LENGTHY INVESTIGATION LEADS TO SEVERAL CHARGES FOR LOCAL MALE

Stony Plain, Alberta – Between November 24, 2016 and May 24, 2017 the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP have been investigating several files in relation property crimes in the Spruce Grove, Stony Plain and Parkland County areas.

The investigation lead to the

arrest of Alex Carriere on May 24, 2017.

Alex Carriere, age 27, of Spruce Grove is now facing several charges including;

- Possession of Stolen Property
- Theft of a Motor Vehicle
- Theft over \$5,000.00
- Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle
- Fail to Comply x 5
- Resist Arrest

- Flight from Police
 - Armed Robbery
 - Possession of Break and Enter tools
 - Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose
 - Possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine)
- Carriere is set to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on July 14, 2017

UPDATE: Seeking public's assistance in relation to a home invasion (One male arrested).

Parkland County, Alberta: On the evening of June 13, 2017 Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP located and arrested Brandon Regamey, one of the male suspects (suspect 1 as per below) involved in a home invasion in Parkland County on June 7, 2017.

Brandon Regamey is facing the following charges:

- Break and enter to a residence/theft over five thousand Sec 348(1)(a) C.C.

• Possession of a weapon for the purpose of committing an offence Sec 88 C.C.

• Use of a firearm while committing an indictable offence Sec 85(1)(a) C.C.

• Pointing a firearm without lawful excuse Sec. 87 C.C.

• Robbery using a firearm Sec 344(1)(b) C.C.

• Utter a Threat to cause death or bodily harm Sec 264.1(1) C.C.

Regamey has been remanded into custody and is scheduled to appear in Stony Plain Provincial court on June 21, 2017.

Police are still asking that anyone with knowledge of this incident or identity of the other

suspect(s) to contact the Stony Plain RCMP at 780-968-7200. If you want to remain anonymous, you can contact crime stoppers by phone at 1-800-222-8477 (TIPS), by internet at www.tip-submit.com, or by SMS (www.crimestoppers.ab.ca for instructions). You do not have to reveal your identity to Crime Stoppers, and if you provide information to Crime Stoppers that leads to an arrest, the recovery of stolen property, and/or the seizure of illicit drugs, you may be eligible for a cash reward. Crime Stoppers does not subscribe to call display and the identity of the caller will remain anonymous.

Background: Parkland County, Alberta: Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP would like to thank the public for their tips leading to the identification of one of the male suspects (suspect 1 as per below) involved in a home invasion in Parkland County on June 7, 2017.

A warrant for the arrest of Brandon Regamey, age 21 of the village

of Wabamun has been issued in relation to the home invasion.

Parkland County, Alberta – On June 7, 2017 at approximately 5:15 AM five unknown males forced their way into a residence near the Beach Corner Esso, at Rang Road 15 and Hwy 16A in Parkland Coun-

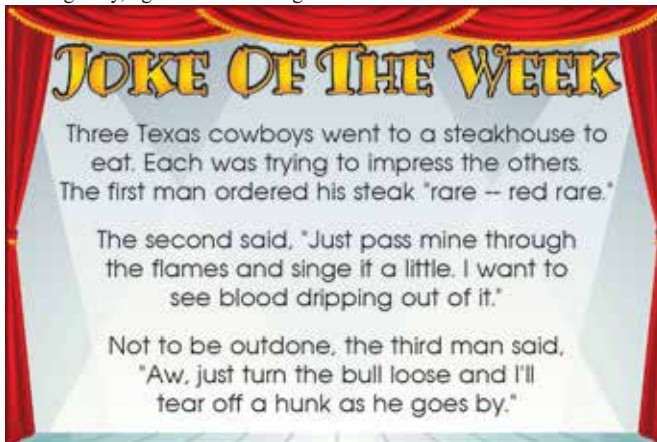
ty. The males threatened the homeowners with firearms and a knife before stealing thousands of dollars' worth of cigarettes, which were being stored in the home. The suspects then fled. One of the suspects was seen on video footage leaving in a newer model, silver, four door Nissan Altima.

Video footage captured two of the five male suspects who are described as....

- Suspect 1:
- Medium build
 - Short brown hair
 - Brown eyes
 - Clean shaven
 - Wearing light blue jeans, black t-shirt, green ball cap and brown high top running shoes.

- Suspect 2:
- Thick build

 - Clean shaven
 - Wearing a red shorts, red t-shirt, red ball cap, black gloves and black/red runners.

The homeowners/victims did not suffer any injuries.

(NHSP) 2017-2018.

- advocacy for support of Indigenous patients and their families across the continuum of care: from healthcare facilities to community services. Promotes awareness and consultation between patients, families, communities, and AHS staff;
- assistance for Indigenous clients, families, agencies, and communities in accessing AHS and non-AHS programs and services;
- assistance for AHS healthcare providers to better understand barriers to care for Indigenous populations;
- promotes collaboration and partnerships with AHS, the Indigenous communities, and other relevant stakeholders.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

June 13, 2017

Culvert Replacement - A tender for the replacement of a culvert on Township Road 570, West of Hwy 32 (for a tributary to the McLeod River) was awarded to Prairie Erectors International Inc. for \$334,775.

Municipal Historic Designations Approved - Council approved applications for Municipal Historic Resource Designation for the Matthews United Church in Peers built in 1927 and the Cooper Barn, built in the 1950's. This is a step towards declaring the sites a Municipal Historic Resource under the Historic Resources Act.

Public Golf Course Public Hearing - A Public Hearing for Bylaw 6.17 was held to rezone a property, located south of Hwy 16 near Millers Lake (SE-06-53-19-W5,) from Rural District to Recreational Use District for a proposed public golf course. One letter was received expressing concern over increased traffic, dust, and property taxes, although there was a showing of support for this development during the public hearing.

Subdivision Public Hearing - A Public Hearing was held for Bylaw 07.17 for a property east of Edson (Part of the NW 19-53-

16-W5M) that would redistrict it from Rural District to Country Residential District zoning and allow for a five-acre subdivision to be separated from the current 70-acre parcel. No concerns from the Public were brought forward at the hearing.

Industrial Rezoning - Bylaw 08.17 received first reading for property located in the Branch Corner Area Structure Plan and designated as Industrial land under the Land Use Concept. Rezoning the property from Rural District (RD) to Rural Industrial District (RI) would allow for the expansion of the logging business

located on the site. A Public Hearing will be held on July 25, 2017.

Hydro Energy Road Allowance Closure - A request by Turning Point Generation to close several undeveloped road allowances was granted by Council. The site if for a proposed pumped hydro energy storage facility located at the old Obed Mountain Coal Mine Operations site. The closure of the road allowance is required before the province can allow for this development can take place on Crown Land.

Property Tax Agreement - Yellowhead County has entered into property tax agreement with No-

tine Holdings Inc. to collect their 2017 property taxes.

Road Construction Extension - Council approved a time extension to Sun Gro Horticulture Ltd. for the completion of the road construction to RR 85 to September 30, 2017. A \$307,500 letter of credit can be cashed County if the work is not completed by the deadline to cover the costs of any remaining road construction.

The next Council Meetings is June 27, 2017. The next Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is June 20, 2017. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

GOLFER'S GUIDE

FIVE TOP GOLF TIPS TO HELP BOOST YOUR GAME

(NC) When it comes to golf, it's the little things that can have the biggest impact on your game. Whether it's your first attempt, or 10th season, golf expert Bob Weeks has got you covered at the links this summer with these five tips:

Choose the right clubs: Regardless of your experience or skill level, choosing the right equipment can be the difference between duffing it and striking the ball straight down the fairway. It's important to work with a professional to get the clubs best-suited to your game and then, to have them custom fit. You should be fit for the length, loft, lie angle, shaft flex and even the grip size. If your clubs aren't custom fit, it will be like

walking around in shoes that are the wrong size.

Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally two-piece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or four-piece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.

Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be

considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on

your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round. Molson Canadian 67 for example is specially brewed with 67 calories and an ABV of 3% per 341ml, offering a light, refreshing alternative for active players.

GOLFER'S GUIDE

HOW TO HELP KIDS GET INTO GOLF

Golf is a game of skill that can take years, if not decades, to master. Many golfers find their time on the golf course both rewarding and relaxing, even on those days when the fairways seem impossible to find.

Though many players never swing a golf club until they reach adulthood, it's never too early to hit the links. Some of the world's most accomplished golfers, including four-time Masters champion Tiger Woods, began playing as toddlers, and many feel that getting an early start can lead to a more successful game down the road.

Getting kids into golf is a great way for parents to bond with their children while enjoying the great outdoors. Golf can also be used to teach kids humility, sportsmanship and the importance of hard work. Thanks to the often frustrating nature of golf, parents may find it somewhat challenging to instill a love of the game in their youngsters. But there are ways to introduce kids to this wonderful game that kids might just play for the rest of their lives.

- Focus on having fun. Few, if any, golfers at your local golf course on a given weekend could say with certainty that golf has never frustrated them. The challenge of golf may be its most appealing characteristic to older players, but young kids can be easily overwhelmed by the challenges golf presents. By focusing on having fun instead of perfecting

techniques, parents can get kids to look forward to their time on the links. The more fun kids have, the more likely they will be to embrace the game and its many challenges. Don't put pressure on youngsters as they develop their games, but encourage them through their struggles and reassure them that you faced the same obstacles when you started playing.

- Hire an instructor with experience teaching children. Instructors with experience teaching children will understand the basics of the game and how learning those basics provides a great foundation for future enjoyment and success on the course. Instructors who have

taught kids in the past also know that teaching youngsters the finer points of golf requires patience and encouragement. Ask a fellow parent or an employee at the club where you play to recommend an instructor for your child. And take advantage of any kids' courses your club offers.

- Purchase the correct equipment. Even the best golfers are bound to struggle when using the wrong equipment. While it might be unwise to invest in especially expensive equipment for youngsters likely to grow out of it in a few months' time, deals can be found on used kids' equipment. Used kids' equipment is typically

subjected to less wear and tear than used equipment for adults, as kids tend to play less often and fewer holes than adults when they do play. But make sure to find correctly sized equipment that kids feel comfortable using.

- Play some holes. Instructors may teach kids the differences between the types of clubs and how to swing and putt. But golf is most fun when players are out on the links going from hole to hole. Instruction is important, but don't forget to play a few holes with your child each week as well.

Golf is a challenging game, but it's one that can be enjoyed by athletes of all ages.
