## THE ROLE OF THE CARBON TAX IN ALBERTA'S CLIMATE LEADERSHIP PLAN

As the government of British Columbia approved Kinder Morgan's pipeline, we are closer than ever to breaking our landlock and fixing a problem that has dogged our province for decades.

And that wouldn't have been possible without Alberta's Climate Leadership Plan, designed to take action on climate change and protect the province's health, environment and economy.

This approval is another important step forward towards the completion of this critical project for the Canadian economy.

We are getting closer to bringing Alberta's product to tidewater and this is good news for the communities of Whitecourt-Ste. Anne

I do believe that Alberta and British Columbia share a commitment to creating jobs and economic opportunities for families as well as a deep environmental ethic.

Working families shouldn't have to choose between good jobs and the environment. World-class environmental standards and a strong economy that benefits working people must go hand-in-hand.

Our province and economy need a made-in-Alberta solution to climate change. Not only is taking action the right thing to do, inaction runs the risk of policies or penalties being imposed on Alberta or on our products. Having a credible climate change policy improves our international reputation as an energy provider.

Energy wide carbon pricing is the most effective way to reduce emissions at the lowest total cost to the economy, as it provides an incentive for everyone, including households, businesses and municipalities to reduce greenhouse gas emissions that

contribute to climate change. A carbon levy will also encourage innovation and diversification of our economy.

The Alberta government is also protecting our oil industry by helping it be a leader. Our climate change policies, including the carbon levy, have helped get a number of pipelines approved. We have also seen corporate investment in the past few months. Some recent announcements include Cenovus increasing capital spending by 24 per cent in 2017, SemsCAMS announced a new sour gas plant in the Wapiti area, and 149 new wells have been approved under the modernized royalty framework, each one supporting 135 direct and indirect jobs and about \$4.5 million in spending.

Revenue from the carbon levy will pay to help to diversify our energy industry and our province's economy as a whole. This includes boosting electricity generation from renewable sources to 30 per cent by 2030, up from just 10 per cent at present. This will provide significant investment opportunities of at least \$10.5 billion and create at least 7,200 new jobs as projects are built.

Albertans stand to gain with the carbon levy rebate. Approximately 1.13 million individual carbon rebate payments have been issued since Jan. 5 via direct deposit and cheques, including thousands in Whitecourt-Ste. Anne constituency.

These rebates are intended to help lower- and middle-income households adjust to the carbon levy and invest in increasing energy efficiency at home.

As we continue to reap the rewards of our Alberta-made solutions, we know that we can continue to support a strong and prosperous oil and gas sector while taking steps to reduce our carbon emissions.

## WHY IS THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT PUNISHING SMALL BUSINESSES?

Unfortunately, the Liberals are showing total disregard by ending the review of 'active' versus 'passive' business-income rules that would have allowed small businesses like campgrounds to access the small business tax rate.

The Liberals are unfairly targeting

campground owners and other small operations by saying that they are too small to be classified as a 'small business'. Campground owners, they say, don't have enough full-time employees to qualify. They are doing this because they think that owning a campground is 'passive,' not 'active'. What the Trudeau Government is actually saying is that campground owners don't have to work to maintain their property.

I beg to differ. Campground owners wear many hats. They are landscap-

ers, janitors, accountants and security guards, making sure they provide a safe, clean and fun atmosphere for your family to explore the outdoors.

Our Yellowhead riding is known world-wide for our natural beauty. People from all over the world visit our riding to experience the unique landscape we have to offer. Our campgrounds provide a way to interact with nature on a personal level.

Tourism is a major industry in our region. If tourism accounts for 4.3% of

Alberta's economy, then why does this Federal Government want to raise taxes on campgrounds, a driving force of this industry? This will severely harm campground owners.

There are many small businesses, small family businesses, as well as mom-and-pop operations that are also being unjustly punished by the Liberals. Is this tax hike on campgrounds just a sign of what is to come for other small businesses?

### RCMP OFFICER-INVOLVED SHOOTING JUSTIFIED

On May 22, 2015, pursuant to section 46.1 of the Police Act, the Director of Law Enforcement directed the Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) to investigate the circumstances surrounding an RCMP officer-involved shooting of a 47-year-old man near Morinville, Alberta.

On that date, members of the Morinville RCMP detachment attended a rural home after receiving a 911 call from a family member who was concerned for their safety. Police were advised that a male relative, who was prohibited by a court order not to attend the residence, was on the property. The man, having a medical condition, was acting out of character and it was believed that he may have stopped taking his medication.

At approximately 7:33 p.m., four officers arrived at the family home. As the officers were searching through the house and outbuildings in an attempt to locate the man, they heard yelling coming from a neighbouring property to the south. Two officers responded to the neighbouring home while the other two officers completed the search. Upon determining that the man was not there, the two remaining officers drove over to the neighbouring property.

At approximately 8:04 p.m., a call for a canine unit was made to assist in locating the man. While waiting for the unit to arrive, a man was spotted in a field to the south of the officers' position. They called out to the man who yelled, then bent over and picked up two long-barrelled firearms, holding one in each hand. He then turned and walked away from the police. Officers requested assistance from the Emergency Response Team (ERT). Two officers ran towards a tree line in the field to try and maintain sight of the man. The remaining two officers stayed behind by the police vehicles for cover and to monitor and maintain radio communications for updates.

The officers continually communicated with the man attempting to de-escalate the situation, telling him he was under arrest requesting he put down the guns and surrender.

As the two officers arrived at the tree line, the man stopped and turned around to face them. It appeared the man was loading one of the firearms. One officer velled out to warn the others while he ran along the tree line moving through the field continually monitoring the man's actions. When he saw the man stop, turn and face him again, he took refuge along a small dirt and clay berm which only blocked the view of approximately half of his body. The officer was aware that from the distance involved, it would be possible that a bullet could penetrate through the dirt or clay. When the man raised his firearm and pointed it in the direction of the officer, the officer fired a single round from his carbine rifle. The man fell to the ground.

The officers requested the immediate attendance of the ERT team again and emergency medical services (EMS) personnel.

### **RCMP Officer-Involved Shooting Justified**

The officers on scene could see the man moving his arms and torso on the ground but were unable to determine the extent of the injuries or where the two firearms seen earlier were in relation to the man, and whether he could access them from where he was on the ground. There was no reasonable safe place available in the open field for the officers to move closer to the man to offer medical assistance, without placing themselves in potential jeopardy. The man was repeatedly asked to show his hands and move away from any firearms or crawl towards the officers so that medical assistance could be provided, but there was no response.

An RCMP aircraft arrived on scene to provide additional support. The aircraft observer could see the man moving, and a rifle was observed to be approximately three meters away from him. There was also a backpack type item noted at the man's feet. The second firearm could not be seen.

Within minutes of having seen the man moving on the ground, an ERT armoured vehicle drove through the field, approached the man and found him motionless. When ERT members had the man secured, emergency medical assistance was immediately initiated by ERT medics, and EMS personnel were called in to provide medical treatment.

EMS personnel began performing lifesaving techniques on the man; however, they were unable to resuscitate him. EMS personnel contacted On-Line Medical Control and the decision was made to cease resuscitation efforts, declaring the man deceased.

The autopsy report confirmed the man died as a result of a single gunshot wound to the abdomen. Toxicology tests also determined the presence of methamphetamine in his body. The 47-year-old man had a lengthy and troubled history of significant mental illness and conflict with the law. He had a documented history of psychotic and mood related behavioural issues and delusional thoughts for which his family had repeatedly sought help. Within the preceding year, the man had previously made comments that he would not be able to handle going to jail, that he hated police, and that he had had suicidal thoughts. He was supposed to be under psy-


chiatric care at the time of his death.

ASIRT executive director, Susan D. Hughson, Q.C., received the completed investigation and after a careful review of the evidence has confirmed that the officers involved were acting lawfully and the use of force was reasonable and justified in all the circumstances.

The loss of a life is always a tragedy and this case was no exception. The troubled man had a family that loved him and had

attempted to get him help for his mental health issues. On behalf of ASIRT, Ms. Hughson extends her deepest condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

ASIRT's mandate is to effectively, independently, and objectively investigate incidents involving Alberta's police that have resulted in serious injury or death to any person, as well as serious or sensitive allegations of police misconduct.
