BACKGROUND: RCMP Investigate Threats At Local School

Stony Plain, Alta. – On the afternoon of December 1, 2016 at 1:00 PM, Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP were notified of a potential threat directed toward a student at the Memorial Composite High School.

The RCMP responded immediately to investigate these concerns. At approximately 3:15 PM the Memorial Composite High School was set into lock down as a precaution while policed combed the area/and cleared the school looking for the suspect. The lock down has since been lifted and most of the students/staff have left the building.

Administration at the Memorial Composite High School and the Parkland School Division were advised immediately of this concern and prepared/distributed communication to Parents. At no time was any member of the public, school personnel or affected students at risk.

## YELLOWHEAD COUNTY DECLARES A STATE OF AGRICULTURAL DISASTER

Yellowhead County, Alberta, November 22, 2016 – The number of acres unharvested and the extent of the damage within Yellowhead County has prompted Council to join with their neighbouring municipalities to declare a state of agricultural disaster.

"There are many years where growing conditions are perfect for farmers to have a highly productive season – this, unfortunately, was not one of them," said Yellowhead County Mayor Gerald Soroka.

New data from recent crop reports have shown that many Yellowhead County agriculture producers have been heavily impacted by the consistently wet conditions this year. Many crops are still sitting under snow as there was never an opportunity for farmers to harvest their crops.

Based on crop reports the following judgments have been made: cereals are ranked definite disaster as 50% of the crop is still in the field. Oil seeds crops are 24% in swath and 21% standing, again approaching definite disaster thresholds. Hay crops are cut and baled over most of the County; however, much of it is sitting in the field as they cannot remove the bales due to saturated soils.

"Our council has made this decision to declare a state of agricultural disaster to help bring awareness to this situation," said Soroka. "This decision came after we received input from our Agricultural Services Board, local producers, and is based on research done by our staff using the latest data from crop reports and visual inspections."

"We are encouraging the province to review existing support programs with an aim to enhance or create new programs and to provide timely assistance to producers."

Yellowhead County will send a letter to the provincial government about the declaration of a state of Agricultural Disaster and request a disaster recovery program and support programs be available to address this issue.

Week of November 21, 2016

This week in Parliament, we discussed trade, hate crimes, palliative care, and the boundaries of national parks.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-18 - An Act to amend the Rouge National Urban Park Act, the Parks Canada Agency Act and the Canada National Parks Act (Second Reading)

• Bill C-25 – An Act to amend the Canada Business Corporations Act, the Canada Cooperatives Act, the Canada Not-for -profit Corporations Act, and the Competition Act (Second Reading)

• Bill C-30 - Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement Implementation Act (Second Reading)

• Bill C-274 - An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (transfer of small business or family farm or fishing corporation) (Second Reading)

• Bill C-277 - Framework on Palliative Care in Canada Act (Second Reading)

• Bill C-305 - An Act to amend the Criminal Code (mischief) (Second Reading)

• Motion No. 69 - Water quality • Motion No. 73 - German Heritage Month

• Bill C-238 - National Strategy for Safe Disposal of Lamps Containing Mercury Act (Report Stage)

• Bill C-245 - Poverty Reduction Act (Second Reading)

• Bill S-211 - National Sickle Cell Awareness Day Act (Second Reading)

• Bill S-217 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code (detention in custody) (Second Reading)

• Bill S-228 - An Act to amend the Fisheries Act (closed containment aquaculture) (Second Reading)

• Opposition Day Motion - Cuba · Report of the Standing Committee

on Justice and Human Rights in relation to proposed Bill C-242, An Act to amend the Criminal Code (inflicting torture).



## YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

November 22, 2016

Wildwood Fire Hall – Council approved the proposal from BR2 Architecture for the design, tendering, and construction supervision of the proposed new fire hall in Wildwood slated to begin construction in 2017.

Robb Sanitary Force Main -



Council for Yellowhead County awarded the contract for the Hamlet of Robb Sanitary Force main replacement to Streamline Industries in the amount of \$ 709,398.00. The installation will be completed using Horizontal Directional Drilling. The accepted bid was the lowest of the eight bids received that met the contract's requirements.

Declaration of Agricultural Disaster – Council declared a state of Agricultural Disaster due to the current condition of many of the crops in Yellowhead County. The decision was based on recent crop reports where data showed excessive moisture on many crops in Yellowhead County, as well as discussions with producers and visual inspections by staff.

Parkland County Fire Services Agreement – Yellowhead County will enter into a new Fire Services agreement with Parkland County where they will contribute \$325,000 per year for services from Yellowhead County's Fire Department. Yellowhead County will provide resources to incidents in Parkland in the geographical areas covered under the agreement.

Member-at-Large Board Appointments – Council appointed George Webster to the Heritage Advisory Board for a 3-year term and Ryan Gylander to the Agricultural Services Board for a 2-year term. These boards provide advice to Council and administration on issues specific to each of their respective boards and review and approve grants and funding to community organizations from funds budgeted by Council for activities related to these areas.

The next Council Meetings is December 13, 2016. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is December 20, 2016. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.




