## STRUCTURE FIRE, **SUMMER VILLAGE** OF YELLOWSTONE

At thirty-four minutes after midnight Onoway Regional Fire Services - Canada's first Hybrid Fire Service was dispatched to a structure fire on fifth street in the Summer Village of Yellowstone. The first units were rolling to scene within 2-minutes with the

first unit arriving on scene in under ten minutes.

The young family residing in the home safely evacuated with no injuries. Thanks to quick 911 notification and fast use of a fire extinguisher the fire was in a smouldering state with no flames showing when fire crews arrived.

After exposing hidden fires and thorough search for fire ex-



tension, Onoway Regional Fire Services cleared the home of all smoke and returned property to its residents with minor damage.

"Like many others, I work in Edmonton. The choir is a way for me to remain connected to my home community. It also provides artistic expression for members and enjoyment

for concert attendees."

The next season of the Lac Ste. Anne Community Choir begins Wednesday, January 11. Registration begins at 6:15 p.m. at the Heritage Centre in Alberta Beach (5012 - 49 Avenue). The area of origin appeared to be the subfloor below a main-floor wood-burning fireplace. However, the exact point of flame contact or heat transfer is currently classified as undetermined.

Three apparatus and eleven firefighters were dispatched to this fire along with an initial response from Alberta Health Services and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, as well as the electric and gas utility companies.

Onoway Regional Fire Services and North West Fire Rescue would like to remind everyone that smoke alarms save lives and can limit property damage. They urge you to check to ensure that there is a working alarm on every level of the home. For those with wood-burning appliances, they recommend you to have your chimney cleaned annually and fireplace inspected every five-years.

# ALBERTA HELPS NON-PROFITS SAVE MONEY

Organizations can save money and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by determining areas for energy efficiency improvements.

The Non-Profit Energy Efficiency Transition (NEET) Program will provide funding to help non-profit and volunteer groups determine how efficient their current lighting, heating, cooling and hot water systems

are. Equipped with audit information, agencies can then take advantage of Energy Efficiency Alberta's Business, Non-Profit and Institutional Rebate Program, which offers incentives for the purchase and installation of high-efficiency products.

"This grant is another example of carbon levy revenues being meaningfully reinvested back into Alberta. We are ensuring that non-profit and volunteer groups receive the tools and supports they need to lower

costs, protect the environment and continue to do admirable work that improves the lives of Albertans. Energy efficiency is a cost-effective and accessible pathway for these organizations to play a role in Alberta's ambitious Climate Leadership Plan." - Shannon Phillips, Minister Responsible for the Climate Change Office

The Business, Non-Profit and Institutional Rebate Program is one of several programs offered by Energy Efficiency Alberta – a provincial agency established as part of Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan. # CARBON LEVY REBATES BENEFIT MILLIONS OF ALBERTANS

Deputy Premier Sarah Hoffman met with an Edmonton family that received a rebate under the program.

"The carbon price is a made-in-Alberta solution that protects pocketbooks with rebates for 66 per cent of Albertans to help our most vulnerable and ensures that we get pipelines built. We are committed to providing Albertans with the support they need to use energy more efficiently and save money." - Sarah Hoffman, Deputy Premier

The rebate program helps lower- and middle-income families adjust to the additional costs of carbon. Families will also be able to take advantage of energy-efficiency programs that will start as early as spring 2017.

The carbon levy rebate is expected to recycle \$95 million back to Alberta households in 2016-17 and \$435 million in 2017-18.

**Quick facts** 

- In 2017, 60 per cent of households are expected to receive a full rebate to help offset the costs of the carbon levy:
- A single adult earning up to \$47,500 per year will receive a rebate of \$200.
- A couple earning up to \$95,000 per year will receive \$300.
- Parents that qualify for the rebate will receive up to an additional \$30 per child (to a maximum of four).
- Rebates will increase in 2018, along with the carbon levy, to \$300 for singles, \$450 for couples, and \$45 per child.
- You do not have to apply to receive the rebate, but you must file your 2015 and subsequent income tax returns to be eligible.
- The rebate is non-taxable and also refundable, meaning you will receive it even if you pay no provincial income taxes.

A website was mentioned; The Greengate Garden Center in Calgary has information on how to choose your site and how to lay down pond liner etc.

April 25-Mike Desmarais, who is the superintendent of the Trestle Creek Golf Resort, talked of Turfgrass Care in Rural Landscapes. Mike was very knowledgeable and we left at the end of the night with a lot of useful information. Did you know that adding molasses to a compost pile aides in decomposing it?

May 23-The Sundial Park and Sangudo spring clean-up. This is a way to spruce up Sangudo with the spirit of community connection.

May 28- The location of our annual plant sale was changed to the Sangudo Community Hall. We have both perennials and annuals for sale yearly, and our membership who attend are willing to answer questions from the public.

June -Held the chance for our members to do some volunteering at George Pegg Gardens with the Magnolia Joy of Gardening Club. Also a few members went down to Olds College Campus for the Ab Horticultural Associations Annual Conference. Some good ideas were put forward that benefit our Sangudo Horticultural Club.

June 27-The location of our meeting changed that night, so that we could take an Edible Mushroom Walk on the farm of Denise O'Reilly. For the potluck after the walk, we had the pleasant treat of pan fried mushrooms to go along with the meal.

July 22- We partnered with the Westlock Pembina Garden Club for a tour of the Gablehouse Daylily farm near Sylvan Lake. This farm sells over 400 varieties of daylilies that are all suitable for growing in the Zone 2 and higher

range. The daylily is regarded as one of the most versatile of the perennials and comes in an abundance of colors.

August 10-We also partnered with the Magnolia Horticultural Club with their Fruit Orchard Tour. This was a tour of well established fruit growers. We were fortunate enough to hear the expertise from some of the members of Alberta's fruit growers association. Bernie Nikolai, Jo Granger and Joyce Moss gave us valuable information at our first stop at an apple orchard, while Tony Voon was informative at our next stop at his plum orchard.

August 13 & 14- Edmonton Pond tour put on by the Water Works Ponds in Edmonton. Back in March we had speakers talking about their ponds and this tour tied in to that. There were14 different locations to visit. My own personal tip in a tour this big is;( if you know you can not see everything and are unable to tour around the second day) the older sections of the city usually have more established ponds and plants, and may be more worthwhile visiting.

September 26- Use what you grow and share. We brought a potluck dish made with something we grew in our gardens and its corresponding recipe. We had an informal discussion and shared new ideas; how new plants that we grew survived the year, the results of our plant of the year that we had received in the spring, and shared how our gardens fared in this difficult weather. This was a meeting that brought a good connection to each other.

October 24-Travelogue to Antarctica. We were armchair travelers, as Yvonne and Terry Slemko showed pictures and told us of their exciting trips to Antarctica. The couple set up a Canadian Flag and proceeded to spend one frigid night in the outdoors under a sleeping bag in the cold Antarctic summer. I'm sure even the penguins were shaking their heads over that.

November 27. We went to the Muttart Conservatory in Edmonton for our Christmas gathering.

We had 15 people in attendance. Most of us joined the interpretive tour through the arid, temperate and tropical pyramids. The seasonal feature of the fourth pyramid was the Holiday Express. A mixture of trains were among the backdrop of hundreds of poinsetties.
