## CRIME SPREE NEAR BRETON

On January 28th, 2017 at 1:30 A.M. the area of Breton was subject to numerous break and enter and thefts along highway 20 and highway 616 near Range Road

A group of individuals who were occupants in a dark green 1999 Jeep Cherokee, which was stolen out of Spruce Grove on January 27th, 2017 at 7:10 A.M., made stops at two different property only few miles south of Breton on highway 20 where they stole diverse items and attempted to steal ierry cans of fuel.

The perpetrators were seen by one of the property owners where they broke into a garage in an attempt to steal fuel. After being caught in the garage, they fled north bound on highway 20 before turning westbound onto highway 616 and stopping at a property near Range Road 50.

The perpetrators were again chased from the property by the owner, who fired a shot at the vehicle's tire. The perpetrators were attempting to steal fuel and while attempting to flee from the property almost ran over the property

The vehicle was later located in the alley north of 53 Avenue in Breton.

Search of the vehicle revealed that the vehicle had initially left Spruce Grove after being stolen and had headed to Onoway's Shell gas station located at 4921 49 Street.

It was also found that on the same day, at approximately 6:23 P.M., the vehicle had travelled to Calgary where it had stopped at the Canadian Tire located at 596 64 Avenue NE.

The program is part of the Government of Alberta's "Future Ready" effort to co-ordinate education and training from kindergarten to work so all Albertans have the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in a changing economy.

Last year, STEP helped approximately 2,700 students connect to valuable work experience with more than 1,200 employers across

the province. The program is available to small businesses, non-profit organizations, public libraries, school boards, publicly funded post-secondary institutions, municipalities, First Nations and Métis settlements.

STEP has been slightly changed this year to better support students and ensure as many employers as possible can participate. Minor administrative changes will also improve the application process, making it simpler for employers to hire multiple students under the program.

The program was restored in 2015 after being cut in March 2013 by the previous government. The Alberta Jobs Plan has \$10 million budgeted for STEP each year, starting in 2016-17.

Employers interested in hiring a student for 2017 are encouraged to apply as soon as possible. Applications must be submitted before the Feb. 24, 2017 deadline. Application forms are available online at AlbertaCanada.com/STEP.

# LEDUC RCMP SEIZE DRUGS & STOLEN PROPERTY DURING TRAFFIC STOP

Leduc, Alberta - At 8:35 p.m. on January 15, the Leduc RCMP assisted a Leduc County Peace Officer with a traffic stop on Hwy 625 and Range Road 245.

Through investigation during that traffic stop, the RCMP determined that the vehicle was stolen and the two occupants were arrested.

A significant quantity of methamphetamine, heroin and marijuana were discovered inside the car and subsequently seized by the RCMP. The stolen vehicle was recovered.

Charges are pending in this investigation, including possession of stolen property over \$5,000, possession for the purpose of trafficking in controlled

substances and obstruction of police.

Leduc RCMP and Leduc Community Peace Officers continue to work together to ensure safe homes and safe communities.

# RECREATIONAL VEHICLE USERS REMINDED TO KEEP OFF THE CROPS

This weekend's weather forecast is calling for higher temperatures than our region has experienced in weeks, and recreational vehicle users will likely be taking advantage of the warmer conditions.

Leduc County would like to remind users that some crops are still in-field and recreational vehicle usage should remain limited to highways and ditches, where permitted.

"Certain crops throughout the county have not yet been harvested, and some of these crops will still be viable in the spring. We've received a lot of positive reactions to this campaign, and would like to thank recreational vehicle users for their continued support of our local producers." - Garett Broadbent, Director of Agricultural Services

"In Leduc County, recreational vehicles, including quads, dirt bikes, snowmobiles and other ATVs, are not permitted on any private property, public park, environmental reserve, recreation or exhibition grounds, municipal reserve or municipal and school reserve. Users are permitted; however, to ride in single file in the ditches along local county roads or in the parking lane of a road if they need to bypass a hazard or obstacle in the ditch." - Clarence Nelson, Director of Enforcement Services

On January 13, following the arrest of a suspect involved in an early morning home invasion, Leduc RCMP swore eleven criminal code charges against 39-year-old Scott Allan Gervais of no fixed address.


As a result of breaking into several outbuildings at one residence and then committing a home invasion at a neighbouring residence, Gervais is facing the following charges:


- Break and enter to a dwelling house, and commit theft
- Break and enter to a dwelling house, and commit robbery
- Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5,000 (x 2)
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000
- Wear a disguise with intent to commit indictable offence (x 2)
- Uttering Threats
- Assault
- Mischief over \$5,000

• Possession of break in instrument

Gervais remains in custody and is scheduled to appear in the Provincial Court of Alberta in Leduc on January 19, 2017.

The investigation into this incident remains ongoing by the Leduc General Investigation Section.

Applicants approved for funding will be able to hire students as early as April 2017.


The Canada Summer Jobs initiative provides funding to not-for-profit, public-sector and

# LEDUC RCMP MAKE ARREST AFTER TRAFFIC STOP

On January 21, 2017 The Leduc RCMP along with member of the Alberta Sheriffs from

the Leduc Integrated traffic unit conducted a traffic stop of a motor home that was travelling north bound on Highway 2 near Leduc. The investigation

lead to the four male occupants of the vehicle all being charged with possession of a control substance for the purpose of trafficking. As a result of a search

of the vehicle police seized over 285 grams of marijuana, scales, baggies, grinders, papers and \$5805.00 of Canadian currency.

# RCMP STOP IMPAIRED DRIVER ON QE2

Leduc, Alberta – On January 1 at approximately 6:15 a.m., a Leduc RCMP member, while responding to an unrelated matter, observed a truck with a trailer driving southbound on the QE2 in the northbound lanes. After the truck failed to pull over for the RCMP, a brief pursuit ensued until the Leduc RCMP

member managed to effectively get the truck stopped near the shoulder of the median.

Investigation revealed that the truck was recently stolen out of Edmonton. Several motorists reported that while it was travelling southbound in the wrong lane it narrowly avoided collisions. At one point, a bus travelling northbound had to take extreme evasive action to avoid the truck. "This situation could

very easily have resulted in a fatal collision involving several people," said Inspector Kevin Kunetzki, Leduc RCMP, "but very fortunately it was resolved with no injury or property damage to the general public, the suspect driver, or the police."

23-year-old Jamie Michael Richard Prince of Edmonton is currently facing the following charges as a result of this incident: Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, Operation of a motor vehicle while impaired, Operation of a motor vehicle over .08, Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000 and Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5,000.

Prince has been released following a bail hearing and is scheduled to appear in Leduc Provincial Court on January 5, 2017.

# COMPLAINT OF A SUSPICIOUS INDIVIDUAL DRIVING A MOTOR BIKE IN DARK LEADS TO NUMEROUS FIREARM OFFENCES

On January 18th, 2017, at 2:47 A.M. a motorist reported that he nearly missed a male on a motor-bike with no light on, who was driving west bound on Highway 616 near Range Road 55.

Upon approaching the male the barrel of a firearm was visible and was sticking out of a guitar case that the male was wearing on his back.

justice of the peace on bail with conditions.

The accused, Jeremy CAIRNS, is to appear at the Breton Provincial Court on January 25th, 2017.


