PINK SHIRT DAY 2017: YOU WILL NEVER REGRET BEING KIND

'Make Nice' is this year's theme for Pink Shirt Day and the City of Leduc is looking to residents and the corporate community to join them in their stand against bullying on Feb. 22, 2017.

"We know bullying happens at home, in school yards, at work and on the Internet, and as a community we need to come together to bring it to an end," says Deputy Mayor Dana Smith. "It begins with kindness; being kind doesn't cost anything and it will help change attitudes and behaviours to stop the presence of bullying in our community."

On Feb. 22, the City of Leduc encourages local businesses, organizations, schools and residents to take a stand by wearing pink. Pink Shirt Day (pinkshirtday.ca) originated in Eastern Canada in 2007 when a group of teenagers organized a protest at their high school to support a Grade 9 boy who was bullied for wearing pink. Since that time, Pink Shirt Day grew to receive national and global recognition and fundraising to support anti-bullying programs.

"No one entity can combat the issue of bullying on its own, hence the importance of community partnerships to raise awareness and provide education on the issues and dangers associated with bullying in our society," says Smith. "Leduc is a caring and inclusive community and we want to do what we can. where we can for our citizens."

THORSBY RCMP AND MAJOR **CRIMES UNIT CONFIRM THE** ARREST GERALD PETER KRAHN

UPDATE #2

Warburg, Alberta - Following a police investigation in a homicide which occurred on January 29, 2017 the RCMP have arrested 29-year-old Gerald Krahn.

On February 2, 2017 an arrest warrant was issued for Krahn and the RCMP pursued efforts to actively locate him. On February 4 he was arrested in north

Edmonton without incident.

A bail hearing has been held and Gerald Krahn has been remanded in custody to attend Provincial Court of Alberta in Breton, on February 8, 2017.

Background:

Warburg, Alberta - The RCMP is seeking to arrest a 29-yearold man on a charge of second degree murder in relation to the death of Christopher O'Reilly* (36) of Warburg, who died on the night of Monday Jan. 30, after sustaining injuries in an

incident which police now are investigating as a homicide.

An autopsy was completed this past Tuesday in which the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner determined the manner of death to be homicide.

A warrant of arrest has been issued for Gerald Peter KRAHN** (29), formerly of Grande Prairie, who is wanted on one count of second degree murder in relation to the death of Christopher O'Reilly

RCMP DOGS JOIN IN BATTLE AGAINST FENTANYL

INNISFAIL, Alberta – February 2, 2017, 9:00 am CST – To counter the presence of illicit fentanyl in Canada and to keep Canadians safe, the RCMP is currently training its Police Service Dogs to detect fentanyl.

The training is paying off. One


of the three RCMP dog teams presently trained to detect fentanyl has already intercepted 12,000 tablets in B.C. "I do believe the Canadian population is safer because of our new fentanyl dog training. By keeping more fentanyl off the street, we save Canadian lives," says Inspector Akrum Ghadban, Officer in Charge of the RCMP Police

Dog Service Training Centre (PDSTC) in Innisfail, Alberta.

The RCMP leads the way in dog training to detect fentanyl. "Our specialists have transformed pure fentanyl into a diluted liquid form, enabling our dogs to train with the real smell of fentanyl with no risk of inhaling it. It is particularly efficient, making the dogs in the field extremely productive," says Staff Sergeant Eric Stebenne, Senior Trainer at the RCMP PDSTC.


The training of all 139 RCMP narcotics-profile dogs and their handlers across Canada is expected to be completed by mid-July 2017.

Fentanyl is an opioid about 100 times more toxic than morphine which can cause serious harm, including death. It has been used in tablets made to look like prescription drugs.





MP JIM EGLINSKI PARTICIPATES IN THE TAKE-NOTE DEBATE ON JOB LOSSES IN THE ENERGY SECTOR

OTTAWA: On February 8th, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, participated in the take-note debate on 'Job Losses in the Energy Sector'. During debate MP Eglinski asked the Leader of the NDP, the Hon. Thomas Mulcair, the following:

"Mr. Chair, my riding of Yellowhead has not been affected as much as a lot of parts of Alberta, but some of the communities in my riding have. Two-thirds of the community of Grande Cache, a community of 4,500 people, have been without jobs for over two years. The commu-

nities of Hinton and Edson have been taking in residents from Grande Cache, assisting them in trying to find jobs. In fact, one chap worked for me for a couple of weeks until he could find some work. Yet the provincial government has not assisted them. Nor has the federal government.

Could the hon. member tell us where he sees roles for provincial and federal governments in these communities that are being devastated?"



UNDERGARMENTS CAN MAKE OR BREAK WEDDING LOOKS

As guests' eyes are trained on couples come their wedding days, it is no surprise that both the bride and groom want to look flawless on their big days. elsewhere that fits with your budget if you don't want to buy at the store.




