SPLASH PAD ADDITION TO BE ADDED TO MAYERTHORPE AQUATIC CENTRE!

Mayerthorpe Aquatic Centre will see the addition of a splash pad feature this fall!

The project will provide for a new water feature bringing joy and excitement to the children and families of Mayerthorpe and area. The new feature will be 840 square feet with nine (9) spray features on the existing concrete deck. The splash pad will have its own control system

with a press button activator that will allow the features only to operate when people are using the splash pad for cost and operating efficiency.

Citizens identified the need for a splash park in the Town as part of the 2009 Municipal Sustainability Initiative. After researching the feasibility of a stand-alone splash park versus an addition to the Mayerthorpe Aquatic Centre, it became evident that a splash pad addition to the existing Centre was most feasible. After consultation with the Mayerthorpe & Area Aquatic & Recreation Society, Council approved the Splash Pad Addition Project to proceed in 2017. The Town issued a Request for Proposal with a closing date of April 24, 2017. On May 8, 2017 Council awarded the Project to PlayQuest Recreation in the amount of \$71,500.00 excluding GST.

85TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

The Anniversary Celebration will be marked by an evening banquet, guest speaker (Pastor Adam Wiebe from Saskatoon, former OBC youth pastor), a group photo, and plenty of friends to visit with and memorabilia to look at. On Sunday, August 27, 1933 the first service was held in the newly built church building where members of the Onoway Baptist Church still gather. The original 26' X 40' structure had been started in April with the digging of a full basement using only man and horse power! Also, most of the lumber used in the construction, and the labor to build it were all donated by the members of the church. After many hot summer hours of volunteer labor balanced with the time needed to manage their farms, the building was completed and ready to use. This was a good thing considering

the harvest season that was just ahead of them.

On Sunday, August 27 of this year, Onoway Baptist will gather again for a different recognition. Instead of a first service for a new building, it will be a farewell service for Pastor Rick and Glenda Foster. After 26 1/2 years of ministry to our church and community, they are stepping away from the pastoral role they were called to over a quarter of a century ago. This service will also be held in the Community Hall at 10 a.m. and will involve other pastors and members of our community.







PASTURE WALK AND TALK - FROM UPLANDS TO LOWLANDS A FIELD DAY WITH COWS AND FISH



As a member community, Ross Haven will enjoy stable response levels, upgraded medical co-response qualifications, and rapid chute times (units rolling within 2-minutes).

Onoway Regional Fire Service

provides enriched emergency response to Alberta Beach, Castle Island, Nakamun Park, Onoway, Ross Haven, Silver Sands, Sunset Point, South View, Val Quinton, & Yellowstone. Unfortunately, neighbouring areas - even when close by, are NOT protected by Onoway Regional Fire Services as a primary responder. This in in accordance to Lac Ste Anne County's refusal to agree to automatic aid. Property owners living within 13-KM of Onoway or Alberta Beach are urged to confirm their insurance providers are aware of the distance from their primary fire station.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE **WEEK OF JUNE 12, 2017**

The House continues to sit until midnight from Monday through Thursday in order to debate as much legislation as possible before Parliament breaks for the summer.

The following was debated in the House:
