
A SPECIAL DEDICATION IN HONOR OF TERRY AND

RCMP CHARGE TEACHER WITH SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

On Jan. 23, 2017, Barrhead RCMP responded to a report of inappropriate interactions via social media between a teacher and three students from Barrhead Composite High school. The male teacher is believed to have used Snapchat to communicate with the victims and no

physical contact was reported. The teacher was also teaching at R.F. Staples in Westlock at the time of the alleged incidents which started back in October 2016.

On Jan. 25, 2017, Andrew Philip Jissink, a 43-year-old from Barrhead, was arrested and charged with three counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Young Person - Sect. 153(1)(b). A bail

hearing was held and Jissink was released on a recognizance with numerous conditions and will make his first appearance in Barrhead Provincial Court on Feb. 14, 2017.

The ages and grades of the youth victims will not be released.

Yvonne's dedication to Public Libraries has spanned more than 30 years. Between 1985 and 2012 Yvonne spent 19 years serving on the executive of the OPL Board. During that time she also was the Town's representative on the YRL Board, an

executive member of the Alberta Library Trustees Association and co-chaired the Alberta Library Conference that is held at Jasper Park Lodge every spring.

Terry's involvement with OPL started in 1984 when he served on the board for 3 years. At which time he was also Mayor of the Village. It was at this time

the Board worked toward building a new library in Onoway that adjoined the Village Office. Yes, you can guess who was the driving force behind this new building. And without Terry's influence and leadership we would not be in this new space tonight.

Since Terry's early involvement in OPL, he has leather-bound over 50 volumes of local newspapers dating from 1949 to the present day. This he has done with no expense to the Library. And so it becomes appropriate that this History Centre be named the Terry and Yvonne History Corner.

I would like to say that Yvonne and Terry have never sat on Boards or Committees, they have always served on Boards or Committees. One has to work with them to fully appreciate their work ethics and dedication. They do not talk about their volunteer work; they only

do volunteer work.

I'm sure that had Derril Butler, OPL Chair had given this presentation he would have closed by reciting one of his favorite poems; A poem by Robert Frost which ends:

"Two roads diverged in a wood, and I-

I took the one less traveled by. And that has made all the difference."

Terry and Yvonne, on behalf of the whole community, thank you for taking the road less traveled by. It has made all the difference. Thank you."

Improperly managed septic systems have the potential to have a significant negative effect on the Alberta landscape.

Rural property owners are responsible for ensuring their systems operate properly and safely. If you have a septic system on your rural property, you will benefit from attending this workshop. Presenters will teach you how to understand, assess and properly manage your septic system, enabling you to protect your investment in your property and the valuable natural assets associated with your land.

During the workshop we will cover:

- What a septic system is and how it works
- Regulations
- Design and installation
- Appropriate use of your septic system
- Maintaining your septic system
- Troubleshooting

Learn what you can do to properly manage and maintain your septic system. Attend the Septic Sense workshop on Thursday, February 9, 2017, hosted and presented by Lac Ste. BACKGROUNDER

Alberta's rural landscape is changing. 2011 census data shows that rural residential landowners represent 14% of Alberta's population. According to Alberta Municipal Affairs, the average person puts 340 litres of sewage through a private sewage system (septic system) every day. For a family of four living in a two-bedroom house,

that amounts to 1,360 litres per day and just under half a million litres per year. The decisions of those rural landowners about how to manage and maintain their septic systems have the potential to have a significant cumulative effect on the Alberta landscape.

Owners of these septic systems are responsible for ensuring their systems operate properly and safely. Increasingly, rural landowners are searching for relevant information on how to best manage their properties in a way that protects their investment and protects the environment. Unfortunately, landowners in Alberta have not always

had access to the information, resources and support that can help them responsibly manage their systems.

In early 2015, Land Stewardship Centre (LSC), in partnership with Alberta Onsite Wastewater Management Association (AOWMA) launched Septic Sense: Solutions for Rural Living, an onsite wastewater system education and outreach pilot program for landowners in Alberta. LSC and AOWMA have engaged technical experts and representatives from government, municipalities and industry to provide expertise and oversight to the development of the pilot program.

MULTI VEHICLE COLLISION LEADS TO CRIMINAL CONVICTION

St. Albert, Alta – A joint investigative effort between the St. Albert RCMP, RCMP Police Dog Services and RCMP Collision Reconstructionist resulted in charges under the Criminal Code of Canada and Use of Highway Rules of the Road Regulations being laid. October 10, 2015, RCMP responded to a

multi vehicle collision on Forest Drive in St. Albert. Four occupants of a west bound travelling vehicle, driven by Kyle David Gaudet collided with a parked vehicle. Both vehicles were propelled over the boulevard. The vehicle driven by Gaudet came to rest after impacting a tree on Forest Drive.

Occupant restraints were not used by all in the vehicle. Resulting in those occupants being admitted to the hospital. "Seat belts are an integral part of occupant safety," identifies Cst. Pat-

rick Lambert – St. Albert Crime Prevention and Community Policing "without the proper use and maintenance of seatbelts you're safety is compromised!" Alcohol was present in the vehicle. Speed of the vehicle and environmental factors were acknowledged during this investigation.

Kyle David Gaudet 21-yearsold was charged with: Driving at an unreasonable speed, Dangerous Operation of a motor vehicle and Failure to stop or remain at the scene of a collision where persons were injured.

Preliminary Trial was held in St. Albert Provincial court on November 28, 2016. Kyle David Gaudet pled guilty to:

Section 69(1)(a) of the Traffic Safety Act - Driver in accident fail to remain at/ return immediately to scene

Section 249(1)(a) of the Criminal Code - Dangerous Operation of Motor Vehicle

Kyle David Gaudet's sentencing hearing is set for May 1, 2017 in St. Albert Provincial Court.


Residents are encouraged to use caution prior to providing
