ROOF COUCH LEADS TO RECOVERY OF STOLEN GOODS

On April 12, 2017, a Yellow-head County Peace Officer observed a pickup truck heading north on Range Road 93 with a couch on the roof. The furniture was not visibly tied down, and the County Peace Officer attempted to pull over the vehicle. The driver of the truck immediately sped up and attempted to evade the Peace Officer by going off the road. The truck became

stuck a very short distance later.

A call for assistance to the Evansburg RCMP Detachment was made at that time.

The County Peace Officer was able to detain the suspect until the RCMP arrived shortly after being called, and a search was made of the driver and his vehicle. A large amount of copper wire was located in the box of the vehicle and identified as being the property of Telus. A controlled substance was also located in the cab of the vehicle.

The RCMP will be laying several criminal charges, including

breach of bail conditions, possession of stolen property, and possession of a controlled substance.

In addition to these charges, the suspect was served four tickets from the Yellowhead County Peace Officer. These tickets were for driving without a license, operating an uninsured motor vehicle, failing to stop for a peace officer, and driving an unregistered motor vehicle on a highway.

A court date has been set for June 10, 2017, in Evansburg Provincial Court.

From April 25, 2017 – Regular Council Meeting




- Council received the 2016 Audited Financial Statements.

Annual Report and updated schedules for Bylaw 2015-07 to the May 23, 2017 Council meeting.


- Council appointed the 2017 Crop and Weed Inspectors.
- Council appointed public members to the Agriculture Service Board, Community Sustainability Committee, and Economic Diversification Committee.



YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

April 11, 2017

2017 Budget & Tax Rate The Yellowhead County 2017 final budget was adopted by Council in the amount of \$158,293,059 (including School and Seniors requisitions). The 2016 Audited Financial Statement presented by the external auditor Hawkings, Epp, Dumont was also adopted by Council. There will be no tax increase in the MUNICIPAL mill rate. It remains at 2.4585 for residential and farmland; and at 6.3658 for non-residential.

FCM Legal Defense Fund – Council made a decision to financially contribute to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' legal Defense Fund initiative at the annual rate of \$.023 per resident for a total of \$252.83. This funding goes towards protecting municipal legal rights in bodies such as the Court of Appeal (provincial and federal) the Supreme Court of Canada and administrative bodies like the CRTC.

2017 Gravel Programs – Council awarded the 2017 Summer Gravel Program to Jones Trucking and Backhoe Service Ltd. in the amount of \$661,506.02.

Tom Hill Tower Road – The contract for the Tom Hill Tower Road grade, base and pave project was awarded to Carmacks Enterprises Ltd. at a total tender price of \$ 8,366,002.17. This amount includes a bridge size culvert and 12.7 kms of road grading, basework, and paving.

Rehab and Paving Contract – The River Ridge Subdivision, Carldale Road, and a culvert settlement repair contract was awarded to Knelsen Sand & Gravel Ltd. at a total tender price of \$2,732,233.91. The tender includes the work to rehabilitate the River Ridge Subdivision roads, the Carldale Road, and to undertake culvert settlement pavement repairs at various locations in the County

Peers ASP –Ash McKone was appointed as a Steering Committee Member for the 2017 Peers Area Structure Plan. The Steering Committee helps facilitate discussions with the public and makes recommendations regarding the Statutory Plan which helps guide future growth and development in the Peers area.

April 25, 2017

2016 County Assessment – A presentation by Accurate Assessment gave an overview of residential and

farmland, and non-residential (industry) assessments for 2016. Information on current industrial activity within Yellowhead County was also presented.

AB Prevents Cancer Presentation — A presentation was made to council showing some of the ways community groups and residents can take part-in to prevent cancer. There was also information about programs that community groups are receiving funding for to promote a healthier and more active lifestyle through the Alberta Prevents Cancer organization.

Connect to Innovate - Council will

provide a letter of support for a joint application for the Connect to Innovate program that funds bringing high-speed Internet to rural and remote communities. Yellowhead County, 3CIS, and CCI Wireless have partnered on the application. Cadomin, Brule/Entrance Pinedale Estates, and Mayburn Mountain were identified by the Federal government as areas in Yellowhead County that are eligible for this funding.

Wildwood Fire Station – Council awarded the tender for the construction of the new Wildwood Fire Station to OML-Construction Services LTD for \$3,361,000 (lowest bid received), plus contingency and furniture. OML will be working with BR2 Architecture to build the new station.

Bylaw Amendment Needed For Road Closure –Bylaw 5.17 is an amendment to a bylaw previously passed by Council. The updated bylaw corresponds to the legal land description for the property needed for approval from Alberta Land Titles.

The next Council Meetings are May 9 & 23, 2017. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is May 16, 2017. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

Week of April 17, 2017

On Tuesday, I was in Vancouver where I met with representatives of the Rocky Mountaineer Train where I was involved with the 2017 launching of the Rocky Mountaineer Tourism Train.

Later that morning, I met with Conservative members in the riding of Nanaimo-Ladysmith followed by an afternoon meeting with Conservative members in the riding of Victoria. That evening I returned to Yellowhead riding.

On Wednesday, I gave some opening remarks at a showing of Corner Gas: The Movie at Continuing Care in Edson for National Film Day. That evening, I attended an open house and public information meeting for the Canyon Creek Pumped Hydro Project in Hinton. After that, I delivered more opening remarks for a National Film Day viewing of Into the Forest at the Hinton Municipal Library.

On Thursday, I visited grade six

This week I met with constituents in and around my Edson constituency office, and on Thursday I met with CN Police to discuss the railroad crossing issues in Edson. We are attempting to resolve the problem.

I attended an event hosted at MacEwan University on Friday, where I met with youth and young conservative leaders. I always enjoy meeting with young people with an interest in politics, and sharing with them how they can influence change and serve as productive and thoughtful cit-

izens.

I had the pleasure of attending and speaking at the Royal Canadian Legion's District 8 Rally, hosted by Edson's Joe Wynne Branch #51. I am proud of the past contributions of veterans to our freedom and security, as well as the present contributions of legions to our communities.

TIPS TO STOP SCHOOLYARD BULLYING

- Take it seriously. It's easy to say, "Kids will be kids" and assume it will pass. But if your child is coming home upset and is suddenly anxious about school because of the way a kid (or kids) are treating him, you should pay attention.
- Drop your kid off at school or stand on the sidelines during recess. Bullying tends to occur when adult supervision is lacking, so before school or on the playground at recess.
- Talk to other parents. Young kids are talkers. If you're friendly with a parent in your kid's class, ask them if their child has mentioned anything about kids being picked on at school.
- Tell the teacher. It's really important to let your child's teacher know what your kid is telling you -- especially if someone is getting hit.
- Empower your children. Let your kids know that it's not their fault that they are being bullied. Teach your kids to focus on their own behavior.


Tips about Strangers

A stranger is anyone you don't know. There is no way to tell by the way a person looks if they are dangerous or not. A dangerous person does not always look mean or scary, so judging by the way people look is a mistake. It's not so easy to tell who is okay and who is not. Just because someone looks nasty doesn't mean that they would hurt you and just because someone looks nice, doesn't mean that they are a nice person.

There is only one person that is with you all the time and can be responsible for keeping you safe at all times. THAT PERSON IS YOU! Safety rules need to apply ALL THE TIME, not just when someone who looks bad or scary is around. One of the most common ways that kids get hurt by strangers is when being friendly and helpful to adults who pretend to need help. When you are without your parents or other adult you know, it is your job to protect yourself. It is not your job to offer help to any adults, even if they ask! A grownup who needs help should get help from another adult, not a child. So remember, looking out for yourself is your biggest job when you are not with your parents or another adult, so you have permission without your parents' permission. You should learn whose to ignore or refuse adult requests for help

Stranger Tips:

- · Walk and play with others and use the buddy system. If you walk somewhere, walk with other children.
- · Adults do not usually ask children for directions or help, they should be asking other adults. If someone in a car should stop to ask for directions, you should not go near the car.
- Stay an arms reach or more away from strangers. Stand up, back up and run to someone who can help you if you feel afraid.
- · If someone is following you on foot or in a car, go to a place where there are other people--to a neighbor's home or into a store, a police station or even a library for instance--and ask for help.
- No one should ask you to look for lost items such as a "lost puppy" or tell you that either of your parents is in trouble and that he or she will take you to mom or dad. If someone tells you this, run the other way immediately and find help with an adult you know or run into a safe place you know.
- Never go near a car with someone in it or get into a car

TRANSPLANTING TREES NO SMALL TASK

An alluring landscape can make a home that much more enjoyable. Many homeowners devote considerable time to their lawns and gardens, and that devotion can pay both instant and long-term dividends. A wellgroomed landscape can make it more enjoyable to relax in the yard, and such a property will be more attractive to prospective buyers when homeowners want to sell their homes.

But even the most well-de-

signed landscapes sometimes need some rearranging, and those changes may involve transplanting trees. Homeowners may transplant trees for various reasons. Some homeowners might be moving to a new home and want to take a favorite tree along with them, while some trees simply outgrow their existing space and need to be moved elsewhere on the property. Regardless of why trees need to be transplanted, homeowners can take several steps to ensure the process goes as smoothly as possible.

Determine why the tree needs to be moved. Some trees that are not thriving in their existing location may not benefit from a transplant. For example, a tree with a pest infestation might need to be replaced rather than transplanted. Determining the reason behind a transplant can save you the trouble of transplanting that won't benefit from the move. If a tree is not getting adequate sunlight in its present location, then transplanting it to a different location on your property with more exposure to sunlight might reinvigorate the tree. If soil is the problem, than transplanting the tree might prove ineffective unless you also test the soil where you plan to move the tree and adjust it so the tree can thrive.

· Prune the tree roots. Tiny roots that extend beyond the tree absorb water and nutrients, and such roots need to be pruned before transplanting a tree.

Landscaping professionals note that root pruning stimulates the growth of new small roots nearer to the tree's trunk, and these newer roots will be dug up when the time comes to transplant the tree. Root pruning must be done well in advance of transplanting the tree. For example, if you hope to transplant the tree in the fall, then do your root pruning in the spring before new buds appear on the tree. Speak with your landscaper or a nearby garden center to determine the best way to prune your tree's

· Time your transplant correctly. Avoid transplanting trees when temperatures are colder and the ground is frozen. Trans-

planting before or after a thaw allows the transplanted roots time to develop. In addition, transplanting the day after you have watered the soil around the tree reduces the stress on the tree's roots, making it easier to keep the root ball intact.


· Protect the root ball. When transplanting a tree, make sure the root ball does not dry out. If it does, the tree likely won't thrive in its new location and all your hard work will have been for naught. Cover the root ball with damp burlap or canvas so it can retain more of the moisture it will need to adapt to its new location.

· Plant the tree sooner rather than later. While you can store a transplanted tree before you plant it elsewhere on your property, storing it for a long period of time increases the chances that the transplant will be unsuccessful. Ideally, you want to plant the tree in its new location as soon as possible. If you must store it, make sure you don't suffocate the root ball, as roots must be kept damp or they will die and potentially cost you the tree.

Transplanting a tree can add appeal to a property and help reinvigorate an unhealthy tree.





4) Work together to address the bullying situation. Don't confront the parents of the bully directly.


5) Ask your child specific questions about how your child is treated by peers, who he or she eats lunch with, and how other children are treated.


6) Teach your child to be assertive. Your child should be able to express feelings and needs clearly, without shouting or other aggressive behavior.

FIVE TOP GOLF TIPS TO HELP BOOST YOUR GAME

(NC) When it comes to golf, it's the little things that can have the biggest impact on your game. Whether it's your first attempt, or 10th season, golf expert Bob Weeks has got you covered at the links this summer with these five tips:

Choose the right clubs: Regardless of your experience or skill level, choosing the right equipment can be the difference between duffing it and striking the ball straight down the fairway. It's important to work with a professional to get the clubs best-suited to your game and then, to have them custom fit. You should be fit for the length, loft, lie angle, shaft flex and even the grip size. If your clubs aren't custom fit, it will be like

walking around in shoes that are the wrong size.

Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally twopiece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or fourpiece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.

Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be

considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on

your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round. Light, non-restrictive clothing will allow you to swing freely and keep you comfortable and cool in the heat, or warm if the temperature drops. If you're a guest, always check out the dress code at the club you'll be visiting to ensure you comply with the rules.

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients there to play golf or do business?

Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo – first person on the green gets a point; Bango – the player whose ball is closest to the pin

when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo –the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.


Walk it off: Make a small 'healthy' tweak to your game by walking vs. taking a cart. When you choose to walk rather than drive 18 holes, you'll cover approximately six kilometres and burn around 1,500 - 2,000 calories. Golfers that ride carts will burn only about 1,100 - 1,300



Credit Card Fraud Prevention Tips:

 Keep an eye on your credit card every time you use it, and make sure you get it back as quickly as possible. Try not to let your credit card out of your sight whenever possible.

2. Be very careful to whom you give your credit card. Don't give out your account number over the phone unless you initiate the call and you know the company is reputable. Never give your credit card info out when you receive a phone call. (For example, if you're told there has been a 'computer problem' and the caller needs you to verify information.)

 Never respond to emails that request you provide your credit card info via email -- and don't ever respond to emails that ask you to go to a website to verify personal information.
 Never provide your credit card information on a website.

 Never provide your credit card information on a website that is not a secure site.

Sign your credit cards as soon as you receive them.

Shred all credit card applications you receive.

Never leave your credit cards or receipts lying around.

8. Don't write your PIN number on your credit card -- or have it anywhere near your credit card (in the event that your wallet gets stolen).

Shield your credit card number so that others around you can't copy it or capture it on a cell phone or other camera.
 Keep a list in a secure place with all of your account numbers and expiration dates, as well as the phone number and address of each bank that has issued you a credit card.

11. Only carry around credit cards that you absolutely need. Don't carry around extra credit cards that you rarely use.

12. Open credit card bills promptly and make sure there are no bogus charges. Treat your credit card bill like your checking account -- reconcile it monthly. Save your receipts so you compare.

13. If you find any charges that you don't have a receipt for -- or that you don't recognize -- report these charges promptly (and in writing) to the credit card issuer.

Always void and destroy incorrect receipts.






