FORTISALBERTA ENCOURAGES COMMUNITIES TO JOIN ITS EARTH HOUR CHALLENGE FOR A CHANCE TO WIN!

Drayton Valley AB - On February 2, 2017 at approximately 2:10 p.m., Drayton Valley RCMP responded to a theft of Motor Vehicle. A 2008 Ford Sport Trac, Red in Colour, AB Licence BKM6930, had been left running while parked outside a local business. The owner observed a Caucasian male, dark hair, short in stature, wearing a

hoodie, get into the vehicle and drive off.

Members located the vehicle Eastbound on Hwy 22, East of Drayton Valley and attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle turned around and headed back towards Drayton Valley at a high rate of speed. The member was able to observe the driver who matched the description provided by the complainant.

ond vehicle, a 2008 Saturn Outlook, White in colour, was taken from a garage in Drayton Valley. This vehicle was later recovered in the ditch on Highway 53 and RR 33, in the Rimbey area.

NOTLEY CALLS ALBERTANS UPSET ABOUT THE CARBON TAX 'CHICKEN LITTLE'

Premier Rachel Notley is continuing her streak of making insensitive comments towards struggling Albertans by saying those expressing concerns about the carbon tax are doing a "chicken little routine," the Wildrose Official Opposition said today.

Households have seen their energy bills increase, businesses have had to close and charities and nonprofits, who are taking

care of Alberta's most vulnerable, have said they don't know how they're going to absorb increased costs due to the carbon tax.

Wildrose Leader Brian Jean said Notley and the NDP should can the laughter.

"It's easy for the Premier and her MLAs to make light of Albertans who are worried about the carbon tax, but I assure you, families struggling to pay their bills every month and businesses trying to keep their doors open

are taking this very seriously," Jean said. "This carbon tax is making life more difficult for Albertans and making our province less competitive. This is not a laughing matter."

Wildrose Shadow Finance Minister Derek Fildebrandt said Wildrose is speaking for hundreds of thousands of working families who don't know how they're going to pay their increasing bills. He said the Premier owes these families an apology.

"The Premier's comments are

disrespectful to and completely removed from the reality faced by the majority of everyday Albertans," Fildebrandt said. "Elites might look down upon those who don't want to pay the carbon tax, but those people have real and legitimate concerns. The Premier owes them an apology."

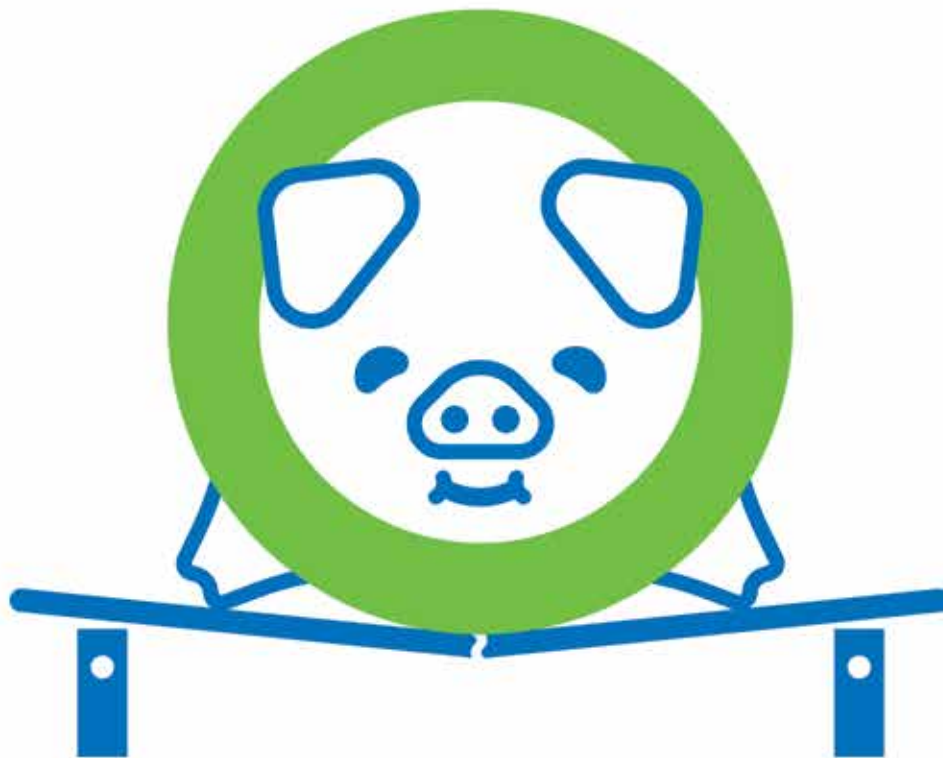

Week of February 20, 2017

This week was a short week in Parliament as Monday was Family Day. We discussed topics including national parks, the carbon tax, pre-clearance and border security, and the detention and release of criminals.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-18 – An Act to amend the Rouge National Urban Park Act, the Parks Canada Agency Act and the Canada National Parks Act (Report

Stage)

• Bill C-23 – An Act respecting the preclearance of persons and goods in Canada and the United States (Second Reading)

• Bill S-217 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code (detention in custody) (Second Reading)

• M-104 – Ottawa River Watershed

• M-105 – Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis

• M-106 - Seniors

• CPC Opposition Motion – Impact of Carbon Taxes

On Tuesday, I participated in debate on Bill C-18, speaking about

ecological integrity in regards to Jasper National Park and Willmore Wilderness Park. On Friday, I spoke on Bill C-23, which would expand pre-clearance border operations (as we already have established at the Edmonton International Airport) to other airports and train stations throughout Canada. In the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI), we continued to study federal protected areas and

• Bill C-308 – Canadian Broadcasting Corporation Privatization Act (Second Reading)

• M-100 – Role of co-operatives

• M-103 – Systemic racism and religious discrimination (Liberal MP Motion)

• M-102 – Formaldehyde emissions

• Opposition Day Motion – Systemic racism and religious discrimination

In the Standing Committee on Environment and Sustainable Development (ENVI), we continued to discuss federal protected areas and conservation objectives. HELPFUL HINTS WHEN PLANNING FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

When planning their weddings, couples may find themselves becoming experts on subjects they previously never gave much thought. Thanks to the cost of weddings, today's couples must make each decision carefully, and that may result in hours of research and discussion.

In-season and native flowers tend to be more abundant as well, and the greater their availability the less couples are likely to pay for them.

- Repurpose floral arrangements. Another way to save on floral arrangements is to repurpose flowers throughout the day. Once bridesmaids no longer need their bouquets, use them to decorate gift tables or cocktail areas. Floral arrangements on display during the ceremony can be removed once

you have both said "I do" and moved into the reception area where they can be enjoyed through the night. Go over any repurposing you plan to do with your reception hall manager prior to your wedding day so he knows where and when to move the arrangements.

- Go big. Some flowers simply

bloom larger than others, and choosing such flowers may help you save money since you won't need to buy as many flowers as you would if you were to go with smaller blooms. Once you find a florist to work with, discuss your options with regard to doing more with less. Many florists embrace the chal-

lenge to be creative within a budget, so you might just be surprised and impressed by what they come up with.

Floral arrangements can set the mood for a wedding ceremony and reception, and even couples with little or no experience choosing arrangements can end up with stunning displays.

CHANGING YOUR LAST NAME

While many brides opt to take their husbands' surnames upon tying the knot, over the years the popularity of such a decision has ebbed and flowed. Recent years have suggested the practice is once again gaining steam.

A 2011 study published in *Names: A Journal of Onomastics* indicates that younger brides are more likely to embrace the tradition of taking their husbands' names in marriage. According to the study, women who married between the ages of 35 and

39 were 6.4 times more likely to keep their maiden names than those who married between the ages of 20 and 24.

Many brides view taking their spouse's name as the natural transition from being a singleton to being a married woman. Other brides prefer they share the same last name as their future children, making the choice to take their husband's name a logical decision. Some brides feel having the same last name as their husbands helps them feel more like a family.

Changing one's name also may make it easier to deal with various issues. Finances, travel and even parenting concerns may be easier when women take their husbands' last names than when they don't.

But some brides still prefer to keep their maiden names or hyphenate those names with their husbands' surnames. Some may view chang-

ing their names as sacrificing their personal identities, while others may want to hold on to a family name they are proud of. Interesting names also can be hard to give up. Brides who find taking their husband's name would be a tongue-twister may prefer to forego this tradition.

Very often women who occupy positions of prominence in their professions keep their maiden names, feeling that taking their husbands' names will affect the cache they have built up thus far. Women uncertain of what to do in such situations can keep their maiden names professionally and still change their names legally.

Changing one's last name is a personal preference and a decision that couples should discuss together. Discuss the decision well in advance of the wedding so that both parties are aware of each other's feelings on the subject before tying the knot.

REIN IN DESTINATION WEDDING COSTS

Destination weddings can make for memorable affairs for brides, grooms and their family and friends. who will need lodging, food and entertainment, and couples can use that to their advantage when negotiating prices. Couples may even be able to negotiate with airlines for discounted airfares if they can guarantee a certain number of travelers.

Destination weddings need not break the bank, as savvy couples can find numerous ways to trim costs.

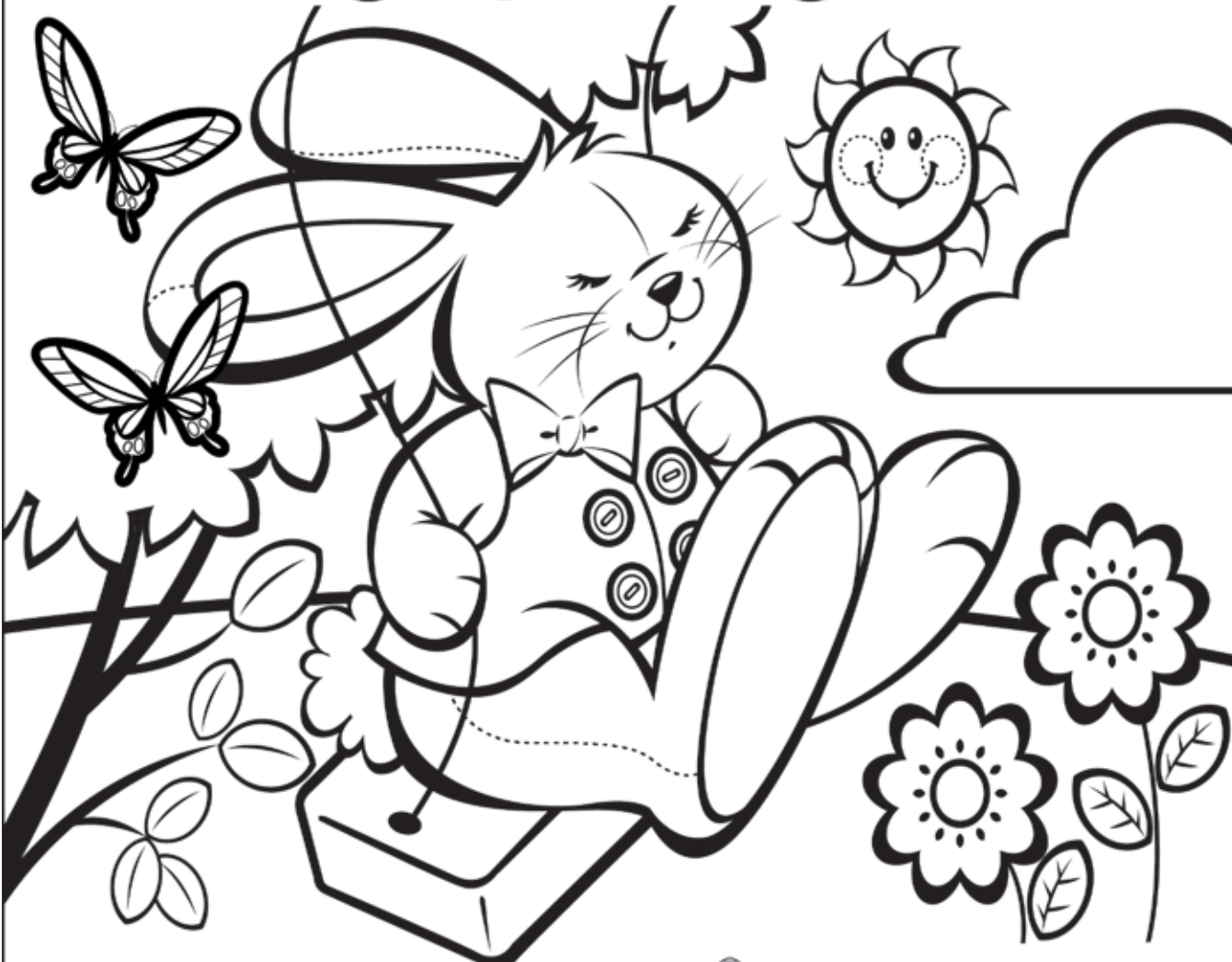

Earlier, I asked a question of one my colleagues about the work that many of our doctors from coast to coast to coast in Canada have done in Ukraine on a volunteer basis. They go

over there and work doing reconstructive surgery and fixing the troops hurt in Ukraine while fighting against the Russian aggression.

I wonder if the hon. member would speak about that. Does he think there is a role our government could play to assist the doctors who are going over to Ukraine to assist our Ukrainian brothers and sisters?"
