### SUMMER VACATION CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

St. Albert RCMP is hoping all residents have a fantastic summer, enjoying the longer days and warm weather but they also want to remind the Community to be safe. Criminals do not take vacations so protect yourself when you do.

Here are some tips to keep your property safe while you are away:

· Seek the assistance of your neighbours to keep an eye on your house while you're away. Request that they drive by once every day or two and provide them a key in order for them to check inside as well. Request that they park their secondary vehicle in your driveway so it appears someone is home during the overnight.

• Don't announce vacations on Social Media sites such as Facebook or Instagram. Many people announce their excitement for a two week vacation online. check in on Facebook from the airport and then proceed to post photos from their destination. This is a criminal's dream come true as you have given them your complete itinerary and a golden opportunity to burglarize your

home.

• Keeping your blinds/curtains drawn shut while you're away obviously defers criminals from peering inside your home, however if your blinds/curtains are usually always open then this could be perceived as uncharacteristic for your home. Should you choose to leave your blinds/ curtains open while away, ensure all valuables such as jewelry and computers are out of sight from the window. Also ensure all windows are left closed and locked even second floor windows.





• Leaving lights on in the home while you are away makes it appear as if someone is home, however there's no need to leave every light on while you're away. Consider purchasing a light timer to make it appear as if someone is inside. It will also be easier when vour electric bill comes in the mail. Timers can be purchased online that can be controlled via your smartphone to manually turn lights on/off while you're away avoiding a simple pattern found in basic timers. Consider having that neighbour also retrieve your mail and flyers. An overflowing mailbox with last weeks flyers is a clear indicator that nobody's home. If you're out of town for an extended period of time consider having Canada Post either redirect or stop your mail during that time.

• Make sure your residence appears that it's owners are still

home while you're away. Ensure that you landscape the day before you leave, cut your grass lower to ensure it will last looking kempt for the duration of your vacation. If you leave a key hidden outside under a mat or plant in the event you misplace your keys, first of all, find a better hiding spot, secondly, make sure you place that key inside while you're away. If a criminal manages to confirm that you are out of town they have all of the time in the world to search for an outside key for easy





### **DIRECT ENERGY EMERGENCY FUND** PROVIDES RELIEF FOR UTILITY BILLS

EDMONTON, AB - Direct Energy is donating \$250,000 over three years to create an emergency fund for people in the Alberta Capital Region who are experiencing utility-related acute financial crises.

"Unemployment rates are higher in this region than they have been in 25 years and we

know that families and individuals are struggling," said Anne Smith, President and CEO of United Way of the Alberta Capital Region. "Partners like Direct Energy make it possible for United Way to provide support and address these needs in our community."

Effective Thursday, June 22, people can learn more about the fund by calling the 211 phone line, which refers Albertans to community and social services.

"Last year, 798 people reached

out to 211 looking for assistance to pay a utility bill," said Emma Potter, Acting Manager of Help Lines for 211 in Edmonton. "That number continues to rise in 2017."

Emergency grants will be provided to those who are in crisis and at risk of falling into poverty due to utility bills in arrears or a disconnection notice. Funds will be available through agencies in six communities: Edmonton, Fort Saskatchewan, Strathcona County, Parkland County, Leduc (City and County), and St. Albert.

"We serve almost one million Alberta customers and often hear first-hand about their financial challenges," said Tanis Kozak, Vice President and General Manager, Canada, Direct Energy. "Through the new Direct Energy Emergency Fund, we are proud to further assist Alberta's most vulnerable customers with their natural gas and electricity bills and help families avoid or rebuild from a financial crisis."

Direct Energy has donated another \$250,000 to the United Way of Calgary to address similar needs there.

### LIBERALS FAIL ON SOFTWOOD LUMBER

On April 25th, the U.S. Department of Commerce imposed countervailing duties as high as 24% on Canadian softwood lumber imports.

During the last dispute, over 15,000 jobs were lost and the Canadian forestry industry had to pay \$5.4 billion in duties. It was our previous Conservative government that negotiated an

agreement to end that dispute within three months of coming into office in 2006, as well as negotiated the 2012 extension of the deal through to October 2016.

In Alberta, the forest industry employs over 19,000 people, the majority of which are in our riding of Yellowhead, and in Canada, 370,000 jobs are directly or indirectly tied to the forestry sector. It is upsetting to me that, even with all those jobs at stake,

negotiating a new softwood lumber agreement has never been a priority for this Liberal government.

Last Fall, I asked the government what action they were taking to ensure stability and predictability for Canadian forestry workers with the response that they will "defend our Canadian workers." They have known since November that the United States was planning to launch trade action against Canada. Yet,

instead of proactively defending hardworking Canadians, the Liberals failed to negotiate a new Softwood Lumber Agreement and are putting almost 400,000 jobs across the country at risk.

The Liberal government is failing to create jobs and grow the economy, and have now failed forestry workers and their families, jeopardizing their livelihoods.

### **CANADA SUMMER JOBS 2017**

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead is pleased to advise that the Canada Summer Jobs program provided \$499,141 throughout the riding in investment to support our students.

"I am pleased that students in the riding of Yellowhead will benefit from this program. Summer work experience helps to equip young people with the skills and experience they need to enter the workforce once they have completed their studies," stated MP Eglinski.

While providing funding to help employers, the program creates summer job opportunities for students. ## THE REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

The Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) is an apprenticeship program especially for high school students. Usually, trade apprenticeships in Alberta began after students have graduated from high school. But since some students are ready to learn and practice their chosen future trade while still in high school, RAP is an ideal program for them.

RAP students are full-time high school students and are also registered apprentices. They must divide their time between an approved work site and their regular school classes. Fortunately, the time a RAP student spends at school and on the work site can be quite flexible - the student might work as a RAP apprentice for a semester, for half of each school day, or for one or two days per week, or during summers, holidays and weekends.

The RAP apprenticeship ends when the RAP apprentice finishes high school. At that time, the student is automatically registered as a regular apprentice and the credit earned while in the RAP program is applied to his or her apprenticeship.

This year, at OJSH, six graduating students successfully completed their RAP apprenticeship. Konor Halyk, Lane Hapienko, and James Stirling completed their RAP welder apprenticeship with Academy Fabricators. Also completing her welder's RAP apprenticeship was Ashleigh Lindemann with Stenger Welding Ltd. Mark Kosik completed his RAP apprenticeship in the



heavy duty technician with H & P Kosik Construction. And, Austin Ertman completed his RAP



apprenticeship as a cook with the OJSH Kitchen Café.



### SEARCH WARRANT LEADS TO NUMEROUS CHARGES

Stony Plain, AB - On June 20th, 2017 members of the Stony Plain / Spruce Grove / Enoch Drug Section executed a search warrant at a rural property in Parkland County, AB. As a result of the investigation police found 96 grams of methamphetamine, 350 milliliters of gamma- hydroxybutyric acid (GHB), 17.2 grams of cocaine, 5 long guns, 4 high capacity magazines for a shotgun, ammunition, \$2520 in Canadian currency, brass knuckles, a stun gun disguised as a cell phone and drug trafficking paraphernalia.

Philip KRUSHINSKY of Parkland County, AB was arrested and is facing the following charges: possession of methamphetamine for the purpose of trafficking, possession of gamma - hydroxybutyric acid (GHB) for the purpose of trafficking, possession of property obtained by crime (under \$5000), 2 counts of possession of a prohibited weapon, careless storage of a firearm and 8 counts of possession of a weapon while prohibited.

KRUSHINSKY was remanded into custody and his first court appearance is scheduled for June 28th, 2017 at Stony Plain Provincial Court.

### ALBERTA RCMP WARNS AGAINST **BINARY OPTION SCAMS**

Every year, thousands of Albertans fall victims to fraud, losing millions of dollars. Most people don't believe it could happen to them, but fraudsters use sophisticated ways to target people of all ages. Last year, there were a total of 8,317 cases of fraud reported in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions from January to October.

Some of the most common scams in Canada in 2016 included:

- · Romance scams: Fraudsters steal photos and use dating sites and social media to lure potential victims into sending money for various rea-
- · Wire Fraud scams: Financial industry wire fraud occurs when Canadian financial institutions and investment brokers receive fraudulent email requests from who they believe to be an existing client.
- · Investments scams: An investment scam is any solicitation (telephone, mail, email, etc.) for investments into false, deceptive or misleading investment opportunities, often referring to higher than normal or true monetary returns which consumers lose most or all of their money.
- · Merchandise scams: Involves deceptive websites selling counterfeit goods from existing retailers at discounted prices. They use the concept of a limited, one-time-only sale to attract online buyers.

"Fraud has a devastating impact on individuals, families, businesses and to our economy. The RCMP believes that the best way to fight these types of crime is through awareness because the more you know about a scam, the less likely you are to be victimized. Albertans should immediately report any incident to the appropriate authorities," said Inspector K.C.A. (Allan) Lai, Acting Officer-in-Charge of RCMP "K" Division Federal Policing for Southern Alberta.

Recently, scammers have also been targeting Canadians and Albertans using binary option scams. According to the Alberta Securities Commission (ASC), Albertans who fall victim to binary options scams lose, on average, more than \$20,000. Similar to gambling, binary options work much like a wager. All or nothing "bets" are invested based on how an asset will perform within a certain timeframe. The asset could be a stock, a currency or a commodity. This type of scam is typically offered online. Binary options websites are designed to look legitimate, enticing users with promises of high rates of return and very low-risk.

Albertans should know that companies offering securities to Canadians must be registered in the province they do business. Currently, there are no registered binary options dealers in Alberta.

The following tips from the ASC

will help protect you from binary scams.

- · Be cautious when asked to provide personal information and credit card details over the phone and internet.
- · Do your due diligence, research an investment opportunity and seek the council of an independent third party.
- · Prior to investing, ask for information on the investment. Check the registration and
- · enforcement history.
- The Canadian Securities Admin-

istrator (CSA) encourages all investors to visit www.aretheyregistered.






