

SENIORS STAY INDEPENDENT WITH NEW LOAN **PROGRAM**

More than 800 applications have been received since the program's launch on July 1, 2016, and the government has paid out more than \$5 million in loans and about \$230,000 in grants. Approximately 10 new applications arrive each day.

"Seniors built this province and they deserve to retire in dignity. Thanks to our government's SHARP program, Alberta seniors can receive the financial assistance they need to repair or adapt their homes, supporting them to age in the community." - Lori Sigurdson, Minister of Seniors and Housing

The Seniors Home Adaptation and Repair Act includes measures to protect consumers, including a provision to review the costs of repair projects to ensure they are fair.

MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION -HIGHWAY 43 NORTH OF HIGHWAY 663

At approximately 5:50 am on January 15th, 2017 the Spruce Grove/Stony Plain RCMP were

called to a motor vehicle collision on Highway 43 just north of Highway 633. A fuel tanker went off the road and entered the east ditch. As a result northbound traffic on Highway 43 was restricted and rerouted.

The tanker truck was transporting diesel, premium and regular fuel. Fuel had leaked from the truck however there is no risk to the public at this time. Lac St. Anne Fire Services and police were on scene and Alberta Environment has been notified.

The male driver and lone occu-

pant of the truck was taken by ambulance to hospital for treatment of minor injuries. No other vehicles were involved.

The cause of the collision is not yet known. All possible factors are being considered and an investigation is ongoing.

Mr.Grayhorseman was also known as Sonny and SonShine. Police are investigating this death as a homicide. Police interested in speaking to anyone who has information on Mr. Grayhorseman's activities and whereabouts in the days leading up to his death.

An autopsy is scheduled for Thursday December 29th, 2016.

BOVINE TB IN ALBERTA: MINISTER'S STATEMENT

Oneil Carlier, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, has issued the following statement about Bovine TB in Alberta:

"Today I have the privilege of visiting with some of our cattle producers and their families on their farms in southeastern Alberta. Several ranchers in this area are affected by the ongoing Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) investigation into bovine tuberculosis, and it's important for me to meet with them and hear firsthand about their experiences.

"While the investigation has created many challenges for these producers, I continue to be inspired by their resilience during this difficult situation. They know how important it is to protect our livestock and markets from disease. Despite the complex challenges involved, they are stepping up to do what's necessary to ensure the health of Alberta's and Canada's animals.

"There are many people and organizations who are committed to supporting our cattle producers during this time of financial, logistical, and emotional stress. In addition to the individual farmers, I would like to thank Alberta Beef Producers for their hard work on behalf of the industry.

"Our federal government partners at the CFIA and Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, along with Alberta's Agriculture Financial Services Corporation and staff across the Alberta government, are all working around the clock to deal with this ongoing situation and provide assistance to farmers.

"I commend and thank all those dedicated to the investigation and to supporting our cattle industry. We will continue to stand together and with our producers as they work through the immediate situation and in the future as they begin the long process of rebuilding their herds."

CANADA SUMMER JOBS 2017

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is inviting local employers to apply for funding through Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) 2017 to help create jobs for students next summer. Budget 2016 added \$113 million per year for three years to the existing CSJ base funding of \$107.5 million, doubling the number of students employed each year.

The Canada Summer Jobs initiative provides funding to not-for-profit, public-sector and small private-sector employers with 50 or fewer employees. It creates summer job opportunities for young people 15 to 30 years of age who are full-time students intending to return to

their studies in the next school vear.

"As in previous years, we are focusing on local priorities in the Yellowhead riding. This program will help provide experience and skillsets to students today so they can qualify for the relevant jobs in the future," said MP Eglinski.

The application period for Canada Summer Jobs 2017 will

take place earlier this year, running from December 5, 2016 to January 20, 2017. This will ensure students may be hired beginning in April 2017. LOOMING FISCAL CRISIS

Just over a year ago, Canada's economy was the envy of the world, as our Conservative government proudly balanced the federal budget. All that hard work was quickly undone by the new Liberal Prime Minister.

The Federal Finance department during the Christmas break released a new report stating we will now have annual budget

deficits for the next quarter century, a predicted culminated federal debt of \$1 trillion in the next 15 years and we will likely see a tripling of current debt levels to \$1.5 trillion by 2050. Justin Trudeau's out-of-control spending and continuing tax hikes are sending Canada on a dangerous path. What happened to the Liberal promise to balance the budget before the next election?

GROWTH ALBERTA LOOKS TO ADD MORE MUNICIPAL VALUE WITH CURRENT & ADDITIONAL PROJECTS IN 2017

At a regular meeting on November 22nd, the Board of Directors of GROWTH Alberta unanimously approved continuation of its current initiatives as well as new project plans for fiscal 2017. Continuing initiatives include the Business Excellence Awards, Demographic Statistical Research, the Northern Alberta Broadband Preparedness Project and Tourism Development. Additional projects given the green light under the CARES Program are the Investment Readiness Project and additional investment in Tourism Development.

Chad Merrifield, Chairperson of GROWTH Alberta, "I think the value of belonging to a REDA is reinforced by the work we are doing and we are excited to move forward with additional economic development projects to help build the region. Being able to leverage membership dollars up to 4:1 is a huge driver for a REDA. The Province recognizes REDAs as an important catalyst in delivering strategic regional priorities and the work GROWTH has and is doing aligns with our mandate to provide membership with tools and information to help their communities remain healthy and sustainable. Rural communities face unique challenges and with the collaborative theme upcoming in the MGA (Municipal Governance Act), our members are focusing on current issues and looking forward to capture advantages that will become apparent in the future and our projects reflect that."

The Broadband Preparedness Project has been underway since mid-2016 with regional information sessions held in November and December. As part of a collaborative larger initiative with four other REDAs, the Northern Alberta Development Council, Community Futures and the Government of Alberta, the project will provide a detailed analysis of current digital

connectivity and infrastructure in the GROWTH region, where we would like to be in five and ten years and provide potential business models and strategies to get there.

Troy Grainger, Manager of GROWTH Alberta, "Digital Connectivity has become an impactful issue as it relates to economic development. Industry seeking rural locations or possible growth strategies of current business is being limited by their access to world economies on the internet. Additionally, with trends such as a forecasted 20% increase in Canadian data consumption in the next year and the explosive emergence of virtual based companies, rural communities that do not have broadband as a priority will be left behind. The project's regional approach also provides potential for more collaborative model opportunities and strength in leveraging assets to reach specific connectivity goals."

Also to be undertaken is a comprehensive Investment Readiness Project where the GROWTH region and all member communities will be provided with a detailed analysis of current capacity and potential opportunities for enhancement. Being able to respond to regional investment and industry opportunities quickly and strategically with real time infrastructure and capacity information will put member communities at the forefront to assist with investment generation strategies. The study will build off of the Broadband Preparedness Project to encapsulate collection, dissemination and presentation of data encompassing transportation (rail & highway corridors), average real estate costs, utility capacity and costs, key industry identifiers and locations, labour, demographics, traffic summaries, diversification opportunities, etc.

RANSOMWARE ATTACK

File 2016-1630047 - On December 12, 2016 St. Albert RCMP received a complaint from a local business that their company computers had been the affected by ransomware; a computer malware that installs covertly on a victims computer, executes a crypto virology attack that adversely affects it, and demands ransom payment to decrypt it or not publish it. The occurrence prompted St. Albert RCMP to

issue a warning to both businesses and the general public to be aware of ransomware and some preventative measures to minimize being victimized

According to a 2014 Internet Security report by Symantec, the attacks often stem from an infected email attachment or app that seizes control of the computer. The RCMP Tech Crimes Unit in Alberta are advise of the following measures that should be taken:

• Never open a file that is attached to an e-mail from an unknown or

untrusted source

- Spam e-mails may display as being from someone you know but have a subject line that seems unusual or solicitous in nature. If it seems out of character, don't open
- Extensions for Internet browsers are often third party or open-source scripts. Just because an extension is made available for installation does not mean it has been extensively checked for malicious content. Be vigilant when choosing which extensions to install.

Cyber security experts also add keeping security software updated and backing up computers regularly to a drive that is not kept plugged into the system, thereby protecting it from infection.
