## STATISTICS CANADA RELEASES NEW POPULATION DATA

Statistics Canada released population figures from the 2016 federal census this morning, and Whitecourt's population is recorded at 10,204.

Whitecourt has experienced a 6.2% increase in population since the last federal census which was conducted in 2011. This is comparable, if not higher, than that of neighbouring communities.

Whitecourt has experienced

a population decrease since the most recent municipal census, and the changes in population are similar to that of other communities that have completed municipal census studies between 2011 and 2016. It is anticipated that when Whitecourt completes its next municipal census, the community's population figure will grow.

"The new population figures is not unexpected when one considers recent economic conditions," stated Whitecourt Mayor Maryann Chichak. "Whitecourt is fortunate to have a diversified economy, and our community has been sheltered from the impacts other municipalities have felt with the recent market changes in the oil and gas industry."

Statistics Canada will be releasing data collected from the census throughout the year. The next topic set for release on May 3, 2017 will be on population gender and age.

# STRUCTURE FIRE, VILLAGE OF ALBERTA BEACH

At six forty-five PM Saturday February 4th Onoway Regional Fire Services – Canada's first Hybrid Fire Service was dispatched to a structure fire on fifty-second A street in the Village of Alberta Beach. The first units were rolling to scene within one-minute with the first unit arriving on scene three-minutes after the initial page out.

Upon arrival, fire crews noted smoke originating from a detached garage. This single occupant who had been working in the garage managed to darken down the fire in its incipient stage then evacuate. The first-on scene crew provided medical care until the ambulance arrived then firefighters focused on fire overhaul and cooling hot-spots. After discussions with the Alberta Office of the Fire Commissioner and ensuring no further risk to persons or property, Onoway Fire Services turned the scene back over to the property owner.

Three fire apparatus and seven firefighters were initially dispatched to this fire along with coresponse from Alberta Health Services.

One person was transferred to the hospital by Alberta Health Services as a precaution. The cause and origin is under review.

Onoway Regional Fire Services and North West Fire Rescue would like to remind everyone to take extreme care when working with flammable liquids and to ensure that fire extinguishers are kept in practical locations and in good working order





# NOTLEY CALLS ALBERTANS UPSET ABOUT THE CARBON TAX 'CHICKEN LITTLE': WILDROSE

EDMONTON, AB (February 9, 2017): Premier Rachel Notley is continuing her streak of making insensitive comments towards struggling Albertans by saying those expressing concerns about the carbon tax are doing a "chicken little routine," the Wildrose Official Opposition said today.

Households have seen their energy bills increase, businesses have had to close and charities and nonprofits, who are taking care of Alberta's most vulnerable, have said they don't know how they're going to absorb increased costs due to the carbon tax.

Wildrose Leader Brian Jean said Notley and the NDP should

"It's easy for the Premier and her MLAs to make light of Albertans who are worried about the carbon tax, but I assure you, families struggling to pay their bills every month and businesses trying to keep their doors open are taking this very seriously," Jean said. Wildrose Shadow Finance Minister Derek Fildebrandt said Wildrose is speaking for hundreds of thousands of working families who don't know how they're going to pay their increasing bills. He said the Premier owes these families an apology.

disrespectful to and completely removed from the reality faced by the majority of everyday Albertans," Fildebrandt said. "Elites might look down upon those who don't want to pay the carbon tax, but those people have real and legitimate concerns. The Premier owes them an apology."






This week in Parliament, we discussed topics including international trade, palliative care, proper disposal of mercury, gender equality, and American foreign policy.

# MP JIM EGLINSKI PARTICIPATES IN THE TAKE-NOTE DEBATE ON JOB LOSSES IN THE ENERGY SECTOR

On February 8th, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, participated in the take-note debate on 'Job Losses in the Energy Sector'. During debate MP Eglinski asked the Leader of the NDP, the Hon.

Thomas Mulcair, the following:

"Mr. Chair, my riding of Yellowhead has not been affected as much as a lot of parts of Alberta, but some of the communities in my riding have. Two-thirds of the community of Grande Cache, a community of 4,500 people, have been without jobs for over two years. The commu-

nities of Hinton and Edson have been taking in residents from Grande Cache, assisting them in trying to find jobs. In fact, one chap worked for me for a couple of weeks until he could find some work. Yet the provincial government has not assisted them. Nor has the federal government. Could the hon. member tell us where he sees roles for provincial and federal governments in these communities that are being devastated?"

Much like something old, something borrowed is yet another way to pay homage to a friend or family member. It's also one way to add a sentimental twist to everyday items.



# MP JIM EGLINSKI QUESTIONS NDP MEMBER DURING DEBATE ON BILL C-36

OTTAWA: On February 7th, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, during debate on C-36, 'An Act to Amend the Statistics Act', asked NDP Member, Erin Weir, the following:

"Mr. Speaker, it is my understanding that the new Canadian statistics advisory council will be appointed through Governor in Council appointments. At this point, it is unclear what the application process will look like. My concern is that this is another opportunity for the government to appoint its buddies. Does the member opposite also share these concerns?"

The Member from Regina-Lewvan, replied:

"Mr. Speaker, indeed I do share those concerns. Statistics Canada had a long-standing advisory board that was much larger and represented virtually every sector of society and every region of the country. Of course there are many benefits to that. In an effort to be as charitable as possible to the government, the idea may be that having a smaller body can be a more effective

decision making group, rather than a large body of appointees where it almost becomes an honorific. The devil here is in the details, and we need to know that the government will actually appoint well-qualified, independent people. Therefore, I think there is every reason to be suspicious that may not happen, and is a reason for us, as opposition

MPs, to keep a careful watch on those appointments and that process."

"Though our Conservative Party supports Bill C-36, at Second Reading, we are still concerned with the aspects of this Bill and we will be proposing amendments once the Bill is forwarded to committee for further study", concluded MP Eglinski.




