REBATES TO HELP ALBERTANS TAP SOLAR RESOURCES

The Alberta government is creating a \$36-million rebate program for solar installation on residential and commercial buildings.

Homeowners, businesses and non-profit organizations will receive rebates for rooftop solar panels that meet the Residential and Commercial Solar Program requirements as early as this summer. "There's a lot of buzz in Alberta around small-scale solar. This program will make solar power affordable for more Albertans, leading to new panels on 10,000 Alberta rooftops by 2020. Along the way, we will create jobs and local expertise in an emerging industry." - Shannon Phillips, Minister of Environment and Parks and Minister Responsible for the Climate Change Office

Solar uptake has doubled in Alberta since 2015, bolstered by initiatives like the Alberta Municipal Solar Program and the On-Farm Solar PV Program. Over the next five years, the Residential and Commercial Solar Program will build on these existing programs. By 2019, the new program is expected to:

• support the creation of 900 jobs in Alberta's solar sector

• cut solar installation costs by up to 30 per cent for residences, and up to 25 per cent for businesses and non-profits

• reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the province by about a half million tonnes, the equivalent of taking 100,000 passenger vehicles off the road


STARS LOTTERY PHONE SCAM

Citizens are receiving phone calls from unknown STARS Lottery representatives advising them they have won a prize. Calls are calling from an Unknown Numbers or Numbers that start with 1-867 prefix. These Unknown Callers are asking people for a form of payment, such as Western Union, in order for their winning prize to be delivered that day. STARS does not practice this form of communication and if you happen to win in their lottery, you would be notified in writing and how to claim your prize. STARS does not request money for their prizes. If you need more information about STARS, please visit their website www. stars.ca

It is strongly suggested that if you receive any calls from any Unfamiliar Numbers, Private Numbers, Unknown Numbers that you do not answer. If you have answered a scam type of call, please hang up, record any information and contact the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 1-888-495-8501. If you have been defrauded from your personal information or finances, please contact your local RCMP or Police Agency.

There are many types of phone scams out there ranging from the false lotteries, income tax scams, to people stating they know your computer has a virus. The best remedy for protecting yourself is to just not answer any unfamiliar calls. If it is someone you know, they will leave you a message or find another way to get a hold of you!

To ensure Albertans receive timely access, the government is posting a Request for Proposal to identify a third party to deliver the new program. Details will be defined in coming months, including qualifying systems, installation and eligibility requirements.

"The Energy Efficiency Advisory Panel heard that Albertans wanted this program. The Prairies have the best solar resources

in Canada, and there are a lot of potential investment opportunities. This is the first of several programs that will help create jobs and diversify Alberta's energy economy into clean sources of energy." - David Dodge, Chair, Energy Efficiency Alberta


cial Solar Program is a reinvestment of the carbon levy.

· "Solar photovoltaic" is the scientific term for cells that convert sunlight into electricity.

• Non-profits interested in applying must be registered under the Federal Business Corporations Act and be incorporated and in good-standing under the Societies Act of Alberta, the Agriculture Societies Act, Companies Act - Part 9, or the Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act.

• On Dec. 21, 2016, the Government of Alberta amended the Micro-generation Regulation to provide more flexible rules for Albertans generating their own electricity. This increased the size limit of a micro-generation system from one megawatt to five megawatts and allows a solar array to serve adjacent sites (especially helpful for operations with more than one building).



Families, businesses, and all Canadians deserve to know how much this new tax will cost them.



LEDUC RCMP INVESTIGATE HOME INVASION

UPDATE: Driver Of Stolen Vehicle Arrested

The stolen Ford Ranger belonging to the victim of a home



invasion has been recovered by the RCMP with the assistance of the Edmonton Police Service, and the female driver arrested.

On March 1, 2017 late in the afternoon Edmonton Police Service located the stolen Ford Ranger. Following investigation, a traffic stop was conducted by EPS and the driver was arrested and taken into custody by the Leduc RCMP.

39 year old Kalisi Alona Harker has been charged with Possession of Property obtained by crime over \$5,000 as well a Provincial driving charge. A hearing was held and she was released on bail. Her first court appearance is scheduled for March 9, 2017 at the Provincial Court of Alberta in Leduc.

The Leduc RCMP General Investigation Section continue to investigate this incident. A composite sketch of one the suspects has been completed with the victim. Shown is a copy of the sketch, referencing Suspect #3.

Public assistance is still requested in identifying any of the suspects or providing information in relation to this invasion.

ORIGINAL RELEASE: Following an interview with a

male who arrived, in handcuffs, at the Leduc RCMP detachment the Leduc RCMP, with the assistance of the Leduc General Investigation Section, are investigating a home invasion.

March 14, 2017

At approximately 2:00 a.m., on February 28, a home was broken into in Leduc County by four males and one female. Initially, they knocked on the door and announced themselves as the police, and then they kicked in a door and handcuffed the homeowner. The suspects were brandishing firearms and demanded that the victim open his safe.

The homeowner was robbed of five firearms as well some other items. The three rifles and two shotguns were properly stored in the homeowner's safe. The stolen items were loaded into the victim's vehicle which was subsequently stolen. All suspects then left the property.

The victim was able to release himself from one of the handcuffs and then enlisted a neighbour to assist him and bring him to the Leduc RCMP Detachment. He was not injured, and was the sole occupant of the residence.

Preliminary investigation leads the RCMP to believe that the suspects were aware of certain property within this home, and targeted the home. The RCMP do not feel that this was a random home invasion.

The suspects are described as follows:

MP EGLINSKI RELINQUISHES HIS SEAT FOR THE DAY IN HONOUR OF 'DAUGHTERS OF THE VOTE'

On March 8th, to mark the 100th anniversary of the first women in Canada being allowed to vote, and in recognition of Canada's 150th birthday, one young woman from each of our country's 338 ridings took a seat in Parliament as part of the 'Daughters of the Vote' initiative.

Mikayla Bosch, from Mayert-

horpe, represented our riding of Yellowhead. She was selected out of a total of 1,500 applications from across Canada. Currently studying International Relations at the University of British Columbia, Ms. Bosch has a strong passion for pursuing a position in leadership, as well as participating in humanitarian projects and global equality.

The initiative, organized in partnership with Equal Voice, also coincided with international Women's Day. Equal Voice is a national, bilingual, multi-partisan organization dedicated to electing more women to all levels of political office in Canada. Despite the advances in political participation in Canada, women remain under-represented. Today, only 26 percent of elected members in the House of Commons are female.

I was pleased to meet with Ms. Bosch and be part of the effort to promote the participation of young women in elected politics. We are privileged to live in Canada, a country in which men and women are regarded as equal. I believe that every person has the right to live the life they want to lead, and it is my hope that all of our children, regardless of their gender, will have the opportunities and tools they require to become tomorrow's leaders.

SHENANIGANS IN FINANCE COMMITTEE

On March 7th, in Ottawa at the House of Commons Standing Committee on Finance Conservative MP Ron Liepert, asked to undertake a study into Alberta's economy and current unemployment levels.

The committee has no agenda scheduled for any meetings in

March as the Government has not presented any agenda items to study. This was a great opportunity for Albertans to have their voices heard by Government. However, despite more than an hour of presentations by Conservative members of the committee as to the merits of such a study, the Liberals used their majority to defeat the motion.

I am disappointed in this deci-

sion. Conservative MP's believe they were elected to do work on behalf of those who elected them. It seems like Government Liberal MPs would rather the committee meet about nothing for the rest of the month or cancel all meetings than actually study what is the number one concern for many Albertans.

In my October householder, 33% of Yellowhead's constitu-

ents identified unemployment as their number one priority and 48% identified the impact of the carbon tax on the economy as their top priority.

While Liberal MPs voted not to undertake a study, Conservative members succeeded to have 2.5 hours of debate take place on the job crisis in Alberta.

Rest assured, we will not let this issue die.



BEWARE OF SCAMMERS

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is warning constituents to beware of emails and letters demanding payment to protect their intellectual property rights.

The Competition Bureau, an independent law enforcement agency, has issued a press release cautioning Canadians of scammers who are exploiting business owners' desires to protect their intellectual property by sending official-looking "reminder notices". These notices demand hefty fees for urgent renewals to protect ownership of trademarks and patents.

Intellectual property forms the basis of business, including names, logos, slogans, domain names, original products and inventions. To protect intellectual property from competitors and copycats, business owners can safeguard it by registering trademarks, patents, and copyrights with the Canadian Intellectual Property Office (CIP0). The fake notices claim to be from the CIPO and demand money to renew these intellectual property rights.

Below are some tips from the Competition Bureau to avoid falling for fake solicitations:

• Check who sent the reminder: Emails from CIPO will come from an address ending in "@canada.ca"; letters will come from 50 Victoria St., Gatineau, QC, K1A 0C9. If the notice comes from elsewhere, it's not from CIPO.

The fees requested in the solicitations are usually much higher than CIPO's fees. Check CIPO's list of fees for a complete list of fees per service.

• Plan ahead: Intellectual property rights need to be renewed at very specific times. For example, trademarks are renewed every 15 years and patents maintenance fees must be paid every year. To know when you are expected to renew your IP rights, consult CIPO's list of fees.

• Read the fine print: It may confirm that the solicitation does not come from CIPO. If still unsure, contact CIPO to confirm that the solicitation is legitimate.

• Ask questions: If you have received an email or correspondence regarding the renewal of your trademark or patent, verify that it is legitimate by contacting the CIPO Client Service Centre at 1-866-997-1936, or by email at ic.contact-contact. ic@canada.ca.

"Businesses who believe they have been misled should contact the Competition Bureau's Information Centre at 1 800 348 5358 or CIPO's Client Services Centre at 1-866-997-1936, or visit the Bureau's website to file a complaint. Businesses can also contact the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 1 888 495 8501, or visit its website," concluded MP Eglinski.


