This decision was made after significant review, consideration of complex technical operational and maintenance requirements, and receiving input from users and citizens of the Town.

Town staff will be assessing the current state of the facility, determining operational needs, and establishing operational protocols to enable the continued operation and use of the Centre.

July 4, 2017 WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

JUNE 30, 2017

Construction season is upon us, and Whitecourt's 2017 Street Improvement Program will be starting soon. Council has awarded the project contract to Knelson Rock Products Ltd. Work includes rehabilitation to a number of roadways (including Dahl Drive, Caxton Street, Wedow Drive, Chaisson Crossing, and Park Drive) as well as the extension of local pathways, and utility cut restorations. Watch for advertisements in the coming weeks notifying residents of construction areas.

Starting August 28, 2017, Public Transit and Dial-A-Bus will be integrated to provide a 30 minute pickup service during peak hours. This service level change was approved as part of the budget process to meet transit user needs and increase ridership. Watch for advertisements near the end of summer promoting the new schedule and updated route.

Scott Safety Ltd. has donated two surplus fire training structures to the Town of Whitecourt for the Fire Training Grounds, located at the Town's Public Works Shop and operated by the Whitecourt Fire Department. The new structures, a high angle tower and a confined space training structure, will enhance practice and training opportunities for local firefighters. As part of the donation agreement, Scott Safety Ltd. will be provided access to the training grounds.

Council has donated a Ford passenger bus, previously used for Dial-A-Bus service, to the 721 Hawks Foundation. The bus was replaced in 2016 with a new vehicle, and was recently advertised for dispersal.

Town Council has approved the purchase of a 2017 low floor Vicinity model transit bus. The



APPRENTICES AND TRADESPEOPLE – CALL FOR PROPOSALS OPENING JULY 24, 2017

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that the Government has announced \$85 million to support training in the skilled trades.

This plan will support the next generation of apprentices and tradespeople - particularly

women and Indigenous people – get the skills they need to succeed in a changing economy. The Government of Canada will launch the program through a call for proposals beginning on July 24th. Apprentices and tradespeople will benefit from this new program that supports apprenticeship training, innovation and enhanced partnerships.

The program will include two

streams of funding:

Financial support for unions to purchase up-to-date training equipment and materials to help unions keep up with constant technological change and meet industry standards

Funding for innova-. tive approaches to break down barriers facing women and Indigenous people who want to enter the skilled trades.

"This will help apprentices and tradespeople in my Yellowhead riding to obtain the skills they need to pursue a career in a skilled trade. I encourage those interested in this program to apply once this program is launched on July 24th," concluded MP Eglinski.

ENABLING ACCESSIBILITY FUND

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the federal government is currently accepting applications to the Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) through Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC).

The EAF funds organizations, businesses and other eligible

recipients to improve accessibility and safety for people with disabilities by supporting the capital costs of renovation, construction and retrofit activities, as well as the provision of accessible technologies in workplaces and communities across Canada.

This year, there are two funding streams:

Workplace Accessibility Stream - provides funding for small projects that improve accessibility and/or safety for

people with disabilities in workplaces.

Community Accessibility Stream - provides funding for small projects that improve accessibility and/or safety for people with disabilities in communities.

LIBERAL BUDGET 2017

On March 22nd, Finance Minister Bill Morneau presented the Liberal Government's 2017 Budget. The Liberals plan to spend outrageous sums that Canadians don't have by mortgaging our children's future with no guarantee that there will be any benefit. The 2017 Budget is projecting a \$23 billion deficit in 2016/2017 and a \$28.5 billion deficit the following year.

Eliminated:

Public Transit Tax Credit – This 15% federal tax credit in respect of the cost of eligible transit passes will be eliminated effective July 1, 2017.

Ride Sharing Services to charge GST/HST - Effective July 1, 2017, providers of ride-sharing services where the transportation is arranged for or coordinated through an electronic platform or system will have to register for and charge GST/HST on their fares in the same manner as taxi operators.

Proposals Impacting Business Owners -- proposes to eliminate the ability for taxpayers in these designated professions to elect to use billed-based accounting effective for taxation years that begin on or after March 22, 2017, subject to certain transitional rules.

The only thing that this 2017 budget proves is that Justin Trudeau and his Liberal Government's priorities are not the priorities of ordinary hard-working Canadians. The deficit projected for this year: \$23 billion.

What this budget boils down to is less stability in Canada's economy, higher taxes, less money for social programing, higher taxes on the oil sector, public transit users, and small business owners, to name a few.

It is estimated that the budget will





not be balanced until 2050, which means we have placed the burden on our future generation – our children and their children. Not only are there no new jobs, but growth in our GDP has drastically slowed

down and risks coming to a complete stop.

Albertans need an economic environment that fosters economic growth with lower taxes and fewer regulations. Instead, this budget introduces a huge subsidy for Bombardier, while increasing taxes on the oil and gas industry. This budget is ideologically motivated and Alberta is paying the price.

On June 30, 2017 at approximately 5:50 a.m. the Edmonton International Airport (EIA) RCMP Detachment was called for assistance with an individual who was attempting to get past the American pre-boarding screening area.

As airport staff and an RCMP member attempted to restrain the male he assaulted an RCMP

member and a US Customs Officer. When the subject did not comply with demands, an RCMP member on scene deployed the conducted energy weapon (taser) to gain control of the individual.

The male was placed under arrest and lodged in cells for processing. No injuries were sustained.

This was an isolated incident with no threat to the public.

ACCIDENTAL BEARSPRAY CONTAMINATION RESULTS IN TERMINAL EVACUATION

Leduc, Alberta - An apparent accident led to the four people being exposed to bearspray and an area of Edmonton International Airport being evacuated on July 8, 2017

At approximately 8:30 pm, Edmonton Airport RCMP were called to a waiting area in the airport for reports of a contaminant in the air. Investigators responded and located a man coming out of a washroom who was suffering the effects of having been exposed to bearspray. After interviewing the man and reviewing security footage, the investigators have determined that the man found a can of bearspray in a liquids disposal receptacle at the check in area. The man, unaware of what the can was, sat in a waiting area and inadvertently released some of the spray onto himself and into the air. The man then went to a washroom to decontaminate himself and was quickly found by officers.

One child and 3 adults were treated for exposure to the bearspray in addition to the individual that had sprayed himself. Due to the bearspray contaminating the air, a portion of the airport was evacuated, causing some disruption to airport operations.

At this time, investigators do not believe this was a criminal act and charges are not anticipated.

INVESTMENTS IN LOCAL WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of further investments in local water infrastructure.

A new project in Parkland County has been approved under the Government of Canada's Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF). The federal government is providing over \$6.3 million, while the Capital Region Parkland Water Services Commission will fund the remainder of the nearly \$24 million project. The water commission will now be able to begin work on a multi-phase system twinning project. The first phase will involve the construction of approximately four kilometers of new waterline from the EPCOR Utilities supply point to Acheson Industrial Park. This project will help meet the increased water demands of the Capital Region Parkland Water Services Commission as well as the West Inter-Lake District Water Commission and the Paul First Nation and Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation.

In addition to this project, federal funding through CWWF has been announced for the following communities in Yellowhead:

• Brazeau County - Project name: New Sewage Trunk Line - Federal funding: \$165,000 -Municipal funding: \$165,000

• Clearwater County - Project name: Lift Station Rehabilitation - Federal funding: \$290,000

- Municipal funding: \$290,000

• Mayerthorpe - Project name: Water Treatment Plant Improvement Project - Federal funding: \$634,000 - Municipal funding: \$634,000

"I am proud to see investments in Yellowhead's infrastructure so that local residents and their families have access to modern, reliable water and wastewater services that meet their needs," concluded MP Eglinski.

SEARCH WARRANT RESULTS IN CDSA ARREST

On June 29th, 2017 the Stony Plain / Spruce Grove Drug Section executed a search warrant at a residence in the city of Spruce Grove. As a result, police seized 44 grams of cannabis resin, \$1100 in Canadian currency, a small quantity of marihuana, a small quantity of cannabis oil and drug trafficking paraphernalia.

Brennan PAGE of Spruce Grove was arrested and has been charged with possession of cannabis resin for the purpose of trafficking, possession of cannabis oil for the purpose of trafficking, possession of marihuana and possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000. PAGE was released from custody and is scheduled to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court later this month.

6 GOLF PERSONALITIES THAT WILL MAKE OR BREAK YOUR GAME

(NC) From the rules drill sergeant, to the etiquette obsessed, no one likes to be on the course with that person. Here are a few of the personalities you should be keenly aware of when creating the perfect 18-hole pairing.

The Natural – They've had no lessons, no warm-up, old clubs but can consistently hit them long and straight every day.

Play with this person if... you crave a smooth, competitive game.

The Iceman – never phased by a shot that's off or a disgruntled competitor, the Iceman always keeps everyone's emotions in check.

Play with this person if... you want to cool down fired up players.

The Socialite – forget the game, this person is out for a good time.

With positive vibes, and stories for days, this person is only interested in one hole: the 19th.

Play with this person if... your scorecard is the last thing on your mind

The Personal Trainer – will gladly walk the length of the course with a 50 pound golf bag in tow. The PT prefers post-game chicken breasts over hot dogs, and comes equipped with a crisp low calorie light beer, such as Molson Canadian 67.

Play with this person if... you're an active calorie calculator who wants to tone up while having a good time on the greens.

The Chauffeur – likes driving the cart more than swinging the club and is happy to drop you off at every hole.





MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR DAY ON THE COURSE

(NC) Most great golf games are filled with sun, competition and camaraderie, but you can enhance the experience with a few tips that have less to do with your swing, and a lot to do with your 18-hole enjoyment:

Dress for success: The right golf apparel can be as important as the clubs you carry. Check the weather in advance to make sure you'll be as comfortable as possible during play. Determine if you're dressing to impress or to elevate your game. Light, non-restrictive clothing will allow you to swing freely and keep you comfortable and cool in the heat, or warm if the temperature drops. If you're a guest, always check out the dress code at the club you'll be visiting to ensure you comply with the rules.

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients there to play golf or do business? Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo - first person on the green gets a point; Bango - the player whose ball is closest to the pin when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo -the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.

Walk it off : Make a small 'healthy' tweak to your game by walking vs. taking a cart. When you choose to walk rather than drive 18 holes, you'll cover approximately six kilometres and burn around 1,500 - 2,000 calories. Golfers that ride carts will burn only about 1,100 - 1,300 calories.

Say cheers and enjoy: The 19th hole remains one of the best holes on the course. Cap off a great day by enjoying a light meal or a light beer such as Molson Canadian 67, which is brewed to 67 calories per 341ml bottle and 3% ABV. This crisp, refreshing beer can be paired nicely with a protein boost of chicken or fish.
