# ARREST MADE IN COUNTERFEIT CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

### Submitted by Whitecourt RCMP

Whitecourt, Alberta. - RCMP Police in Whitecourt, Alberta have made an arrest in the investigation of a substantial number of counterfeit currency transactions in the area in the fall of 2016.

A number of businesses in Whitecourt and surrounding areas were hit hard with counterfeit Canadian currency in the fall of 2016. On December 25th, 2016, RCMP in Whitecourt located a 19 year-old male

and arrested him on outstanding warrants.

Faron Loy Valan, aged 19, appeared before a justice of the peace and has been released to appear in Whitecourt again on January 24th, 2017. Valan has been charged with five (5) counts of passing counterfeit currency contrary to section 452 (a) of the Criminal Code.

You do not have to reveal your identity to Crime Stoppers, and if you provide information to Crime Stoppers that leads to an arrest, the recovery of stolen property, and/or the seizure of illicit drugs, you may be eligible for a cash reward. Crime Stoppers does not subscribe to call display and the identity of the caller will remain anonymous.

### **INFLUENZA SEASON**

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

It happens every fall: influenza arrives in Alberta, and takes a serious toll on our communities.

Influenza is a real threat. It's also preventable.

Influenza immunization will be made available, starting October 24, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older.

It's the single most effective means of reducing your risk of influenza, particularly when you receive it as early in the season as possible. By getting immunized early, you will give your body the opportunity to respond to immunization, and produce antibodies that will arm you against the influenza viruses you'll be exposed to again throughout the season.

Each year, influenza vaccine is developed to protect us against the strains of virus likely to circulate in our community. Though vaccine effectiveness may vary, know this: last season, influenza vaccine cut Albertan's risk of influenza by half. Without immunization, Albertans were completely at risk.

And we do mean all Albertans. Although some individuals (pregnant women, seniors, children, and individuals with underlying health conditions or compromised immune systems) are at greater risk for severe complications, without immunization, even healthy Albertans are at risk of severe illness and even death.

62 Albertans died with influenza last season, and more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized

Let's do better this year.

Prevention is your protection. Get immunized this season.



December 20, 2016

Whitecourt will be forwarding a letter to the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry requesting that the Province waive the invoice for mutual aid assistance from the April 26, 2016 wildland fire. The wildland fire, which

was located in the south-east valley area, was quickly extinguished and did not spread to nearby residential and business areas. The spring of 2016 was an exceptional fire season for the province, and many communities in Alberta were faced with wildland fire emergencies.

The Town of Whitecourt has

completed its annual review of the Policy Manual. Each year the document is reviewed to ensure the policies that guide the municipality are still relevant and allow for efficient and effective service to the community. The document is available for viewing on www.whitecourt.ca.

You're not alone. Every year, people set goals wanting to change their lifestyle.

To get into action, the first step is to jot down ideas for changes you want to make. From this list, pick one that you feel ready to start. Then make it a SMART goal.

Deciding to lose weight is a goal that many people choose. To make it a SMART goal, focus on behaviour you will do every day, instead of the outcome (weight loss).

A SMART goal is:

- Specific: Decide what you are going to do and how to do it.
- Measurable: Keep track of how you are doing.
- Attainable: Pick something you think you can do.
- Rewarding: Think of how good you will feel when you make small changes.
- Timely : Give yourself a time

Using the SMART guidelines can help you to set a goal that is within reach. Changing too many things at once can be overwhelming. To make lasting changes, work on what you can stick with. A SMART goal example is packing a lunch that includes vegetables at least three days

of the week.

### WHITECOURT RCMP ARREST MALE IN EARLY-MORNING BREAK-IN AND THEFTS FROM VEHICLES

Whitecourt, Alberta - On December 28th, 2016 shortly after 6 a.m., a resident of Whitecourt on Rivers Place heard someone entering her home unlawfully and called police. An adult male suspect fled after entering the garage portion of the home when the home alarm sounded

While investigating the break-in,

police were alerted to several thefts from vehicles along River Place and nearby homes. A stolen credit card and a stolen debit card were used by the suspect at local businesses shortly after these thefts.

Police tracked an adult male suspect to a rental property, where some of the freshly-stolen property was in plain view. The male was arrested and will appear before a justice of the peace later today.

Further investigation revealed this

same male was involved in a domestic violence episode involving a knife on the 26th of December in Whitecourt, and a further theft with violence on the 22nd of December in Swan Hills, Alberta.

Investigation into these offences is on-going and police are actively returning stolen property to victims. The adult male, formerly of Red Deer, Alberta, is known to police.

A subsequent press release will be issued with details of the offender.



# PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF DECEMBER 12, 2016

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

We enjoyed a short, but busy, week in the House of Commons as we prepared for the winter break. We discussed Budget 2016, the Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), the criminal code, and registered retirement income funds.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-29 Budget Implementation Act, 2016, No. 2
- Bill C-30 An Act to implement the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union and its Member States and to provide for certain other measures (Second Reading)
- Bill C-31 An Act to implement the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and Ukraine (Second Reading)
- Bill C-235 An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Corrections and Conditional Release

Act (fetal alcohol disorder) (Defeated at Second Reading)

- Bill C-301 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act and to make a related amendment to another Act (registered retirement income fund) (Second Reading)
- Bill S-4 Tax Convention and Arrangement Implementation Act, 2016 (Passed)

I am pleased to inform you that a motion many of you have been following, M-47, has been unanimously passed. This motion by MP Arnold Viersen instructs the Standing Committee on Health "... to examine the public health effects of the ease of access and viewing of online violent and degrading sexually explicit material on children, women and men." This is a great initiative, as Parliament has not studied the effects of violent sexually explicit material since the 1985 Special Committee on Pornography and Prostitution.

In the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI), we continued to study Bill C-18, An Act to amend the Rouge National Urban Park Act, the Parks Canada Agency Act and the Canada National Parks Act. We also discussed federal protected areas and conservation objectives. For more information on these meetings, visit:




