PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF DECEMBER 12, 2016

We enjoyed a short, but busy, week in the House of Commons as we prepared for the winter break. We discussed Budget 2016, the Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), the criminal code, and registered retirement income funds.

The following was debated in the

House

- Bill C-29 Budget Implementation Act, 2016, No. 2
- Bill C-30 An Act to implement the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union and its Member States and to provide for certain other measures (Second Reading)
- Bill C-31 An Act to implement the Free Trade Agreement between Canada and Ukraine (Second Read-

ing)

- Bill C-235 An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Corrections and Conditional Release Act (fetal alcohol disorder) (Defeated at Second Reading)
- Bill C-301 An Act to amend the Income Tax Act and to make a related amendment to another Act (registered retirement income fund) (Second Reading)
- Bill S-4 Tax Convention and Arrangement Implementation Act, 2016 (Passed)

I am pleased to inform you that a motion many of you have been following, M-47, has been unanimously passed. This motion by MP Arnold Viersen instructs the Standing Committee on Health ". . . to examine the public health effects of the ease of access and viewing of online violent and degrading sexually explicit material on children, women and men." This is a great initiative, as Parliament has not studied the effects of violent sexually explicit material since the 1985 Special Committee on Pornography

and Prostitution.

On Tuesday, I participated in the debate on C-31. You can read my comments and questions at: http://www.parl.gc.ca/content/hoc/House/421/Debates/127/HAN127-E.PDF (pages 31 to 33).

In the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI), we continued to study Bill C-18, An Act to amend the Rouge National Urban Park Act, the Parks Canada Agency Act and the Canada National Parks Act. We also discussed federal protected areas and conservation objectives. For more information on these meetings, visit: www.parl.gc.ca/Committees/en/ENVI

This week, I attended 7 meetings and 3 events. I will be back in the riding to attend an event on Friday evening.

As Parliament adjourned for winter break on Wednesday evening, I want to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and a safe holiday season. My next update will be in the New Year.

You're not alone. Every year, people set goals wanting to change their lifestyle.

To get into action, the first step is to jot down ideas for changes you want to make. From this list, pick one that you feel ready to start. Then make it a SMART goal.

Deciding to lose weight is a goal that many people choose. To make it a SMART goal, focus on behaviour you will do every day, instead of the outcome (weight loss).

A SMART goal is:

- Specific: Decide what you are going to do and how to do it.
- Measurable: Keep track of how you are doing.
- Attainable: Pick something you think you can do.
- Rewarding: Think of how good you will feel when you make small changes.
- Timely : Give yourself a time limit.

Using the SMART guidelines can help you to set a goal that is within reach. Changing too many things at once can be overwhelming. To make lasting changes, work on what you can stick with. A SMART goal example is packing a lunch that in-

cludes vegetables at least three days of the week.

Once you've set your goals, think about what might prevent you from achieving your goals. This can help you plan ways to get around barriers. For example, if your goal is to pack a lunch that includes vegetables, your barrier may be that your weeknights are always busy and this prevents you from cutting up vegetables. To work around this barrier,

you could wash and cut up vegetables on Sunday night and pack them for the week. It takes a bit of planning, but a little thought and time up front will help you achieve your goal.

Remember to reward yourself and to monitor your progress. Celebrate when you stick to your goal for a month. If your plan isn't working, take time to ask yourself why, and adjust the plan so you can make it happen.

No matter how committed you are to reaching your goals, attempting too many changes all at once is not realistic. Set goals that you know you can achieve; achieving those goals can give you the confidence to set new ones. Wishing you a happy, healthy 2017!

SCHOOL BUS INCIDENT YELLOW-**HEAD** COUNTY

At approximately 4pm on Monday, December 12, 2016, students travelling home on a school bus travelling on Highway 748 were involved in a minor collision on its regular route from Edson schools. Emergency services personnel assessed all people involved as a pre-cautionary measure before students were released onsite to another bus to be taken home although some families chose to pick up their students onsite. Five students were sent to the local hospital for further assessment as a pre-cautionary measure before being released that evening.

We take very seriously the trust that families place into us in ensuring that their children are kept safe and secure, especially when travelling on our school buses.

Grande Yellowhead does have emergency crisis protocols to follow including a call out to 911 services although each situation is unique, and the steps taken may be different each time. However, at no time should any child or staff member under our care be subject to any undue risk, including access to emergency medical assistance if needed.

When incidents such as Monday's accident, are currently under internal investigation as well as from the R.C.M.P., it is not the division's policy to discuss details until the investigations are completed. On Tuesday, December 13th, Grande Yellowhead contacted Yellowhead County representatives to arrange a meeting for Thursday, December 15th to specifically discuss what had happened. We also welcome the opportunity to investigate any changes in protocols to ensure alignment of future expectations from both our organizations. We continue to look forward to working together with all our community partners to ensure the health and safety of all.
