GRANT PROGRAMS IMPROVE ACCESS FOR NON-PROFITS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

"Investment Alberta's in non-profit and voluntary sector helps to build strong families and communities and creates new business and employment opportunities. Changes to both CFEP and CIP will help better meet the needs of non-profits by addressing funding gaps, streamlining access and providing clarity to the grants process. For Albertans, these changes mean greater transparency, accountability and effective use of resources, and a greater return on public dollars." - Ricardo Miranda, Minister of Culture and Tourism

Community Facility Enhancement Program

This program helps support construction and renovation of public-use community facilities. Two distinct grant funding streams have been established.

- the Small Funding Stream provides a maximum of \$125,000 in project support.
- the new Large Funding Stream will support projects of more than \$125,000 to a maximum of \$1 million.

Community Initiatives Pro-

gram

- A new Major Cultural and Sport Events stream will support national and international events with significant community benefit, such as boosting the local economy and helping tourism grow. A maximum grant of \$250,000 will be available to eligible applicants.
- Funding of the International Development grant stream has been increased to help Alberta-based non-profits involved in international development projects and also to address growing program demand.

"We are pleased the Community Grants program engaged with the non-profit sector to redesign funding programs that will be based on clear principles, well defined outcomes, and enhanced value of volunteerism. It will provide equitable opportunity for the sector." - Jann Beeston, Executive Director. Volunteer Alberta

Guidelines and applications have been updated to reflect the changes and are available online at: culture.alberta.ca/community/community-grants. The new approach comes into effect on December 15 to allow applicants to fully benefit from the positive changes, such as increased hourly rates for donated labour.

The changes stem from an extensive internal review of the Community Grants program and discussions with non-profit-sector partners and previous grant recipients.

The review highlighted the fact that Community Grants programs provide equitable distribution of funding across the province to help stimulate local economic activity, and that funding programs are flexible, simple, and support community infrastructure.

ALBERTA RCMP REMIND HUNTERS OF SAFE HUNTING PRACTICES

Edmonton, Alta - With hunting season now in full swing, the RCMP is reminding Alberta's outdoor adventurers and hunters to take the steps required to ensure their safety when they venture off the beaten track. Over the past few weeks there have been at least three cases of individuals forced to spend the night outside after becoming lost or stranded in remote areas. Fortunately, these individuals were located before suffering serious injury.

The RCMP is asking Albertans to equip themselves with the supplies they may require in the event they find themselves lost or stranded in the bush, which include warm clothing, fire starters, food, medication, light source and a fully-charged cell phone.

"Nobody thinks it can happen to them, but it can. At this time of year, a snowmobile or ATV breakdown in the middle of nowhere can be fatal if you don't have the supplies you need to survive until help arrives," said RCMP Sergeant Jack Poitras. "Many remote areas do not have cell phone coverage, so it is critical that someone knows where you are going and when you expect to be back."

On October 10 at 3:45 p.m., a group of three individuals called 911 to report they were stranded after their 4x4 vehicle became stuck in marshland in a remote area outside of Boyle, Alberta. Having safely exited the vehicle, the group became disoriented



while walking back to safety and called 911. Weather at the time was near freezing with light flurries and freezing rain. Boyle RCMP, Fire Department and EMS worked together to successfully locate the group who were treated for exposure and safely evacuated from the area at 8:45 p.m.

On October 10, 2016 at 1:00 a.m. three hunters reported missing were located 30 km north of Peavine Métis Settlement by

other hunters, after spending 30 hours outside in a deeply forested area that has no cell phone coverage. Fortunately the hunters were unharmed.

On September 22, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. workers on an oil lease site 50 km northwest of Peavine Métis Settlement located a hunter who had spent overnight outside after his ATV broke down. When he was reported missing, his family was particularly concerned as he did

not have his medication with him when he set out. The hunter was in good health when locat-

The RCMP is also reminding hunters to avoid leaving firearms in unattended vehicles. To date in 2016, of the 109 firearm thefts reported to the Alberta RCMP throughout the province, 39 involved thieves breaking into vehicles to steal guns. The 2016 numbers are consistent with those at this time last year.



From Nov. 26 to Dec. 2, students across four different schools in West Parkland County attended the Career and Technology Foundations Program (CTF). Unlike other years, this year offered a new and exciting program known as "Learn to Respond." Students in Grades 8 and 9 could apply for a smaller 12-person class that would provide students an opportunity to learn useful real world skills as well as explore an exciting career in the Emergency Services.

The idea came about when Parkland County Community Peace Officer Jean Hoffman contacted Tomahawk teacher Robyn Pandachuck to discuss education opportunities for Parkland area Junior High students. Together they decided the week-long CTF would be a great opportunity to offer students an interactive learning option. With the help of adjoining agencies and departments "Learn to Respond" was born.

Day Four:


The students spent the day with the Seba Beach Fire Department, planning an emergency fire plan for their families. The students also had the opportunity to "gear up," use a fire extin-

To end their exciting week, stu-












thank all those involved who made this program possible, and congratulate the students on all their hard work at "Learn to Respond" at CTF.

TOXIC OPIOID CARFENTANIL LINKED TO 15 DEATHS

Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Karen Grimsrud, and Acting Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Elizabeth Brooks-Lim are notifying the public that the toxic opioid carfentanil is still circulating in our province and has been linked to 15 drug overdose deaths.

Fourteen of those 15 deaths occurred between September and the end of November.

"I am deeply concerned about the increasing number of deaths associated with carfentanil. It's possible these individuals were not aware they were taking it. Albertans need to know that carfentanil is here – in Alberta cities and towns – and that it's an extremely dangerous and deadly opioid. Even the smallest trace can be lethal." - Dr. Karen Grimsrud, Chief Medical Officer of Health

"The increasing number of deaths due to this dangerous drug is concerning to us, and we will continue to work closely with our health partners, as part of sharing information and raising awareness of opioids misuse. The Alberta Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is one of only a very small number of toxicology laboratories in Canada that is able to positively identify carfentanil in human blood." - Dr. Elizabeth Brooks-Lim, Acting Chief Medical Examiner

Alberta remains focused on harm reduction as it moves forward with a co-ordinated and collaborative provincial response to the opioid crisis.

When combined with prevention, treatment and enforcement, a broad spectrum of harm reduction approaches will help decrease harmful consequences of drug use to keep people alive.

If you are using these types of drugs:

- Don't use them alone and make sure you are near someone who can call for help.
- Don't mix them with other drugs or alcohol.
- It you suspect someone is overdosing, don't wait. Dial 911 right away.
- Carry a naloxone kit. Know how to use it to save someone's life. Make sure your buddy knows how to use it to save yours. Naloxone is a temporary fix you still need to call 911.
- Most importantly, know there are resources available to help you whether you are using drugs for the first time or have used them frequently.
- If you're concerned about your own or someone else's use of illicit drugs, call the Addiction Helpline (24 hours a day, seven days a week) at 1-866-332-2322, or Health Link at 811.

Provincial response to opioid crisis

• Working closely with other Alberta government ministries, health experts, community groups, parent advocates, law enforcement and the medical community, the Chief Medical Officer of Health is leading a collaborative and co-ordinated provincial response, focused on four key areas:

- 1. Improving the collection and publishing of data to better target interventions
- 2. Expanding access to opioid replacement therapy.
- 3. Funding community agencies to assess the need for supervised consumption services.
- 4. Promoting appropriate opioid prescribing and implementing new tools to prevent prescription drug misuse, in partnership with the College of Physi-

cians and Surgeons of Alberta.

- Publicly funded take-home naloxone kits are available at more than 900 registered sites, including community pharmacies.
- A new public awareness social-media campaign has been rolled out. It explains how to use naloxone to prevent overdose deaths and on where people can get naloxone free of charge.
- Grant funding is being provided to Access to Medically Supervised Injection Services Edmonton to support community engagement and the development of an application for a federal exemption to offer supervised consumption services in Edmonton's inner city.
- The province has invested \$3 million over the next three years for an opioid dependency treatment (ODT) expansion project. Work is under way to increase access to opioid replacement therapy in Alberta Health Services ODT clinics.
- The province has provided "Proceeds of Crime" grants totalling \$240,000 to police and their community partners to raise awareness of the dangers of fentanyl and other illicit drugs.
- Legislation will come into effect in January 2017 to regulate pill presses to enhance enforcement for illicit fentanyl manufacturing.

School Highlights - TLC & Fulham School

Stuart Graham, principal of The Learning Connection Centres (TLC), spoke to the board about a new system for students to independently register online for courses. He also discussed a possible new teen parent program that is in the planning stages for Hinton. Mr. Graham was also joined by Barb Schmidt from the Palisades Stewardship Education Centre in Jasper National Park. Ms. Schmidt shared the many exciting sessions offered at the Centre in partnership with TLC including a new 'Rock and Pop' program offered during the summer of 2016 where 18 students earned 7 credits over 10 days.

School joined today's Public Board Meeting by video conference to share what they think is great about Fulham School such as their great teachers, breakfast program, Pancake Day 'as who doesn't love pancakes!' and their enjoyment using their playground and indoor gym equipment.

Capital Projects Update
Facility Services provided their

two current capital projects in the division: the modernization project for Grande Cache Community High School (GCCHS) and the replacement school in Edson.

GCCHS: Masonry and structural steel is continuing and should be completed in November. The mezzanine slab has been poured allowing for the installation of the mechanical units. The roof and other building envelope activities have started with the goal of all roof work being completed in December.

Edson: Installation of the grade beams has been completed and the underground services are finished, including town utility connections. Masonry block work will start in November on the gymnasium and steel work should begin in early December.

Other News in Brief

- Trustees approved the 2016-19 Three Year Education Plan and the 2015-2016 Annual Education Results Report. The report guides the division in developing strategies and goals for the upcoming three years as well as reports on the results from last year's Accountability Pillar Surveys. The document will be posted on the GYPSD website as of November 30, 2016.
- · An amended agreement with Xerox Canada will provide the division with new technology to replace existing devices at schools to enhance the print and document management technology. Additionally the vendor will implement software solutions for the transportation department to automate the fuel expense management process with the potential of providing other software solutions to other areas in the division. The amended agreement, expiring August 31, 2021, will also cumulate cost savings for the division.

- Each fall the board receives an update on the current budget for the division which is adjusted to reflect changes in enrolments, and resulting changes in the distribution of resources. Total enrolments for kindergarten and Grades 1-12 are lower than anticipated due to the overall economic situation and families moving out of the division's operating region, especially regarding Grande Cache.
- Stuart Graham, principal of The Learning Connection, gave a presentation to trustees on their successful summer school programming which has been offered to students over the last several years to assist students in high school completion. Over 300 students registered for summer courses ranging from math to work experience opportunities.
- · Take Your Kids to Work Day was on November 2, 2016 and Grande Yellowhead students have participated in the program for the past 22 years. Take Our Kids to Work is an annual, national program in which Grade 9 students are hosted by parents, relatives and volunteers at workplaces across the country. Almost 300 students across the division took part this year with many positive comments received from the parents, the many businesses involved and from the students themselves including one comment "I never knew my dad worked so hard!"
- The board received a report regarding an update on the implementation of Regional Collaborative Service Delivery Models (RCSD) for the division. GYPSD belongs to 3 different RCSD regions: Aspen Collaborative Services RCSD encompasses the areas of Hinton, Jasper and Edson and it covers schools from Fox Creek to Athabasca; Grande Cache schools belong to the Peace Collaborative Services RCSD and covers

schools from Grande Cache to Peace River; and Wildwood and Evansburg schools fall within the Parkland Evergreen and Area RCSD which includes schools from Wildwood to Spruce Grove. A change to the Aspen Collaborative boundary to include schools in Wildwood and Evansburg is currently being queried. For the 2016-2017 school year, each RCSD zone in GYPSD will be focused on maximizing resources and enhancing services through collab-

oration. Each zone will continue to work with school staff, families and service providers to ensure students can be successful. Each zone uses a school linked team framework, focused on the professional services of speech language pathologists, occupational therapists and mental health within a student centered, flexible approach. Each team offers direct, consultative and collaborative services.

• During the 2015-2016 school year, GYPSD hosted five inter-

national students in Jasper Junior/Senior High School from Germany and Spain, and four international students in Harry Collinge High School (Hinton) from Spain and Mexico. International students attend from one semester to fulltime as well as participate in short term programs from 4 to 12 weeks.

• Trustees received an update on staffing positions across the division for the 2016-17 school year.

SEARCH WARRANT LEADS TO CHARGES

On November 29, 2016, members of the Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain/ Enoch Serious Crimes Unit executed a Search Warrant at a Parkland Village residence. During the search police located cocaine, psilocybin (magic mushrooms), Bromazepam tablets, Codeine tablets processed marihuana and mature marihuana plants with grow op. equipment/ Trafficking paraphernalia.

In addition to the above several firearms were seized during the

search which included a loaded handgun, three shotguns (one loaded), two rifles, and a revolver. Police also located and seized a stun gun, prohibited switchblade knife, a police scanner, several hundred rounds of ammunition of various calibers and Canadian currency in relation to the investigation.

Four occupants were placed in custody. Two of the occupants were released without charge. The two people determined to be the residents: Jesse BECK and Hillary JOHNSON, have been charged jointly with the following offences:

-Possession of cocaine for the purpose of trafficking Sec. (5(2) CDSA.

-Possession of marihuana for the purpose of trafficking Sec. (5(2) CDSA.

-Possession of codeine for the purpose of trafficking Sec. 5(2) CDSA.

-Possession of bromazepam for the purpose of trafficking Sec.5(2) CDSA.

-Production of marihuana Sec.7 CDSA.

- Production of marihuana Sec. 7 (1) CDSA

-Possession of magic mush-rooms Sec.4(1) CDSA.

-Careless storage of a restricted firearm Sec. 95(b) CC.

-Possession of a prohibited firearm Sec. 91(2) CC.

-Possession of a prohibited weapon X 2 Sec. 91(2) CC.

-Careless storage of a non-restricted firearm Sec.86(2) CC.

-Careless storage of ammunition Sec.86(1) CC.

-Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000 Sec. 355(b) CC.

Both JOHNSON and BECK are to appear at the Stony Plain Provincial Court on December 7, 2016.


About 110,000 families have received their first payment under the new Alberta Child Benefit (ACB) program, helping to support the well-being of an estimated 200,000 children.

Families will receive the next ACB payment starting today. All families earning less than \$41,220 per year in net income, including those receiving AISH and Income Support, are eligible. The maximum annual benefit is up to \$1,100 for families with one child and up to \$2,750 for families with four or more children.

Families who have not yet filed their 2015 tax return are urged to do so to benefit from support programs such as the ACB. Community organizations hold free tax clinics each year to prepare returns for eligible lower-income taxpayers. The Canada Revenue Agency's website has more information about

these clinics.

The program was first announced in November 2015, along with enhancements to the Alberta Family Employment Tax Credit (AFETC). It is estimated that about 15,000 additional families, with an estimated 30,000 children, have begun to receive benefits through the enhanced AFETC.

Quick facts

• To qualify for the ACB, families must file a tax return, have lived in Alberta for

at least one month, and have at least one child under 18.

- The ACB is a non-taxable, refundable benefit, meaning families benefit regardless of whether they pay provincial income tax.
- Albertans' eligibility and benefit amounts for AISH, Income Support and Child Care Subsidy are not affected.
- Families will receive the new ACB in four payments – in August, November, February and May of each benefit year.
