and left him.

Investigation has resulted in

charges against 39-year-old Lisa Filewich of no fixed address. She is facing charges of attempted murder, theft over \$5,000 and possession of methamphetamine. A bail hearing has been held and she will remain in custody to attend court in Evansburg on November 28, 2016.

The RCMP are looking for three men who were involved in this attack. They are described as:

Suspect #1:

- Wearing a hoody
- Approximately 5'8" tall / 200 lbs
- Dark hair with 5 o'clock shadow on his face
- Tanned

Suspect #2:

- Wearing a hoody with a scarf covering his mouth
- Approximately 5'6" tall / 160
- · Black
- Possibly named "Reynolds" Suspect #3
- Smaller than the other two suspects, no other description

NOVEMBER IS SENIORS' FALLS PREVENTION MONTH

Let's face it; falls can happen to anyone at any time but the reality is, as we get older our risks of falling are greater. Falls are the leading cause of injury among older adults over the age of 65, and one in three Alberta seniors will fall once a year. Falls also result in reduced mobility as fears can increase over getting up

and moving around.

While staying in one place may reduce the risk of falling, it also negatively affects your quality of life. That's why the theme for this year's Senior's Fall Prevention month is Finding Balance – Stay Independent. Prevent Falls.

"Falls Prevention Month is a great time to remind everyone at every age about injury prevention. We're asking all Albertans to not only promote falls awareness for seniors, but for people at every age," says Teresa Curtis, health promotion facilitator, Provincial Injury Prevention Program. "The prevention of falls takes an intergenerational effort. We have an opportunity to be part of the solution and to educate others."

While Fall Prevention Month is geared to seniors, it's a good opportunity to remind all Albertans about the risk of falling. As temperatures drop, the risk of snow and ice increases. Every year, thousands of Albertans are hurt falling on icy roads and walkways.

Injury prevention experts say the best way to avoid falls on ice and snow is to waddle like a penguin.

- -Stay low
- -Feet pointed out
- -Walk flat footed
- -Use your arms for balance







CONSERVATIVES LAUNCH SOFTWOOD LUMBER TASK FORCE

OTTAWA: The Conservative Opposition is creating a Softwood Lumber Taskforce to hold the Liberal government to account for solving the softwood lumber trade dispute with the United States.

The Liberal Government has failed to strike a new softwood lumber agreement with the United States to replace the one-year interim deal that officially expired last week, leaving thousands employed in the forestry sector across Canada anxious and uneasy.

"The Prime Minister has failed to make a commitment to the Canadian forestry industry and his failure will affect every region of the country," said the Hon. Denis Lebel, Deputy Leader of the Official Opposition. "From British Columbia to Quebec, and certainly including the Atlantic provinces, each province could face significant job losses. This is particularly worrying in my riding, where about 70% of the economy is dependent on the lumber industry. The imposition of new tariffs on lumber exports will have devastating effects on an already fragile economy and it is unfortunate that Justin Trudeau and his Liberal colleagues remain unmoved by this situation.

The Liberal government's failure to get a new softwood lumber deal across the finish line is just another example of Justin Trudeau's selfie international trade policy," said the Hon. Gerry Ritz, Official Opposition Critic for International Trade. "After a year in government, the Liberals still refuse to take a decision on the TPP and the CETA with the European Union is under threat. Canadian exporters deserve stability and predictability from their government."

"We are a group of MPs who are tired of the Liberal government mismanaging this very important file," said Todd Doherty, Member of Parliament for Cariboo-Prince George. "We will make sure the Liberals don't forget about the workers and com-

munities affected by their trade war. We will talk to companies, workers and community leaders from coast to coast to coast, bring them together, and see if we can chart a path forward to solve this problem."

"My constituents and the forest industry deserve to know what their future will be. As a member of the Conservative Softwood Lumber Taskforce, I will continue to reach out to forestry companies, workers and municipal leaders in my Yellowhead riding in areas where forestry is the primary economic driver and will reach out to other stakeholders from coast to coast to solicit their recommendations for a solution", stated MP Eglinski.

The last softwood lumber dis-

pute cost the Canadian forestry sector \$5.3 billion and was settled by the previous Conservative government negotiating an agreement within three months of coming into office in 2006. It was also the previous Conservative government that negotiated an extension of the deal in 2012 to ensure market stability through to October 2016.

ALBERTA ANNOUNCES COAL TRANSITION ACTION

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The agreements will see the companies, which own six coal-fired electricity units originally slated to operate beyond 2030, provided with transition payments for investments that have been reduced in value by the transition away from coal-fired generation – funds that can be reinvested into Alberta's electricity market.

This approach is part of a larger government commitment to building a stable, reliable electricity system while ensuring that workers, communities and affected companies are supported and treated fairly during the transition from coal-fired electricity generation.

"The government's decision to provide transition payments to these companies demonstrates our commitment to building a low-priced, reliable, investment-friendly electricity system for Albertans. The government is committed to working with existing Alberta businesses as we transition away from coal, and we are making good on that commitment today." - Margaret McCuaig-Boyd, Energy Minister

This approach, which will be accompanied by additional action in support of coal communities, was recommended to the government by energy expert Terry Boston. The electricity companies will receive annual payments until 2030, totalling \$1.1 billion in 2016 dollars. The payments will be fully funded by Alberta's price on industrial carbon emissions – not by consumer electricity rates.

"I believe that these transition payments to support Alberta's commendable transition to a low-carbon economy will go a long way in securing a positive investment climate in Alberta." - Terry Boston, former executive vice president (power) of the Tennessee Valley Authority and Past President and CEO of PJM Interconnection

This approach reflects the three principles the government committed to in November 2015 for phasing out coal generation: maintaining reliability, encouraging investment and providing price stability for all Albertans. These agreements will ensure that Alberta will achieve objectives laid out in its Climate Leadership Plan and meet a recently announced federal requirement to phase out coal-fired electricity emissions by 2030.

"Alberta is by far the largest source of coal pollution in Canada, with greenhouse gas emissions that exceed the sum of every car from British Columbia to Manitoba. We are phasing out coal pollution in a measured, financially responsible way that will improve air quality and the health of Albertans." - Shannon Phillips, Minister Responsible for the

Climate Change Office

These agreements are a cost-effective way to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, with the total payments representing less than \$10\$/tonne of emissions eliminated. This represents approximately one-tenth of the government subsidy typically required to retrofit coal units with carbon capture and storage.

The government will work with the companies, the Government of Canada and affected communities to explore options for the future, including coal-to-gas transitions, hydro-electricity and economic development initiatives.

"This announcement will allow our Advisory Panel on Coal Communities to proceed with their mandate, which is to create long-term transition plans for communities to succeed and workers to have opportunities as Alberta moves to phase out coal-fired emissions by 2030." - Deron Bilous, Minister of Economic

Development and Trade
This announcement follows other gov-

ernment actions to guarantee Albertans a future supply of reliable power at stable, low prices. They include:

- Putting a price cap of 6.8 cents per kilowatt hour in place for families and small businesses on the Regulated Rate Option from June 2017 until June 2021
- Announcing the creation of an electricity capacity market by 2021

"Ending coal pollution in Alberta will save lives, prevent chronic heart and lung diseases, make breathing easier for those with asthma and reduce healthcare costs by reducing emergency room visits and hospital admissions. We found an accelerated Alberta phase-out will prevent 600 premature deaths and 500 emergency room visits and will avoid nearly \$3 billion in negative health outcomes." - Kim Perrotta, Executive Director Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment (CAPE)

The government also announced that it has reached a settlement with Capital Power on its litigation associated with Power Purchase Arrangements.
